

LINCOLN'S ROAD TO THE WHITE HOUSE

Probably the greatest example of persistence is Abraham Lincoln. If you want to learn about somebody who didn't quit, look no further. Born into poverty, Lincoln was faced with defeat throughout his life. He lost eight elections, twice failed in business and suffered a nervous breakdown. He could have quit many times - but he didn't and because he didn't quit, he became one of the greatest presidents in the history of our country. Lincoln was a champion and he never gave up. Here is a sketch of Lincoln's road to the White House:

- 1816 His family was forced out of their home. He had to work to support them
- 1818 His mother died
- 1831 Failed in business
- 1832 Ran for state legislature - lost
- 1832 Also lost his job - wanted to go to law school but couldn't get in
- 1833 Borrowed some money from a friend to begin a business and by the end of the year he was bankrupt. He spent the next 17 years of his life paying off this debt
- 1835 Was engaged to be married, sweetheart died and his heart was broken
- 1836 Had a total nervous breakdown and was in bed for six months
- 1838 Sought to become speaker of the state legislature - defeated
- 1840 Sought to become elector - defeated
- 1843 Ran for Congress - lost
- 1848 Ran for re-election to Congress - lost
- 1849 Sought the job of land officer in his home state - rejected
- 1854 Ran for Senate of the United States - lost
- 1856 Sought V-P nomination at his party's national convention - get less than 100 votes
- 1858 Ran for U.S. Senate again - again he lost
- 1860 Elected president of the United States

RULES:

1. All Districts, Lions Clubs and Lioness Clubs may submit one (1) entry.
2. Pin must have been produced and available for trading since the last State Convention. Pin (s) will be judged on its original, distinct and detail design for the current year. Care should be taken not to make small changes in previous year's pin and entered as a new pin.
3. Only the pins manufactured by authorized manufacturers with their registered marking on the pin will be considered for judging. The pin must be enclosed in its original packaging with the manufacturer's name, when submitted for judging. A current list of authorized International Lions Clubs manufacturers is published every year by Lions International.
4. Three (3) members of the PIN TRADERS CLUB OF PENNSYLVANIA will judge the contest. The District Pin Chairman is not eligible to be a judge for the contest.
5. All pins must be entered by Saturday, noon, at the Pin Traders area at the State Convention.
6. Pins which depict commercial products must be accompanied with a copy of an authorization letter from the commercial organization.
7. Club pins must have the name of the club on the pin. District pins must have the District letter on the pin.
8. All pins submitted become the property of the PIN TRADERS CLUB OF PENNSYLVANIA. No pin will be returned. All pins entered in the contest will be raffled in some manner during the convention

The completed form must be mailed to the English Language Department at International Headquarters, or faxed to (630) 706-9130, to arrive by September 30, 2012. Request for review of award eligibility from a disqualified club shall be considered only if received at international headquarters within 12 months after completion of the fiscal year, provided that the original application form is already filed at international headquarters. The award will be mailed to the 2012-2013 district governors for presentation. In undistricted areas the award will be mailed directly to the coordinating Lions or directly to the 2012-2013 club presidents.

According to a decade of study by the World Health Organization, measles deaths have dropped by three-quarters. Estimates are about 9.6 million children were saved by big vaccination campaigns. Still 450 children die from measles every day. Nearly 30% who contract measles suffer complications such as vision loss, hearing loss, or brain damage. There were 13 confirmed cases of measles outbreak linked to the 2012 Super Bowl.

LCI SUPPLEMENTAL INSURANCE PROGRAM

LCI provides Lions clubs, districts and other authorized Lions organizations with \$1,000,000 of Liability Insurance that protects against losses from bodily injury and property damage arising out of most Lions activities. However, there are additional types of insurance coverage that clubs and other Lions organizations should consider to protect against other risks that may arise out of Lions activities. Recently, Lions Clubs International has arranged for a program of supplemental insurance coverage which may be purchased at discounted rates by clubs, districts and approved Lions foundations in the United States.

One available coverage is Directors & Officers Liability Insurance, which protects the officers of a Lions club or district for actions brought against them for actual or alleged negligent acts or omissions and for misleading statements. Directors and officers of a Lions club or district can be liable if they damage the organization by breaching their duties, violate organization by-laws, or fail to disclose conflicts of interest. Another example of such claims include an action brought by a contributor to the foundation of a club or district who was unable to obtain a tax deduction as a result of the foundation failing to file or maintain its charitable tax exempt status. Another important coverage offered is Accident Insurance which enables you to protect your members and volunteers from the financial consequences of accidental injuries. The plan is designed to provide insurance protection for your members and volunteers injured during sponsored activities. This program provides high limits of coverage - up to \$100,000 for Accident Medical Expenses and up to \$25,000 in Accidental Death coverage - all at a very affordable cost. How the Contest Works

Lions clubs sponsor the contest in a local school or organized youth group. The contest is open to students 11-13 on November 15, 2012. Participating students are asked to create posters visually depicting the contest theme, "Imagine Peace."

One winner for each contest sponsored by a club is chosen to advance to the district governor for judging. On the district level, one winner is selected to go on to the multiple district competition and from there one winner is forwarded to International Headquarters for the final judging. Entries are judged at all levels on originality, artistic merit and portrayal of theme.

During the final judging, 23 merit award winners and one grand prize winner are chosen to represent the many entries submitted from around the world.

Awards

Artists of posters advancing to the final international judging are recognized as follows:

- International Grand Prize Winner receives a trip to the award ceremony at Lions Day with the United Nations (subject to change). At the ceremony he/she will receive a cash award of \$5,000 (or local equivalent) and an engraved plaque. Two family members (one being the winner's parent or legal guardian) and the sponsoring Lions club president or a club member (as designated by the club president) will accompany the winner to the award ceremony. The award ceremony is scheduled for March 2013.
- 23 Merit Award Winners each receive a cash award of \$500 (or local equivalent) and a certificate of achievement.
