The Forum's theme was "Follow the Leadersh ip Road to YourDreams" and it was yuite entertaining to have Dorothy or the Tin Man or the Couragesus Lion show up at various times.

The mission of the USACanad a Forum is to develop leaders, motivate and educate attendees, provide an open exchange of idea, and support the programs and goals of Lions Clubs International. The host planning oommittes from Kansas more than accomplished this goal. Lion Kevin and I attended some seminars together but split up most the time to coveras many as we could. As much as we enjoyed all the different topics we attended, we thought the guest speakers delvered the best motivational messages. Two speakers really impacted us by their overcoming of extremely difficult situations.

Thursday night's speaker was Ed Hearn, a member of the World Champion New YorkMets in 1986. The following year with the Kansas City Royals, he was set to make those big "million bucks" when suddenly a sericus shoulder injury brought a premature end to a very promising career. Less than six months later after his baseball careerended, he was diagnosed with three potentially life threatening health conditions. Ed went from the penthouse to the outhouse, as he likes to put it. He explained how one nurse and young male patient made him "think outside himself" and persevere through the curve balls life was throwingat him. His courage, faith and determination spoke wolumes about how we go about facing lifes's challengers. Ed reminded us over and over that each of us have the gift of makingadifference in someone else'slife.

On Saturd ay night at the closing banquet over 2000 Lions were amazed with the story of our speaker, Patrick Henry Hughes. Patrick was born withouteyes and without the ability to fullystraighten his a.ms and legs, making him unable to walk. Additionally, wo steel rods were surgicallyattached to Patrick's spine to comect socliosis.

Despite circumstances that may seem overwhelming, Patrick, now 26 years old, has overcome these physical issues to excel as a musician, student, performer and public speaker. Believe it or not, he started playing the piano at nine months okd. Patrick is also an accomplished trumpet player and sings. He even participated in the University of Louisville Marching Band for free seasons with the help of his Dad, who tirelessly maneuvered his wheel chair through the formations of the other 220 plus members of the Cardinal Marching Band. Patrick wowed the Lions with his piano playing and as an encorefinished with "Somewhere Over the Rain bow". Patrick showed us how to accentuate the positives in our lives and use these to make a difference. It was powerful.

One of the best benefits from attending th is Forum was the opportunity to mests service minded Lions from all over the US and Canada. The exchange of ideas and friendship is priceless. Lion Kevin and I are already dreaming about attending next year's Forum in San Juan, Puerto Rico!
