Old Business:

- **Update on Jungle Days and Lions Golf Trophy –** 54 golfers, \$2,000 was made on the tournament and it was donated to LCIF. It was a great golf tournament with ideal weather. Fun time was had by all.
- * PID Brian's Campaign PDG Mary Ferleman made the report for PDG Joan Blank: Meeting: Wednesday, September 27th; Loose Moose, Mankato. Present: Lions Mike and Sue Vos, Lions Anna and Don Wickenhauser, DG Nancy Mathwig, Lion Rose Thies, Lions Mary and Tom Ferleman and Lions Kevin and Joan Blank

Joan reviewed the summary of donations – to date: \$5520.00

Committee agreed to send out another letter to those clubs that have not donated to the cause. Joan will revise 1st letter that was sent out and will email updated letter to Presidents and Secretaries. This should be sent out as soon as possible.

Much discussion was held on brainstorming for a fundraiser for PID Brian at the 5M2 Mid-Winter Convention. Final consensus was a "Waddle Walk". This will happen most likely after the luncheon as that has the largest attendance. DG Nancy will determine the best time that fits into her scheduling for programs and speakers. Penguin hats will be sold for \$15 at the zone meetings and at Mid-Winter. One must be wearing a penguin hat to participate in the Waddle Walk. (The route of the Waddle Walk is yet to be determine, but will be indoors). Hats will be limited (to a few hundred). Cost of hat is \$4 so we will net \$11.00 at this point. Our goal would be to have at least 250 participants to net \$2500. Sue Vos has ordered 62 hats as that is all she could order on the internet. She will get the hats to DG Nancy to take to Zone meetings. It was agreed that we would split up the Zone Meetings as follows:

A script of what is to be promoted regarding fundraising for PID Brian and attending the International Convention at each zone meeting will be emailed out by Joan to each team member. Mary volunteered to write up an article regarding the campaign for PID Brian for the November 5M2 newsletter. Kevin and Joan found that our district (5M2) has a total of 99 voting delegates. Getting 100 voting delegates will not be possible, but we will still try to encourage as many Lions as possible to attend the International Convention. Joan brought up the rally at the International Convention and the committee members all agreed to help when the time comes.

- Laptops for District PID Debra Wasserman gave a short report and indicated to read the Technology Report later in these minutes.
- Feed my Starving Children Update: On Monday, March 26 we will be coming together to pack food. We will be packing at all three FMSC locations Chanhassen, Coon Rapids and Eagan. Districts 2, 6, and 7 are all on board, trying to include more Districts in the project. The 5 shift times at each location are: 9:30-11:30, 12 noon-2 p.m., 2:30-4:30, 6-7:30 and 8-9:30.

