

LCIF Updates and Things

Hello Lions,

As Most of you know on September 26th, Hurricane Helene made landfall and continued up the east coast with a path covering 500 miles from Florida to the Southern Appalachians. Several states were impacted, and tragically, the death toll has risen to the hundreds. Not even two weeks later, Hurricane Milton made landfall near Siesta Key, Florida, with a second round of devastation to already impacted areas.

LCIF was ready and answered the call to action. This would not be possible without the ongoing support of our generous Lions like the one reading this article. As of November 11^{th,} LCIF has awarded 13 grants across 5 states (FL, GA, NC, SC, TN) totaling \$365,000 to date. Another 11 each Emergency Grants totaling \$165,000. 2 each Major Catastrophe grants for MD 35 (FL) and MD 31 (NC) totaling \$200,000, all totaling \$730,000. This doesn't include any donation made directly to a truck traveling to those 5 states.

I would ask that if you still want to make a donation to the Southeast, you can go online to https://www.lionsclubs.org/en/donate. Please choose Empowering Service as LCIF knows where this money is needed. If you can't go online, then contact me and I can tell you how.

Did you know that every club has an LCIF Club Coordinator? If there is not one named, then the Immediate Past President is the one by default. We need you trained! Please watch your email from your District Coordinators as this needs to be done by January 1st.

Did you know that starting in January your coordinators will be selling "I love LCIF" pins, picture attached. If you purchase a pin for the small amount of \$10.00, we will give you credit towards your Melvin Jones Fellowship.

Disaster Response Team

Your Indiana Lions 25F Disaster Response Team has been busy the last 2 month here in Indiana along with several trips to Tenn, NC and SC to support the survivors of Hurricane Helene.

Here in Indiana we helped clean up downed trees from a storm in early Oct. at Camp Woodsmoke, the Lions 25F handicap campground, just outside Greensburg.

Throught our membership in Indiana Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster(VOAD) and working with the Indiana Knights of Columbus(KofC), we have been in contact with the Tenn., NC and SC VOAD's and have coordinated our response accordingly.

November, we have been busy making several trips with the KofC to support the survivors of Hurricane Helene in Hampton, Tenn, Newland, Higgins/Burnsville, and Marshall, NC.

We have been providing volunteer referrals and logistical support/supplies to "Just for Him Ministers" located in Osgood, deployed in the Chimmy Rock and Lake Lure areas of NC., doing cleanup and rebuilding work.

To-date we have supplied over \$30,000.00 worth of goods to the areas consisting of food, water, hygiene supplies, totes, flashlights, and batteries, generators, chainsaws, fuel and oil, cleaning supplies, trash bags, PPE supplies, winter cloths, grills, charcoal, shovels, rakes, lumber, screws, nails, and gift cards.

My daughter and I had the privilege to spend a week with the Indiana UMCOR ERT group, working out of Spartanburg SC, cleaning up debris and working with chain saw crews clearing trees on property of the elderly and disabled.

We are continuing to support the missions of the "Just for Him Ministers" working in the Lake Lure, NC with logistical support/supplies, as needed.


