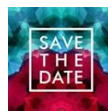

### Washington Midtown Lions Club

The Washington Midtown Lions Club (WMLC) have begun to give focused attention to one of our global causes - Diabetes. As a club, we recognized that this is one of the neglected service projects. In the past, the club had a **"one-off"** event for World Diabetes Day, which is observed annually on 14 November. At the culmination of this special event, the club ended its activity on Diabetes.

Recently, the Club was given another opportunity to scale-up its service projects and fund-raising projects on Diabetes. Club members have agreed through the

process of consensus-building to put Diabetes on the public's agenda. To this end, the WMLC and the African American Health Program, Montgomery County (nonprofit) developed an alliance and partnership on Chronic Diseases Management.

The WMLC learned that the African American Health Program (AAHP) is in the planning and implementing phases of some exciting projects for the public who are either pre-diabetics or diabetics to prevent/manage diabetes, and to improve their quality of life. Below is a summary of the planned activities for the Chronic Diseases Management Classes online learning platform:

- Zumba classes (**weekly Tuesday**)
- Yoga classes (**Bi-monthly - Wednesday A.M**)
- Diabetes Education on a variety of Chronic Diseases (**Wednesday P.M.**)
- Cooking: health and nutrition classes including food demonstration (**Thursdays P.M.**)

Finally, the WMLC and AAHP will collaborate and integrate the Lions Adult Vision Screening Program with Diabetes Education Program each time an outreach is conducted.

## Quest Program

Helping young people develop the skills and strength of character needed to succeed as adults is nothing new. It's an eternal hope.

Yet, it took teenager Rick Little back in 1975 to start what in four decades has become Lions Quest, a program that has grown to include 40 languages in over 105 countries around the world.

One of the latest iterations is taking shape at Our Lady of Victory School, serving pre-kindergarten through eighth grade near Baltimore. Sponsored by Lions Clubs International District 22-A Lions in central Maryland, the program is monitored by Baltimore Forty West Lions Club, which is headquartered next to the school.

Principal Ryan Hellem has seen Lions Quest change lives at his previous school in Frederick, Maryland, and was anxious to put the program in place at Our Lady of Victory. School guidance counselor Jackie Oliver-Coates



will help oversee the program that will initially involve five teachers, building on more than 40 years of success.

In the mid-1970s, Rick Little conducted a survey of over 2,000 high school students to determine the issues that concerned them most. He consulted experienced teachers who suggested including a teacher workshop that would serve as a classroom model.

The program was so successful at the high-school level that soon middle and elementary schools were asking for age-appropriate positive youth development programs. Little eventually founded and served as chief executive officer of the International Youth Foundation.

In 1984, Lions Clubs International Foundation gave its first LCIF grant to Quest International to help further expand the program. From that point, support of Quest became a key tenet of LCIF's service to youth. LCIF has supported Quest at the organizational level through grants and technical collaboration, and at the local level through club involvement in community implementation of the program in schools.

To date, LCIF has awarded more than 360 grants for a cumulative total of more than \$20 million to expand or establish Lions Quest programs across the United States and around the world.

Lions such as those in District 22-A have been key to the success and expansion of Lions Quest, supporting the program through local funding, coordinating teacher training, co-hosting parent meetings, speaking to youth and undertaking joint service projects with students.

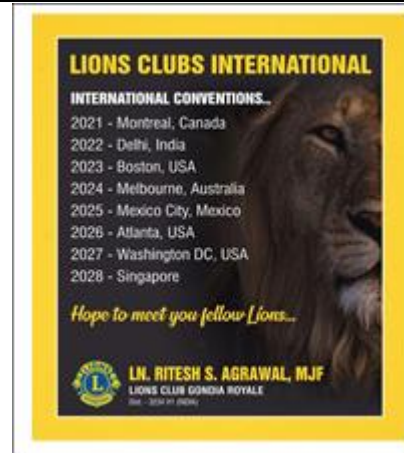
