As I write this, I have been home just 24 hours after arriving back from my first

USA/Canada Forum in Overland Park, Kansas. This has been a year for many first, and all of my experiences have proved to be most rewarding. The Forum's theme was "Follow the Leadership Road to Your Dreams" and it was quite entertaining to have Dorothy or the Tin Man or the Courageous Lion show up at various times.

The mission of the USA/Canada Forum is to develop leaders, motivate and educate attendees, provide an openexchange of idea, and support the programs and goals of Lions Clubs International. The host planning committee from Kansas more than accomplished this goal. Lion Kevin and I attended some seminars together but split up most the time to cover as many as we could. As much as we enjoyed all the different topics we attended, we thought the guest speakers delivered the best motivational messages. Two speakers really impacted us by their overcoming of extremely difficult situations.

Thursday night's speaker was Ed Hearn, a member of the World Champion New York Mets in 1986. The following: year with the Kansas City Royals, he was set to make those big "million bucks" when suddenly a serious shoulder injury brought a premature end to a very promising career. Less than six months later after his baseball career ended, he was diagnosed with three potentially life threatening health conditions. Ed went from the penthouse to the outhouse, as he likes to put it. He explained how one nurse and young male. patient made him "think outside himself" and persevere through the curve balls life was throwing at him. His courage, faith and determination spoke volumes about how we go about facing life's challenges. Ed reminded us over and over that each of us have the gift of making a difference in someone else's life.

On Saturday night at the closing banquet over 2000. Lions were amazed with the story of our speaker, Patrick Henry Hughes. Patrick was born without eyes and without the ability to fully straighten his arms and legs, making him unable to walk. Additionally, two steel rods were surgically attached to Patrick's spine to correct scoliosis.

Despite circumstances that may seem overwhelming, Patrick, now 26 years old, has overcome these physical issues to excel as a musician, student, performer and public speaker. Believe it or not, he started playing the piano at nine months old. Patrick is also an accomplished trumpet player and sings. He even participated in the University of Louisville Marching Band for five seasons with the help of his Dad, who tirelessly maneuvered his wheel chair through the formations of the other 220 plus members of the Cardinal Marchino Band. Patrick wowed the Lions with his plano playing and as an encore finished with *Somewhere Over the Rainbow*. Patrick showed us how to accentuate the positives in our lives and use these to make a difference. It was powerful.

One of the best benefits from attending this Forum was the opportunity to meets service minded Lions from all over the US and Canada. The exchange of ideas and friendship is priceless. Lion Kevin and I are already dreaming about attending next year's Forum in San Juan, Puerto Rico!
