Congratulations Lions, Campaign 100 has exceeded its \$300 million goal. Although final totals are not yet quite established, it appears that the amount raised is in excess of \$324 million.

For our part in District 33-N, contributions were more than \$37,000 which is more than 50% above last year and, we believe, the largest ever single-year contribution to LCIF. We thank you for your efforts at both the club and individual levels.

Despite the success of Campaign 100, we cannot sit back and gloat. Disasters occur somewhere each year; clinics need to be built; wells need to be drilled; medical and eye care missions must continue; eye mobiles need to be funded and so forth. Not to mention the LCIF donations to Mass Lions Eye Research fund to match MLERF Presidential grants each year.



Those donations to MLERF over the years total well more than \$1 million.

LCIF is **OUR** foundation and it is how we serve the world. Its great works must continue which means we must continue our financial support.

If every Lions Club member in 33-N were to personally donate \$10.00 to LCIF, we would raise close to \$11,000 over and above club donations. This would increase the significant mark on our services to mankind by helping those most in need when they are in need.




