Pit Stop Time! In keeping with International President Wayne Madden's schedule, it is time for the 2nd Pit Stop. Each Club and every Cabinet Member needs to take time to:

Review the goals set early in this Club Year,

Assess the progress made toward achieving those goals,

Make the adjustments or corrections that are necessary to insure a successful Club Year.

Mid-Winter Convention- Reminders...."Start Your Engines" February 8,9,10

You need to complete your registrations with the City Center Hotel prior to JANUARY 8 in order to receive the Lions reduced room rate. Also advance registration for the Convention will help the Convention Committee with making necessary plans and will save you some \$\$\$.

- Please bring your Club Banner for the Opening Ceremony on Friday evening and have one or two persons available to participate in the procession.

- Each Club is asked to bring a \$15.00 Door Prize which will be awarded at the Saturday Luncheon and the Sunday Brunch.

- All Clubs must send the names of their selected delegates to the District Secretary. The Delegates need receive their credentials on Saturday, February 9, prior to the Business Meeting.

- Bring your used eyeglasses and hearing aids to the Mid-Winter Registration Desk. (Separate hearing aids from the eyeglasses). Have a "count" of the number of each that your Club is bringing. This information will be recorded at the Registration Desk. - If your Club has not completed the nomination process for the 5M-2 "Zone Person of the Year" recognition, it must be sent to 1st VDG Joan Blank prior to February 15th.

Though I have been Chairperson of our Foundation for just six months, it is easy to see all the good that we have accomplished this past year, and every year since the Foundation was created.
