

New Member Information

District Structure and Governance

District 5M2 is comprised of approximately 2400 Lions in 65 Clubs in 12 Counties of South Central Minnesota. The District is led by the District Governor Team consisting of the District Governor, the First Vice District Governor and the Second Vice District Governor.

District 5M2 is part of *Multiple District 5M (MD5M)*, which consists of approximately 21,000 Lions in 12 Districts encompassing all of Minnesota, Manitoba, and Northwest Ontario. The District Governors of each of the 12 Districts meet four times per year as a "Council of Governors" to set policy for the Multiple District.

Multiple District 5M is part of *Lions Clubs International (LCI)*, the world's largest Service Club Organization, consisting of 1.4 million members in 210 countries and geographic areas around the world.

The District is divided into eight "Zones" each containing 8-9 clubs. Each Zone is led by a Zone Chair.

The *Global Leadership District Coordinator* and *Global Membership District Coordinator* are appointed to three year terms by Lions Clubs International in consultation with the Global Leadership and Global Membership Multiple District Coordinators and the District Governor Team. Other Lions may be appointed to the District Leadership and District Membership teams by the District Governor.

The *District Cabinet* is the main governing body of the District, and is comprised of the District Governor Team, the Global Leadership Team, the Global Membership Team, the Region Chairs, the Zone Chairs, and all of the various Program Chairs who are designated by the District Governor to lead the various programs of the District.

A *District (Midwinter) Convention* is called once per year to elect District Officers, vote on Constitution and By-Law Changes, elect one member to the Multiple District Hall of Fame, and conduct other business as may come before the Convention. Each club is allocated one Delegate to the District Convention for every 10 members in the club or major fraction thereof. Any Club Member who has been a Lion for one year and a day is eligible to be a Delegate or Alternate Delegate to the Convention.

5M2 Lions District Meetings

Zone Meetings:

The District is divided into eight "Zones" each containing 8-9 clubs. Each Zone is led by a Zone Chair. The clubs of each zone meet together as a group twice per year. The fall zone meetings normally take place in October or November, and spring zone meetings take place in March or April. Club Presidents and Secretaries are expected to attend the Zone Meetings, but any member of any club in the zone is welcome and encouraged to attend. The meetings normally include a meal at a cost of \$15-\$20. Some clubs pay the meal cost of members who attend, while others do not.

Zone meetings are an opportunity for clubs to share information with each other and with the District Governor Team. District Cabinet Members and Program Chairs are not expected to make presentations, but may be permitted to make timely and important announcements related to their area. Depending on the needs of the clubs in the zone and the desires of the Zone Chair and District Governor Team, a special program may also be provided.

Cabinet Meetings:

The 5M2 Cabinet is comprised of the District Governor Team, The Zone Chairs, and the District Program Chairs. Cabinet Meetings take place four times per year: Early August (around Jungle Days), October, February (at the Midwinter Convention) and April. The purpose of the meetings is to conduct the business of the District and report on District Activities. Any member of any Lions Club in the District is welcome to attend the Cabinet Meetings, and may address the Cabinet upon request.

Midwinter Convention:

The Annual District Convention takes place the second weekend in February at the City Center Hotel in Mankato. All Lions in the District are encouraged to attend, and usually over 400 members do so. Activities include a Service of Remembrance and a Social including hospitality rooms and live entertainment on Friday night. On Saturday there are Seminars, a Luncheon with keynote speaker, the District Business Meeting, the District Governor's Banquet featuring an address by our visiting International guest, and more entertainment and hospitality. Sunday features an ecumenical church service and a brunch with keynote speaker and awards presentations.

5M2 Zone Lion of the Year

ZONE LION OF THE YEAR is a project unique to District 5M2. It gives the district opportunity to bestow well-deserved recognition on a Lion who serves his/her community with energy and sincerity. A Lion nominated for this honor should be a super volunteer who has provided long and notable service.

Each club is asked to nominate a Lion who is not a major officer in the club, but has earned the respect of his/her peers and community during the years of service.

5M2 100% Secretary Award

The 5M2 100% Secretary Award is intended to recognize Club Secretaries based on the conscientious execution of their duties. Criteria include submitting reports, attending District Meetings, participating in District or Online Secretary Training, and taking accurate minutes of club meetings. Melvin Jones Fellowship



The Melvin Jones Fellowship (MJF) recognizes donations of \$1,000. It is the backbone of Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF), providing 75% of the foundation's revenue. As recognition of humanitarian work, an MJF is an honor presented to those who donate \$1,000 to LCIF or to people for whom a donation was made by others.

Contributions can be made by individuals (including non-Lions), clubs or districts. Donations may be in one sum, or in installments of a minimum of \$100 over a five-year period. Melvin Jones Fellows receive an attractive lapel pin, a plaque and a congratulatory letter.

The Progressive Melvin Jones Fellowship (PMJF) program is a way for donors to extend their commitment to LCIF. There are 54 recognition levels beyond the initial \$1,000 MJF contribution with a unique pin for each giving level.

Helen Keller Sight Awards are given to honor those who have distinguished themselves on behalf of sight. They are an excellent way to honor a Lion, Lioness, non-Lion individual, business or organization. The award recipient receives a beautiful plaque and pin, and the recipient's name is displayed on a Helen Keller board in the University of Minnesota's Eye Clinic. The Lions MD5M Hearing Foundation expresses its gratitude and honors individuals through the Lions Hearing Research Fellowship Award. The Research Fellowship is given in the following manner:

- An Individual Fellowship: A gift totaling \$1,000 made by an individual, Lions Club or Lions District:
- A Memorial Fellowship: A gift totaling a cumulative \$1,000 given in memory of a deceased Lion or non-member;
- A Cumulative Fellowship: Accumulated gifts over time resulting in \$1,000 donation;
- A Progressive Fellowship: Gifts to honor an individual who has previously been honored with a Hearing Fellowship Plaque.

Leader Dog Founder's Tribute



Leader Dog's for the Blind in three levels depending on donation amount. A bronze award will be awarded for a \$500 donation, a silver award will be awarded for a \$1,000 donation, and a gold award will be awarded for a \$2,500 donation. Al Jensen Leadership Award



Up to two Al Jensen Leadership Awards may be presented at the Multiple District Convention each year. Each District Governor may nominate one Lions member who has been a member for five years or more and who has served at the District or Multiple District level. The nomination must be on the official nomination form, signed by the District Governor and submitted to the Council Chairperson no later than March 1 each year. Final selection is made by a committee of the seated Council Chairperson and the two previous Council Chairpersons. Recipients receive a lapel pin, a plaque and a congratulatory letter. MD5M Hall of Fame Award



Each District can award one Hall of Fame Award at the MD5M convention each April/May. The award is to honor those Lion and Lioness members of character and substance who have demonstrated the highest level of commitment and dedication to the efforts of their club, district or multiple district and the motto of our association, "We Serve". Nominees must be, or in the case of a posthumous award, have been, a member in good standing for at least 15 years and be at least two years removed from the Council of Governors if a PDG.

A candidate may be sponsored by any Lion, Lioness, Lions Club, Lioness Club, Zone, or District. Nominations, including the \$150 nomination fee (fee is returned if nominee is not elected), must be received by the District Governor at least 30 days prior to the District's Mid-Winter Convention. Nominations will be voted on at the Mid-Winter Convention each year. The Award is presented at the Multiple District Convention in April/May. The recipient receives a lapel pin and a plaque.
