<u>Call to Order</u>: IPDG Diana Kroells called the meeting to order at 4:26 p.m.

Pledge of Allegiance: Led by 1st VDG Anna Wickenhauser

Invocation: 2nd VDG Glenn Kaufmann gave the invocation.

Establishing Protocol: IPDG Diana Kroells established protocol.

<u>Comments</u>: IPDG Diana Kroells answered the question if she is missing the PDG position. Yes and No. She thanked the Cabinet for their support during her year.

Passing of the Gavel: IPDG Diana Kroells passed the gavel to DG Brian Thies.

Welcome: DG Brian Thies welcomed everyone.

Roll Call: Taken by Lion Cindy Walters, showing 38 in attendance, 17 absent, 10 guests.

Introduction of Guests: DG Brian Thies introduced guests:

<u>Adoption of the Agenda</u>: Motion to approve agenda Lion Gary Koch; seconded by Lion Chuck Toltzman; **MC**.

Secretary's Report: Motion to approve by Lion Kathleen Bleckeberg, seconded by Lion Emmy Koch, MC.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Lion Sue Vos presented her report. Motion by PDG Mike Vos and seconded by PDG Marvin Grimm to accept the Treasurer's Report., **MC**. Copy of the Balance Sheet of the Treasurer's Report is located at the end of the minutes.

International Convention/Council of Governor's Report: DG Brian reported that Milan was fun. The parade took 5 hours. Patti Hill was elected as 3rd Vice President. Africa is its own constitutional area now with a Director. He told several stories to tell about experiences in Milan. Council of Governors put money in for the Environmental Photo contest so there will be a photo contest. Currently there is a partial privacy policy in the Multiple. The directory will be composed of the cabinet members from each district sent to Vicki Violet to put together. This will be talked about later in this meeting. IPDG Diana won a trophy for plus 9 women members.

Call for 2nd VDG Candidates: Lion Kathleen Bleckeberg announced running for 2nd VDG.

Communications: Nothing

Old Business:

- **Update on Jungle Days:** Lion Julie Beckius It's tomorrow. Jordaness are ready, 11:30 registration 1:00 shotgun; steak dinner. Great prizes and games on the course. Participation is way done again. 14 registered teams. Praying for no rain.
- PID Debra Wasserman asked the cabinet for a moment of silence in memory of PID Maynard Ruck.

- Update on LCIF Grant for Camp Sweet Life: PID Debra Wasserman understands after a
 conversation with Lion Rene Maas of Camp Sweet Life, that the grant application is likely to go before
 the August LCIF Board of Trustees. She believes they meet in the next week or two. Hopefully shortly
 after that meeting we will get positive news on that grant. IPDG Diana and Lions Wanda and Colleen
 were at the camp this morning to help with registration.
- **Final 2019 Mid Winter Convention Report:** Lion Darlene Mondor A check was delivered to Cabinet Treasurer for \$1796.93.
- Updates to 5M2 Policy Manual/Privacy Policy: PDG Steve Wasserman
 - 1. MD5M has adopted a new privacy policy requiring Lion leaders "opt-in" before the Multiple District will share any personal information including email address, phone numbers, mailing address.
 - 2. There is sentiment in 5M2 that when a Lion agrees to assume a leadership position and provides contact information to LCI that constitutes "opting-in" to the sharing of that information. Obviously, the Council of Governors has not taken that position, and that is not the policy of the Multiple District.
 - 3. 5M2 is encouraged through the Multiple District policy to adopt its own privacy policy. That policy may be different than that adopted by the multiple.
 - 4. PDG Steve would like to suggest that 5M2 develop and implement a data practices/privacy policy that both allows appropriate communication among the Lions of the district and preserves the privacy rights of those Lions.
 - 5. Conversation followed regarding this difficulty in communication. The work around for right now is to send the DG the request and they need to forward the information. PDG Mary Spille made a motion that this district compile an electronic and print directory which includes district Club Presidents, Secretaries, and Treasurers to be used for District activities; seconded by Lion Lori Klein. Discussion followed. It will not be posted anywhere but will available in print or electronic. MC. PDG Steve Wasserman, Lion Brian Rykhus, PDG Diana Kroells and Lion Chuck Toltzman will be on the committee to develop the actual policy language.
- 2021 MD5M Multiple Convention Report: PDG Nancy Mathwig Since the Cabinet meeting, the 2021 MD5M Convention committee has lost its convention co-chair, PID Maynard Rucks. With the passing of Maynard, PDG Mike Vos has agreed to step into the co-chair position. PDG Mike has served on the past two Multiple convention committees and will be a great asset in the co-chair position.

The committee met again and began discussion on how we would handle registration (will have both online and hard copy registration), how to save money on printing costs (to print or not print programs for each meal, etc.) and how we might want the printed material to look. We also tossed around ideas for the 1st timers contest such as how to engage the 1st timers and still make the contest easy to administer. Discussion was held regarding the possibility of service projects during or before the convention. Food for Kidz food packaging was held at both the 2011 and 2016 conventions in Mankato and seemed to be well received.

We will be receiving a \$500 grant from Visit Mankato to use as we deem needed.

The committee has tossed around several themes that would either follow our past two conventions (Bend in the River (with the paddleboat) and Bend in the River II, Come Canoe in 5M2) or with the river and Mankato area as a theme. A decision will need to be made at our next meeting the end of this month.

We are waiting to receive the contract from the City Center Hotel. The hotel has had management changes again since our February Midwinter, which may be slowing down the process. Contracts from Hilton Garden Inn and Courtyard by Marriott have been received and will need to be reviewed by MD5M legal consultant before I sign them. Both are due back to the hotels by the end of September.

