*Remember, while Club Members can *input* Service activities, only Club Officers can click the "report" button which officially submits the information to LCI.

(Reporting, or *submitting*, the Service information to LCI can only be done by the Club President, Club Secretary, Club Administrator & Club Service Chairperson. For Leo clubs: the Leo Club President, Leo Club Secretary and Leo Club Advisor can report the Service Activity entered to LCI) If you have any trouble, reach out to me. I'm happy to help!

You can find the link to MyLION at <u>www.lionsclubs.org</u>. After you LOG IN, click on MyLION. (This is the same place you would log in to MyLCI)

You can report Service from past months to catch-up and get in some practice. Before long, reporting your Club's activities will be a piece of cake!