- Mayer Area Lions Club PDG Marvin reported on the progress of the Mayer Area Lions Club. Charter night is December 9th at the City Hall in New Germany.
- Lions Kidsight Parade of Green Request: PDG Rick Wagener and Lion Lori Klein Now that they are a Foundation they are asking to be on the Parade of Green for Midwinter. 501C3 status has been applied for but approval hasn't been received yet. If it is approved for the Parade of Green the dollars will stay in the District that donates them. The money will be needed to replace equipment and/or add equipment. There will be costs for supplies for printing. PDG Rick Wagener made a motion to add Lions Kidsight to the Parade of Green, seconded by Lion Gary Koch. Discussion followed. VDG Brian asked about the money that 5M2 gave initially. Lion Lori stated that that money is being held at the Multiple Level for 5M2 expenses. It was asked what amount of money could be anticipated to be needed from the Parade of Green. It is an unknown what may be needed in the future. Whether we add Kidsight to the Parade of Green or not, we currently have money in 5M2 for this project PID Debra asked if the Foundation wanted us to turn over our dollars to them and the answer is yes, they would like all monies turned over to them. 24 people are on the Foundation Board – 2 from each District. Is the Parade of Green getting too large? There is a lot of enthusiasm surrounding this project. Suggestion was made that a newsletter article be written giving Clubs an option to donate to KidSight but not put it on the Parade of Green until the 501C3 status is resolved. Needed to do a Hand count for passing. 18 to 14. MC.
- **Update on Leo Taskforce:** 2nd VDG Brian Thies Brief meeting was held at the USA Canada Forum. Need to have a budget for Leos, we could use a more broken down budget in the future. The tabled motion needs to be amended and cleaned up to include standard accounting principles. VDG Brian brought the motion to reimburse \$1,265 for a chaparone attending the Leo Forum. Lion Anna is trying to put something in place for the future to cover chaparone costs. Leos can not travel alone and will need chaparones. She is looking to have a budget put in place for the future. We voted to pay the registration for four Leos at a previous meeting. VDG Brian made an amendment to the motion that Rules of Audit apply, PID Maynard seconded. Question whether this was a one-time thing or policy? It is a one time thing. Voting on the amendment 12 agreed; 18 opposed amendment failed. Original Motion was to reimburse Anna Wickenhauser her \$1,265 expenses for attending the Leo Forum in New York, the money to come from Youth Activities. It should have been brought to the Cabinet before the event. MC. Put this back on the Leo Task Force to discuss the budget in the policy manual for the future and include the Leo Forum.
- Leo Conference Invoice: Lion Anna Wickenhauser there is \$1,000 budgeted for the Leo conference. The cost was \$2,900. Leos that go for the first time get 100% reimbursed and Leos that have attended in the past get reimbursed at a rate of 50%. Lion Paula Stephens made a motion to approve the amount owed, seconded by Lion Glenn Kaufman. Lion Lori noted that there was a math error on the bill which would reduce the bill to \$2,812.50. The motion was changed to include the error. MC.

Other: None

New Business:

No New Business at this meeting.

Zone Reports: 1st VDG Diana Kroells

- Zone 1 Lion Gary Koch Currently 282 members -1 from beginning of the year. Attended Plato meeting last week and installed a new member which will make Zone 1 even. Zone 1 meeting will be on Thursday, November 30th at the Blue Note in Winsted.
- **Zone 2** Lion Glenn Kaufmann Zone 2 has a total membership of 523, which is down 5 this year. The only potential reporting issue is the Chaska Lions approaching 12 months between an Activity Report. The club was reminded of the requirement. Zone Chair has visited 7 of the 8 clubs so far and all of the

clubs are scheduling their interclub exchanges. Zone 2 Fall Meeting scheduled for Wednesday, November 1 hosted by Carver. Mayer Lions looking to activate in December.

- Zone 3 Lion Christy Trutnau Zone 3 has 8 Lions Clubs and 1 Leo Club. We currently have 378 Lions with a loss of 1 for the month; and 25 Leo's! Jordaness Lions recently held a Lions 101 and have three new Lions so Zone 3 will be up in membership soon. Zone 3 had their President/Secretary meeting on August 16th; we had a great turn out with lots of information and discussion. Our Fall Zone meeting was held on October 11th in Jordan. Zone 3 had all clubs in attendance for this meeting. Zone 3 has been busy with Kidsight and other activities. Our clubs are getting ready for the busy season of Fashions shows, Ice Golf, Bingo and bowling! She has all her club visits scheduled for the year.
- **Zone 4** Lion Chuck Toltzman Not in attendance, no report.
- Zone 5 Lion Dean Williams Number of members in the zone: 219
 Net Gain/Loss of members since July 1st, 2017: YTD adds was 4 and YTD drops was 6 for a net loss of 2 members.

<u>Membership/Activity reporting issues</u>: We have one club past due with their MMR and he has contacted the club President regarding this issue and hopefully a resolution will follow.

Financial Issues: No financial issues at this time that he is aware of.

<u>Upcoming Club activities</u>: Zone 5 fall meeting is scheduled for Monday October 30th, 2017 where club presidents will report on current activities. He also visited three clubs as Zone Chair and installed new members.

