The La Plata Lions PVS team had another successful year again during the 2019-2020 club year with a grand total of 1,818 preschool children screened 347 referrals to pediatric eye-care for evaluation and necessary treatment so these children can have clear vision to begin their education. The PVS team spent many hours traveling to the 26 Charles County Public Elementary Schools, and 26 church sponsored preschools, private centers, and Charles County Head Start to perform screenings beginning August 1, 2019. Two Plus0ptix cameras, owned by the La Plata Lions, were used to screen the children. These cameras are special pediatric cameras that take a photo of the eyes and evaluate for: anisometropia (unequal refractive (deviation power). astigmatism from spherical curvature), hyperopia (far sightedness), myopia (near sightedness), and strabismus (abnormal alignment). All these conditions can lead to amblyopia (lazy eye). Children who are "REFERRED" receive a form with a printout from the camera to take to a pediatric ophthalmologist for professional diagnosis and treatment. These cameras detect the following most prevalent childhood vision disorders that may lead to the development of amblyopia (lazy eye): • Hyperopia (farsightedness) • Myopia (nearsightedness) • Astigmatism (blurred vision) • Anisometropia (unequal refractive power) • Anisocoria (unequal pupil size) • Strabismus (Eye misalignment)

Team Leader Carolyn Rogers worked with the Charles County Health Dept. and the Charles County Public School nurses at each school or center scheduling the screening dates. The school and center nurses recorded the results and did follow-up with children who received referrals. The La Plata preschool vision screening team is proud to provide this free service and improve the school success for the 347 children with referrals and are our future leaders! THIS IS GREAT LIONISM!



In case you are not one of them, here is some directions. Let us all try to stay safe so we can get back to Serving.

This information was borrowed from District 22-W.

There are several "You Tube" videos (for those with computers) that show you how to make a mask without sewing. Simply take cloth the size of a bandana, **fold** it over several times, **place** a rubber band around each end, then **fold** the ends in and **tuck** them. You can **place a coffee filter in the folds** to add more protection. That is **Sec. Ken** modeling a mask in the photo below.
