Peace Poster Contest Deadlines

Students ages 11, 12 or 13 as of November 15 are eligible to participate in the International Peace Poster Contest. Entries not meeting the following deadlines will be disqualified.

- A new body to help on projects. (but don't overload them start with little projects)
- Fresh ideas for service or fundraising. (if they
 join and have ideas, listen to them and if all
 possible, try that idea, make them feel important)
- New leadership potential within the club and district
- New friends and families (we can never have too many of either)

So why is it hard to get new members? Lions say, where do I look for potential members? or I invite people all the time, but they never show up.

Prospective Lions are all around us but, why are they not joining?

Not everyone is a joiner, but joiners and service minded

individuals are out there. People are not necessarily born to serve but rather we are taught to help others, to share and to bring happiness to the less fortunate. So where should we be going to find these types of people? Look everywhere, like a waitress that just served you or a local mechanic that just fixed your car. How about your local churches, parents at the Sunday school, day/night activities at schools, colleges? Maybe try your local police, firefighters and EMTs. Sure, they may not be able to come to your regular meeting due to work schedule, but they can help in many other ways.

Does your Club give a scholarship, sponsor a Peace Poster Contest or sponsor a Leo Club? Tap into those parents and the teachers. How about the Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts or youth activity that you sponsor, they have parents too and can certainly appreciate the benefits of Lions?

There are so many more people you can JUST ASK! You might not get them the first time you ask but, don't give up. Ask our own Past International Director Joe Gaffigan of his experiences.

So, you've asked but they don't come and join? Sometimes it's in how you ask. Instead of saying - We're looking for new members for our Lions Club. We meet on ____. Come see what it's about and we'll give you a free meal!

Instead TRY – Have you ever wanted to help someone in or our community or help a disaster victim. As a member of the world's largest service organization you can be making a difference in our community and the world. Then invite them to a meeting, or better yet, to your next service activity. And if they come to that, ask them if they would like to help. Invite their spouses or partner-in-service along with them.

Maybe you can offer to pick them up and take them to your next meeting, after all, you might be the only one they know. And always make sure they feel welcome at that meeting! It would also be great to have them come to a meeting with an exciting speaker where service to an individual is offered such as Leader Dog, Lions Vision Research, Lovrnet, Lions Community Outreach, etc.

And when they join, keep in contact with them. Maybe they can't make all your meetings, just don't let them go, give them a call and see if there's somehow you can help. Maybe they need someone to watch their child. Offer to

let them bring them, or maybe you know someone who would be willing to babysit for them. Maybe they need a ride to a meeting or activity. All reasons can be worked out if you try.

Again, don't get discouraged if at first, they don't respond back to you or come to a meeting, just keep asking when you see them again. Remember people feel good about themselves when they feel they are helping someone or a cause.

You are a valuable asset for one of our "best kept secrets", Lions LOVRNET (Low Vision Rehabilitation Network) initially a project of MD 22's Lions Vision Research Foundation. You have expressed interest by enrolling in LOVRNET LMS and many of you are now active as a LOVRNET volunteer. You have conducted interviews for low vision patients, provided transportation to their appointment(s) and/or done a follow-up visit in their home at the direction of their therapist to put in place organizational processes and safety measures that allow them to function more freely and improve their quality of life.

After our initial efforts through LVRF, we've established the MD22 Lions LOVRNET Foundation, Inc., a 501(c)(3) organization, to administer and support the project and volunteers serving the low vision patients and their families.

Lion volunteers make this project work and as LOVRNET has matured and grown new volunteer managerial positions have emerged that need to be filled to make our project more valuable to patients and more effective in utilizing our volunteers. Financial support remains a challenge as well. Grant requests have been

submitted to federal and private institutions. Additional requests are being explored. To meet immediate financial requirements pending grant approvals, the LOVRNET Foundation approved the initiation of a GoFundMe campaign directed to the general public that can be accessed on our website, www.lovrnet.org. The website also has a PayPal button for donations. We gratefully accept checks made payable to LOVRNET Foundation, Inc. .and mailed to PCC Clare Newcomer at 19605 Granada Ct, Hagerstown, MD 21742.

I hope you will join me and the Board of Directors, share your enthusiasm and make others aware of Lions LOVRNET. We need you to help share our secret with others in your club as well as in your community and encourage their support.