- **Zone 6** Lion Doug Larsen We had a Pres and Sec meeting on Sept 26, 2017 at which all clubs except one participated from our zone. We met at Etlins in New Prague with the New Prague Lions hosting. After a great social time and meal we started our business. We had some really great discussion about membership and how to attract the next generation. As should be noted we did not have a perfect answer but had many ideas. One of the biggest ideas was to make the meeting more enjoyable (fun) and less pomp and circumstance and doing activities that would involve an interest or passion of the next generation. Another topic was how to keep the new members once they join. This had many ideas and one that is good for all Lions is to acknowledge acts of Lionism to all members. Letting each member know they are important. Also acknowledge that Lion meetings are not mandatory nor are the events either. We need to be open to have them come when possible and help when possible. Also get them involved giving them information about lions, the organization hierarchy, club positions, event leadership and participation, etc. We talked about Legacy Projects and how our zone was coming along with each project. Many of the clubs were done or on the last steps of completing their projects. We covered some needs each of the clubs had and what they were having going on. Of course we covered many other Lion topics such as White Cane Safety Days (noting the intersection crosswalk white lines were very important), Vision Honduras, LCI Forward, Pillow Case Project, KidSight, club visits and more. 1VDG Diana Kroells gave her comments followed by DG Nancy Mathwig giving her comments. We had to close at this time as the hour was getting late. Zone 6 had their fall Zone meeting at Le Center on Oct 26th. I have not had time do the report on this meeting since because of my headaches. Please pass on thank you to everyone for their work and my apologies for not being able to be there.
- **Zone 7** Lion Pamela DeMarce No report.
- Zone 8 Lion Diane Beckmann Nothing to report.
- **Zone 9** Lion Pam Koenen Since the last cabinet meeting, the Clubs of Zone 9 have been busy with several fundraising efforts at county fairs and local community celebrations. The Alden Lions sponsored the Bretts Family, entertainers from Branson, for their annual fundraiser. The Albert Lea Lakeview Lions celebrated their 25th anniversary with a wine tasting and member recruitment event. As a result they have 9 new members joining Lions Club. Several clubs, including the Wells Lions, have donated to the

hurricane relief efforts after the recent storms in Houston, Florida and Puerto Rico. The zone meeting for club presidents and secretaries was held in mid-September. All clubs in Zone 9 had at least one club officer in attendance for the round table meeting with DG Nancy Mathwig and 1st VDG Diana Kroells. Thank you to the Kiester Lions Club for Hosting. The fall Zone 9 meeting was held on October 17 at the Albert Lea American Legion. Around 50 Lions attended. Reports were given from cabinet chairs and information was provided on the 2018 Mid-Winter Convention. Thank you to Lion Lyle Hintz and the Albert Lea Cloverleaf Lions for hosting. She has visited the Wells Lions club and will be visiting several more clubs in the next 2 months.

Committee Reports: 2nd VDG Brian Thies facilitated.

<u>Can Do Canines</u>: Lions Andrea Oldenburg and Lion Tony Oldenburg along with Kathleen Bleckeberg will be sharing the zones in 5M2 to deliver information about Can Do Canines. Lions Andrea and Tony reported that they went to the Plato Lions Oktoberfest on September 30th, put up the display board, sold candy bars and handed out literature if people wanted it. They attended the Zone 3 meeting on 10/10/17, sold candy bars and scheduled their first club visit. Plan to attend the upcoming Zone 6, 5, 2, 4 meetings. Co-Chair Lion Kathleen Bleckeberg reported that on October 3rd Lion Kathleen did a visit to the Albert Lea Noon Rotary club, she gave a Can-Do-Canines presentation to a group of 30 people. Sold some candy. She is in the process of touching base with clubs for club visits. She attended the Zone 9 meeting held on October 17th held in Albert Lea.

<u>Centennial Service Challenge</u>: PDG Steve Wasserman reported that as District Centennial Coordinator, he has continued to write newsletter articles celebrating our progress in meeting the goals we have set as a District and an International Association. He has also attended one Zone meeting so far, where he presented 2016-2017 Centennial Service Challenge Banner Patches. Diabetes has been added as a Centennial Service Challenge category this year. So far, 11 clubs in 5M2 have reported on Diabetes projects.

A special emphasis is being made this year on completing and reporting on Centennial Community Legacy Projects. So far, we have had 25 clubs report on 41 Legacy Projects. A Multiple District Centennial Celebration is being planned for June 10, 2018, at the Anoka County Fairgrounds. Watch for details in upcoming District Newsletters.