PID Debra and PDG Steve Wasserman have joined the committee representing the MD5M PDG Association and the 100th anniversary celebrations for the Faribault and Northfield Lions Clubs. Steve will also be assisting with the technology necessary to promote the convention. 1st VDG Anna Wickenhauser has joined us since, per current COG processes, she will serve as the Council

Convention Committee chair during her governor year as DG in the district hosting convention.

To date:

- Convention will be April 30, May 1 & 2, 2021
- Our understanding has been that our International visitor for the weekend will be Judge Haynes Townsend, who will be International President at that time. PID Debra is coordinating our International guest with Int'l VP Brian since the Faribault and Northfield Lions Clubs would like to celebrate their 100th Anniversaries with our International guest as their speaker for the event.
- Hotels will be Hilton Garden Inn (Headquarters Hotel), City Center Hotel and Courtyard by Marriott.
- Venue location will be the Mankato Civic Center.
- Jungle Days Task Force: PDG Nancy Mathwig and Lion Dave Sebesta There have been so many changes in Zones that it is unsure what we will do as we move forward. Will be reevaluated after Jungle Days tomorrow.
- Lights on for Life: PDG Rick Wagener Lion Sue Vos reported for PDG Rick. Lights on for Life started 11 years ago when PDG Mary was DG. The main focus was to make people aware of the hazard of not being able to be seen on the roads in bad weather without their lights on. The newer cars do have their front lights that come on automatically, but the tail lights do not come on automatically they have to be set to manual. Lion Paul Stahler and PDG Rick Wagener were the co-chairs and talked to our district clubs. The goal is still pretty much the same and to see if we can tke it to the state level. This was passed 11 years ago and we did receive an LCIF matching grant of \$1,750. All papers were completed and satisfied with LCIF. We do have a balance in our district of \$1,455 which would be our starting cash. He is not seeking any money at this time. Just reapproval of the cabinet to pursue The Lions Lights on for Life Project. This is an already approved project so it can continue.
- Project Pillowcase Update: Lions Sandy Schneider and/or Denise Parish Lion Sandy asked whether Project Pillowcase needed to resolicit funds from 5M2. It is already an approved project so they are still able to proceed.
- Project New Hope Fundraiser: PDG Joan Blank Revisit of the idea of Jack Webster's bird pins as a fundraiser. Nobody came forward with ideas. PDG Joan asked that this be revisited at the next cabinet meeting.

New Business:

- Approval of Bank: PDG Nancy Mathwig made a motion to approve Cornerstone state Bank as the bank of 5M2 seconded by Lion Gary Koch. MC.
- Approval of Bond for Cabinet Treasurer: Lion Brian Rykhus made a motion to approve the bond for the Cabinet Treasurer Lion Janet Knakmuhs seconded. MC.
- **2019-2020 Budget:** Lion Sue Vos— Located at the end of these minutes. This will be approved at the October Board Meeting.
- Lions Gift of Sight: PDG Mary Spille As you all know the Vision Foundation is dealing with two major issue that affect the future of Lions Gift of Sight and our proposed Lions Eye Institute. Remembering that in January 2018, a second eye bank came to Minnesota. Sightfirst is a Seattle-based eye bank now conducting business in many sights. Sightfirst is an eye bank for the main purpose of corneal transplants. It is non-profit. Sightfirst has a sister organization CorneaGen. CorneaGen is the organization using eye tissue for research purposes. Of course, over the last 60 years, Lions of Minnesota have partnered with the University of Minnesota developing our eye bank nka Lions Gift of Sight. Per the Eye Bank Association of America, LGS is rated among the best in the nation. And it is a totally nonprofit entity accepting eye tissue as gifts to remain as gifts. One of our concerns is that our

competitor Sightfirst transfers tissue to CorneaGen which is a for-profit entity. So this means there is financial benefit obtained from a GIFT from a family at the time of a loved one's death. As you know, we have worked diligently through the last MN legislative session to place a nonprofit provision for eye donations in Minnesota law. This mission passed successfully through many State and House committees but did not make it to law status. Please, please remember this when the new session begins. Rest assured that Christy and I will continue to request your support in contact your state legislators.

- Second item continued eyeglass collection. We will always accept your collections throughout the year. If you need new containers, please ask. Cardboard boxes are always available but the plastic buckets are an alternative. If you wish plastic, please place an order with Christy or me.
- Third reminder that Thanksgiving for Vision is set for Saturday, October 26. But, on the Friday eve before, you will have the opportunity to attend a new fundraiser. Eyeball will be an evening of entertainment, particulars in coming newsletters.
- Youth Exchange Family Expense Reimbursement: IPDG Diana Kroells Talked about the expense that is incurred as a host family. They spent over \$1,000 to host two youth this year. Discussion followed. More information needs to be gathered. A committee was formed to gather more information and present at the next Cabinet Meeting. PDG Diana, 1st VDG Anna, Lion Cindy and Jim are the committee.
- **Joint District Project for Feed My Starving Children:** Lion Dar Mondor This year it will be on Monday, April 20, 2020. We will be involved with this project.
- New Club Entrance Fee Supplement (\$25/member): GMT/PDG Marvin Grimm PDG Bill and Donna Landwehr have suggested that new club entrance fee be paid at \$25 instead of \$35. PDG Marvin Grimm made a motion that the district supplement the fee to charge \$25 to new members and \$10 be paid from the District membership line, seconded by Lion Kathleen Bleckeberg. MC.
- **2020 5M2 Midwinter Convention:** Lion Lori Klein The clubs of Zone 5 are being contacted about first planning meeting. Contact has been made with the hotel to verify everything is in order. Friday night entertainment is already booked. February 14-16.
