If you have not been involved in the preparation of being part of this Parade, here's some facts on how we get there:

Parade Entry Fee is \$15,000 for a 3 Star Sponsorship entry, which would normally cost \$25,000. The committee has managed to keep the ancillary cost down to just under \$1,700.00. Last year, with a Grant from MD22 of \$7,500.00, a donation from MD24A of \$5,000.00, donations from Clubs and individuals just over \$3,700.00 and T-Shirts and etc. sales of over \$1,600.00, we manage to have an account balance of the amount stated above. Our cost for the parade this year should be similar to last year, but the following year will be questionable.

Is all this effort worth it? Absolutly! We reach so many about Lionism through PR by participating in this parade.

With the help of the Districts, Clubs and Individual Lions and Friends we can continue this amazing PR Project for Lions not only in Virginia, Maryland, Delaware and the District of Columbia, but for all Lions. We reach a very large viewing audience, and the addition of "Miss America" to our float has helped to improve our visibility. She will be on our float again this year.

Lions Saving Kids Sight - The Lions Saving Kids Sight Foundation (LSKS) is a multiple district program established to promote preschool vision screening. One of the ways they do this is by providing grant money to clubs.

The LSKS grant program will provide financial assistance for the purchase, replacement or repair of preschool vision screening equipment. Grant funds will be dispersed on a matching funds basis up to 50% of related expenses.

If your club is considering the purchase of a preschool vison screener, I would encourage you to apply for a LSKS grant. A PlusOptix Screener currently costs approximately \$6,700.
