the coming year. My topic this month is how you can "Strengthen

The Pride"through Leadership.

The dictionary defines **leadership** as "The position or function of a leader, a person who guides or directs a group." According to Wikipedia, **Leadership** has been described as "a process of social influence in which one person can enlist the aid and support of others in the accomplishment of a common task".

We often hear that some people are "born leaders". The implication is that there are some people who "can" lead, and that others "can't". While it may be true that some people are more prone to accept leadership roles and are more comfortable leading, I think that leadership is more a skill that can be learned than an ability

that we either have or don't have.

Like all organizations, Lions Clubs are in need of quality leaders. Unlike most organizations, Lions Clubs have developed an extensive array of opportunities for members to improve their leadership skills and grow as leaders. At the recently concluded USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum in Puerto Rico, there were over 90 seminars. Forum seminars aren't just for District Officers. Many seminars were targeted to Club Members, and cover such practical things as developing service projects, creative fundraising, and using technology. There were seminars on building leadership skills, conflict resolution, public speaking, and time management. There were seminars on Lions projects such as Quest, LCIF, Disaster Relief, KidSight, Leos, LERCs, CEP (had enough acronyms?). There were great motivational speakers at the meals, and an opportunity to meet Lions from all over the US and Canada. While San Juan may have been a little far to go, The next USA/Canada Forum will be held in Grand Rapids, Michigan on September 17-19, 2015. That's close enough to drive, they have some great hotel rates (or you can RV it), and they are planning on having at least 120 seminars. Don't miss it! In fact, don't wait, you can sign up online now.

Can't get away for a forum? MD5M will be conducting a **Regional Leadership Institute** from March 26-29 in Mahnomen. While there aren't the wide range of topics you will find at a USA/Canada Forum, this institute does provide excellent training in leadership skills targeted at Lions who are potential future leaders in our clubs and districts. Our district is allocated six participants, and applications are due to DG Harry by December 1. Talk to anyone on the DG

Team (or any past participant) for more information.

Want to work at your own pace? There are two great places to go online. The first is the **Lions Learning Center** on the LCI website. There you will (currently) find 22 different courses in four categories: Leadership, Managing Others, Achieving Results, and Communication. Each course takes from 30 to 60 minutes to complete. There are also webinars available from the LCI website. October topics include "Effective Club Meetings" and "Harmony in the Pride", and past webinars are available for download.

The newest leadership training resource is the **Lions University**. This is actually connected with the USA/Canada Leadership Forum, and is offering Bachelor's (Leading Your Lions Club), Master's (Leading at the District Level), and Doctorate (Training Facilitator for Adult Volunteers) Programs. There are four webinars scheduled for October. Go to www.lionsuniversity.org for more information or to sign up for a webinar.

There is a great need for Quality Lion Leaders. We have the resources available. Now is time for you to "Strengthen The

Just a few weeks ago, <u>China was hit with a terrible earthquake</u>. More than 600 people died because of the disaster and a large number of people were injured. What made the situation even worse was that more than 40,000 homes were damaged or destroyed! That means more than 40,000 families are in need of help. I am proud that Lions are there to help them.

LCIF immediately issued a US\$250,000 Major Catastrophe Grant through the <u>Disaster Relief Fund</u>, allowing Lions to provide food, water, blankets, medicine and other necessities to people in need. With clubs in more than 200 countries, LCIF is ready to help whenever Lions or their communities are in need, regardless of their location. The road to recovery can be a long one, but Lions will be there for as long as needed while homes are rebuilt and communities are put back together in China.



Courtland Lions Dictionary Project

Lions Clubs International is the world's largest service club organization with 1.35 million members in more than 45,000 clubs worldwide. Founded in 1917, Lions are best known for fighting blindness. Lions also volunteer for many different kinds of community projects, including caring for the environment, feeding the hungry and aiding seniors and the disabled. The Lions Club motto is "We Serve."

The Lions organization has donated 388,308 dictionaries. They have been implementing the project since 2002-2003, with at least 427 clubs/sections participating in the project. They have donated to over 1,369 school(s) nationwide!

So far in 2014-2015, Lions Clubs have donated 65,451 books, giving to students in over 809 schools, and with about 268 clubs participating. In Minnesota alone, the Lions have donated 107,513 dictionaries.

Five Immanuel Lutheran third graders, A.J. Braulick, Riley Gieseke, Grace Mages, Ethan Goff, and Gavin Bode, received dictionaries from the Courtland Lions on Friday, September 19, 2014.
