### **Our District Bulletin**

In 1990 LCIF launched a program known as SightFirst which was a major program to combat avoidable blindness. One of SightFirst's major eye health education initiatives has been the Lions Eye Health Program (LEHP).

This program is a community-based education program empowering Lions to promote healthy vision and raise awareness to the causes of preventable vision loss.

One of the primary objectives of (LEHP) is to encourage the early detection and the timely treatment of diabetic eye disease, glaucoma and age-related macular degeneration (AMD) and the appropriate treatment for low vision.

Helping to educate people at risk for eye disease and encouraging them to seek appropriate treatment is essential.

Lions can get involved by establishing community activities that promote awareness of eye health. We can also increase the awareness of the network of local eye health organizations available to the general public. Collaborations with these organizations may provide useful resources in promoting awareness of eye health and the causes of preventable vision loss.


