Here is my ask: before June 30, will you start conversations with two people and then ASK them to consider joining your Lions club?



Ron Keller from Millersport, Ohio, USA, was elected to serve a two-year term as a director of Lions Clubs International at the association's 104th International Convention, June 24 through June 28, 2022. He served on the Lions Membership Development committee for two years, and was Chairperson for one year.

Director Keller has more than 35 years experience as a government administrator and event coordinator. He is currently retired. He last served as Cultural Arts and Events Manager for the City of Columbus where he managed city staff, drafted city legislation, oversaw purchasing of equipment and supplies for events, and served as a liaison to civic and community leaders in Columbus' urban neighborhoods. One of his most notable projects was redesigning a public subsidy mechanism to make it easier for minority nonprofits to apply and receive city services within their neighborhoods.

DONATE LIFE MONTH

It's Donate Life Month; the following article was published in the Idaho State Journal of Pocatello on March 25th.

The Yes Idaho Donate Life Coalition Encourages

Idahoans to Celebrate April as National Donate Life Month

April marks National Donate Life Month (NDLM), a time to honor organ, eye, and tissue donors, celebrate lives saved through donation, and encourage individuals to register as donors. The Yes Idaho Donate Life Coalition is joining the nationwide effort to raise awareness and inspire more people to give the gift of life.

Currently, more than 100,000 people in the United States are waiting for a life-saving organ transplant, while thousands more require tissue and cornea donations to restore health and sight. One donor can save up to eight lives through organ donation and enhance the lives of over 75 people through tissue donation.

"National Donate Life Month is an opportunity to recognize the power of organ and tissue donation and the incredible generosity of those who choose to save lives," said Alex McDonald, a member of the Yes Idaho Donate Life Coalition. "We encourage everyone to learn about donation, share their decision with loved ones, and register as a donor."

Last year in Idaho, 55% of individuals obtaining or renewing their driver's license chose to save lives by having a heart placed on their license. Thanks to the generosity of Idahoans, there were 73 organ donors, resulting in approximately 292 lives saved—each donor saving an average of four lives.

Additionally, 351 individuals became cornea donors, restoring vision for approximately 702 recipients. Tissue donation also had a significant impact, with 191 tissue donors providing skin, tendon, and bone grafts to help improve the lives of up to 14,325 people. Each tissue donor can benefit as many as 75 individuals in need. The Idaho Lions Eye Bank provides corneas for transplant in it's service area and is supported in part by Lions in Southern Idaho and Eastern Oregon, such as the Boise Bench, Boise Vista, Nampa, Caldwell and Emmett Lions Clubs.

Registering as an organ, eye, and tissue donor is simple and can be done online at www.yesidaho.org or through the DMV when obtaining or renewing a driver's license. Every registration brings hope to those waiting for a second chance at life.

Weiser Lions look forward to continuing to do volunteer service for many more years.





Past president Larry Hunt presented a check to the Squaw Butte Retired Educators today for the purchase of books for the Black Canyon High School Library.