<u>Constitution & By-Laws</u>: PDG Steve Wasserman – He has begun a review of the 5M2 Constitution and By-Laws in preparation for possible amendments to be voted on at the 2018 District Convention.

<u>District Activities</u>: PDG Eunice Rucks reported that the Bird pins have been ordered and distributed. Also remind people that if they should have an individual who has passed away in their club, to report them to her by January 15, 2018 for inclusion in the Memorial Service.

<u>Environmental Photo Contest</u>: Lion Kate Pattison and Lion Evelyn Grimm – The big change in this year's competition is that we are expanding submissions to email submissions. Each club is allowed one photo along with the completed form. For those submitting a photo via email, the email they should send to is <u>lions5m2photocontest@gmail.com</u>. Email submissions will still need to have an attached signed entry form; this can be done by sending a scanned upload of the signed form or by uploading a photo of the signed form along with their photo. Questions can be directed to the email address.

Articles aim to encourage club and individual activities and awareness towards preserving the environment. <u>GLT</u>: PDG Susan Bowman. The GLT members are: PDG Sue Bowman, 2nd VDG Brian Thies and District Orientation PDG Joan Blank, Lion Wanda Breimhorst and Lion Anna Wickenhauser and PDG Mike Vos.

The GLT is part of the Global Action Team (GAT) which includes the Global Membership Team

(GMT) and the Global Service Team (GST).

The very broad goal of the GLT is to increase service and membership in the Lions organization. The goal for the GLT is in keeping with DG Nancy's goal, that is to present to clubs who have not had a recent orientation program, the District Orientation. District Zone Chairs are asked to promote the orientation program during club visits and at zone meetings.

A huge benefit of being a Lion is taking advantage of the leadership development opportunities. MYLCI is the sight any lion can go for one-line course work/training for a large variety of leadership topics.

The USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum is the largest and best Lions Club leadership training. The USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum is scheduled for September 20-22, 2018, in Columbus, Ohio.

Over 50 training sessions related to personal and club development are available plus thousands of leaders present willing to share their experiences. Free online courses are also available. Lions are recognized at the Forum for completing online courses and programs. The following five 5M2 Lions were recognized at the 2017 forum: Graduating from the Bachelor's Program were VDG Diana Kroells – Hamburg Lions, Lion Martha Reger – Jordaness 2VDG Brian Thies – Green Isle Lions, and Lion Don Wickenhauser – Cologne Lions. Receiving a certificate for the Master's Program was Lion Anna Wickenhauser-- Cologne Lions

First quarter activities included GLT training and travel with Lion Bill, second quarter work with the orientation team.

<u>GLT Orientation</u>: PDG Joan Blank – She continues to present the Orientation PowerPoint or Jeopardy game to various clubs in the district. Since her last report, she has visited the Albert Lea Lakeview Lions, Courtland Lions, Silver Lake Lions, New Prague Lions and Prior Lake Lions. She customizes each presentation according to the Lions Club she is visiting and if any new members are present. Lion Steve Wasserman has given her a laptop computer and projector, which both work very well. To date 16 Lions Clubs have had the Orientation Presentation (25%).

GLT Chairperson PDG Sue Bowman and PDG Joan will be meeting in early November to discuss our strategy for getting the Orientation Presentation to those clubs who have not participated.

GMT: PID Maynard Rucks – The Mayer Lions Club is now ready to have their Charter night (December 9, 2017). Work has started on a new club at Biscay. Need to get clubs to continue to ask people to join their club.

<u>GST</u>: PID Debra Wasserman – As reported in the August Cabinet minutes GST-District Coordinators are tasked with supporting service in a variety of areas and in numerous ways. See below for efforts thus far.

- Diabetes: Clubs participated in the September 23 WalMart health fairs. (See report from District Diabetes Trustees for details). The District Trustees and PID Debra met prior to the Cabinet meeting to discuss ways we can partner, particularly focusing on Lions Week of Service for Diabetes, November 13-19.
- **2. LCIF:** 2VDG Brian and PID Debra have begun talking about promoting available LCIF grants through the newsletter in hopes that a club will consider applying for a grant.
- 3. **Centennial Community Legacy Projects:** She will be working with the Centennial Chair to encourage clubs to conduct and report Centennial Community Legacy Projects.
- 4. **Increase reporting by clubs of activities:** A meeting with the DG team is planned for immediately after the Cabinet meeting to discuss possible methods to encourage and support greater, and more detailed reporting of service activities by clubs.
- 5. All District Service Opportunity at FMSC: Plans are progressing for this March 26, 2018 event.

