

PID Ron Keller and Lion Kitty Keller

Ron Keller from Millersport, Ohio, USA, was elected to serve a two-year term as a director of Lions Clubs International at the association's 104th International Convention, June 24 through June 28, 2022. He served on the Lions Membership Development committee for two years, and was Chairperson for one year.

Director Keller has more than 35 years experience as a government administrator and event coordinator. He is currently retired. He last served as Cultural Arts and Events Manager for the City of Columbus where he managed city staff, drafted city legislation, oversaw purchasing of equipment and supplies for events, and served as a liaison to civic and community leaders in Columbus' urban neighborhoods. One of his most notable projects was redesigning a public subsidy mechanism to make it easier for minority nonprofits to apply and receive city services within their neighborhoods.

MD39 Voting Convention Information

Executive Summary

The Idaho Lions Club will elect a new Council Chairperson for the 2025–2026 session at the upcoming convention. Traditionally, the annual convention has been held at the Sun Valley Inn. However, in response to requests from multiple Lions Clubs, the committee is considering alternative locations for the 2026 convention. Below are potential options with estimated costs:

The committee acknowledges the long-standing tradition of hosting the convention at the Sun Valley Inn and understands that some clubs may prefer to maintain this location. To ensure a fair and transparent decision, all Lions members will have the opportunity to vote on the location change at the upcoming convention in Sun Valley on Saturday, May 3rd.

Voting Process

To participate in the vote, clubs must be in good standing with dues paid in full. The voting delegates are dependent on club membership with family membership counting as one rather than two for the membership numbers used to determine the delegate number for the club. Eligible, individual voting delegate membership status is one year +one day. Since clubs vary in size, the number of votes (delegates) allocated per club is determined as follows:

This voting process ensures equitable representation across all clubs. The committee appreciates your participation and looks forward to your input on this important decision.
