

5M2 VITAL SIGNS REPORT

Happy New Year! By the time
you read this article 2017 will be a
year in history (or close to it). As I
reflect back on the past 6 months
as your District Governor I find
that the time has gone by very

swiftly but oh, what a wonderful experience it has been to date! During this time frame I have attended 22 Lions club meetings, 1 Leo Club meeting, 17 Zone meetings, 3 DG team meetings, 2 Cabinet meetings, 2 conventions, 1 Leo Club charter night, 4 new club organizational meetings, 1 Lions Club charter night, 7 Mid-Winter convention meetings, Thanksgiving for Vision, Donor Family recognition program and the USA Canada Leadership Forum. While the list may look overwhelming, the time has been very well spent. My visits to your clubs are at the top of the list. I continue to be amazed at the service each and every club does in their communities, from cleaning ditches (environmental) to providing food for those in need (hunger) to vision screenings (vision) to sponsoring youth activities (youth) (i.e. Leos, Scouts, activities during community events). It is through your continued support of these needed services that District 5M2 has earned the Centennial Service banner patch 3 out of the 4 years of the program and will again earn a patch for the 2017-2018 year with 58% of the clubs already reporting at least two of the five (5) areas (50% of clubs are required). During 2014-2015 77% of the clubs participated, 2015-2016 84% participated and in 2016-2017 83% participated. There is still time until June 30, 2018 for District 5M2 to reach 100% participation from all clubs. I believe each of your clubs completes service projects in at least two of the areas; however, some of them may not have been recorded on the LCI website in the monthly reports.

FYI - During my club visits I have been updating you on the number of people around the world served by Lions during the Centennial Service Challenge and have explained the new challenge to serve 200 million people per year by 2021. We have discussed how LCI collects that data and discussed that sometimes it's strictly an educated guess to determine how many people we impact with our ditch clean-up or tree

planting, etc. While writing this article I was browsing the wealth of information available on the LCI website and found the following in the Centennial Service Challenge FAQ:

"How should clubs determine the number of beneficiaries for projects that do not involve providing direct service to individuals? For example, tree planting projects, road side clean-ups and recycling programs? Ultimately, it is up to the club to quantify its service impact. There is no right or wrong answer. However, please know that in order to build validity into the data, a maximum limit amount per activity is used for both people served (3,000) and trees planted (5,000). Reported amounts greater than the maximum limit will be counted at the maximum limit amount noted above."

5M-2 HALL OF FAME

Begin considering now to place into nomination an outstanding club member for the 2018 District 5M-2 Hall of Fame.

As presented at the recent fall zone meetings, the purpose of the award is to honor those Lions and Lioness members of character and substance who have demonstrated the highest level of commitment and dedication to the efforts of their club, district and multiple district and the motto of our association "We Serve".

Criteria for the award -

- May be a Lion or Lioness
- o Must have been a member in good standing for at least 15 years
- o Must be at least 2 years removed from the Council of Governors, if a PDG
- Have qualifications above and beyond the call of duty including social and human endeavors
- Should be of good moral character and
- o Should have a good reputation in good standing in his/her community
- o If deceased, must have been a member in good standing of a MD5M Lions or Lioness club at the time of his/her death.

Process

- Nomination fee of \$150.00 for each candidate nominated must accompany the nomination to the District Governor. This fee is returned to you if your candidate is not the chosen recipient during the Mid-Winter convention voting.
- All nominations must be received by District Governor Nancy no later than 30 days, prior to our Mid-Winter Convention. No later than January 10, 2018.
- An election for the recipient from 5M-2 will be held during the annual meeting at the Mid-Winter convention on February 10, 2018. The winner of that election will be inducted into the Hall of Fame at the 2018 Multiple District Convention in Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada on April 14, 2018.
- o Information, as well as the nomination form, is available online at www.5m2lions.org , Forms and Award Applications, MD5M Hall of Fame nomination form.

Each of your clubs has a Lion who fits the criteria needed for a nomination to the Hall of Fame. While only one 5M-2 Lion will be awarded the honor in 2018, every Lion nominated will be featured at the Mid-Winter convention when their bios are presented to the membership. Honor these deserving Lions with a nomination.



Daphnee is Hearing impaired, Autistic and non-verbal. Two years later we adopted from Florida our AriYanna. She is our Princess. She has Cerebral Palsy, and is very limited with movement. AriYanna is in a wheelchair and also needs 24/7 care. She is very smart and always wants to do activities that her older brothers do. Camp makes that possible for our little girl. Special Needs was new to our family and we no longer traveled or went camping.

One day while attending an appointment at Gillette's Childrens at Brainerd, someone told us about the camp. We decided to swing in and see; We were so Blessed by the greeting of the Camp Leaders. They shared how our daughter could go on a pontoon and glass bottom boat. They had Hospital beds so she could sleep and have handicap showers. WOW. They had an AMAZING STAFF, that looked her in the eye's and shared what it would be like to visit camp.

We have now attend Camp a handful of times and all season. Camp has given our family a BREATH that we so badly need. Our sons that are now 11 and 14 have enjoyed fishing, the Nature Center and so much more. Being able to be together as a family is wonderful. When we get scheduled to stay everyone gets to enjoy their favorite thing. Our Daphnee who always runs away from family during any activity is so in love with the animal sanctuary, she will sit and feed animals and watch them. During some of her time at camp the staff is aware of her needs and help the family keep her safe.



History so far: 1960, MN Lions Eye Bank; 1978, Children's Eye Clinic; 1993, Lions Research Building. And this month, we come to 1998 and the creation of the MAC Center.

Age-related Macular Degeneration is the leading cause of blindness in the developed world. A \$2.5 million dollar gift from Minnesota Lions. As our life spans increase in years, we note that more and more elderly suffer this life-changing disability. Persons with AMD see nothing but a blurry black void in the center of their vision field; the blurry space expands in size as time goes by. Losing our central vision limits our ability to read, drive, and even recognize faces of friends and family. Over 10 million Americans (with the number expected to double by 2050) are victims of AMD. we all know someone afflicted. The MAC Center is a division of the Department of Ophthalmology's research centers.

This month, we would like to tell you about the important work being conducted at the University of Minnesota Lions Children's Hearing Center.

Back in 2005 the Lions Children's Hearing Center was founded by a generous grant from the Lions 5M Hearing Foundation.

Here are some interesting facts:

Hearing loss is the #1 sensory deficit children in MN are born with. About 200 babies are born every year in Minnesota with deafness or permanent hearing loss.

However, when a child is diagnosed and effectively treated before 6 months of are, that child can develop language skills at the same rate as their normal hearing peers. So early diagnosis and treatment can and does make a difference. That is the reason the Lions pushed the State for mandatory neonatal hearing testing. This way we can reach these kids immediately.

At the inception of the Lions Children's Hearing Center, back in 2005, the goals and mission statement were then and remain today as follows: To offer a comprehensive state-of-the-art facility connecting providers and resources for children with hearing disorders.

What does State-of-the-art facility mean? It means a clinic that engages the highest levels of physicians and research doctors. It means a clinic that engages the latest technology to test, diagnose and treat hearing loss at any level. It means a clinic that allows that hearing impaired child and their family to see up to 6 different specialty doctors in one setting.

After the child is seen the doctors come together as a group to decide how to effectively treat the child based off the finding obtained.

This is your Mn Lions Hearing Foundation money at work. We will continue this story next month with some interesting facts about children's hearing loss.