She attended GST-DC training in St. Cloud on October 14, conducted by PID Judy Hankom GST-AC and PDG Rodger Palmer GST-MDC.

Historian: VDG Nancy Mathwig nothing to report.

Journey for Service: PDG Mike Vos no report.

LCIF: 2nd VDG Brian Thies – He is proud to report that LCIF has responded promptly and generously with disaster grants in the hurricane affected areas of the US and Caribbean as well as with the earthquakes in Mexico.

He has been soliciting clubs for donations to the Disaster Fund. They have graciously responded with approximately \$10,000.00 so far. These funds do not just need to come from clubs, but can be made by individuals as well. He encouraged each and everyone of us to dig deep and donate.

The Green Isle Lions Facebook page has been updated to include LCIF links to donate. He encourages your clubs to like and share these pages both for your clubs and individually as well.

While attending the Council of Governor's meeting, we were informed that LCIF is approximately \$5 Million short of their \$30 Million goal to get a matching grant from the Gates Foundation. Please help us meet this goal as we don't want to let this opportunity pass us by.

Currently there are no LCIF grants in our district, however the Winthrop Lions are in the process of getting a project to conform with the requirements necessary to get an LCIF Grant. Within our multiple, two districts received grants, one was for a handicapped accessible Fishing Pier in Elbow Lake and \$100,000 was received for a handicapped accessible playground in the Twin Cities.

Leader Dog: Lion Loretta Klenke reported that as DG Nancy requested, she sent an introductory letter to the newsletter and supplied contact information for club visits. Lion Loretta has a club visit in Norwood Young America West Carver on October 24. She has been promoting personally or a representative Leader Dog at zone meetings to promote the Leader Dog program through education with club visits. She has been in contact with the Multiple District Leader Dog chair who has assisted with some of Lion Loretta's questions. She is looking forward to meeting more clubs in the future. Future club visits may include Winthrop and Jordaness Lions which she has made initial contact with at this time. Again, Thank You DG Nancy for allowing her to promote this great program in our district. Lion Emmy Koch has visited three clubs: Winthrop, Hutchinson and Plato.

LEO Clubs: Lion Anna Wickenhauser, Lion Hilary – Just finished the Leo Conference in Annandale. We had 69 Leos and 10 Advisors. District 5M2 had a whopping 26 Leos and 6 Advisors attend.

Cologne Leos have just finished helping the Cologne Lions with their Octoberfest. They cleared tables and ran a photo booth with the proceeds going to LCIF. They raised \$141.

Northfield has kept busy with working with the seniors in their community.

Sibley Leos have made a video that was shared on MD5M's Facebook page and on 5M2 Leos Facebook page. If you haven't seen it-check it out.

Shakopee Leos did their first service project working with the Park Dept. in Shakopee. They helped plant 500 trees.

Watertown Leos are hosting their 2nd Annual Halloween Party today and are collecting donations to the food shelf.

<u>Liberty Day</u>: Lion Denny Hewitt reported that he has attended one Zone meeting and has plans to attend three more in November. He has distributed 950 Liberty Day books to Lions Clubs in our district so far. He thanked the Cabinet for raising the dollar amount and the number of books we can distribute this year as he is hoping we can increase the involvement in the Liberty Day Program in District 5M2.

<u>Lions MD5M Hearing Foundation</u>: Lion Jeff Williams, PDG Marvin Grimm: The board of trustees met in St. Cloud October 7, 2017. The trustees heard about the U of M updates and research from Dr. Beven Yueh. Many exciting things are happening with the hearing research. The research grants were approved for the coming year.

Our focus for the parade of Green at the Mid Winter Convention, held in February, at City Center in Mankato, will be to have 100% club participation. If your club has decreased or not given to the Hearing Foundation, please consider giving this year. Also, increasing your club's donation over previous years.
