

- 4. Click on the "Search" button below the box
- 5. You should get a screen that says: "You are ready to join the Lions of MN group...". You should also see the day & time you have requested.
- 6. Click in the check box to agree to follow FMSC's guidelines
- 7. You should see the guidelines pop up, click on the "Accept" button at the bottom right
- 8. The guidelines will disappear, then click on the "Confirm" button
- 9. If you already have an account, you can log in, otherwise click on "Create an Account"
- 10. Fill in the form and click "Continue"
- 11. You should see the "Congratulations" page.
- 12. To add more names, click on "Add Member Names" in the box on the right side of the screen
- 13. Add your other members names, and click on the "Save" button below the boxes for names. Repeat as necessary.

# 2018 Lions Clubs International Convention

June 29 – July 3, 2018 MGM Grand Hotel Las Vegas, NV

### **Delegates:**

Each club is allowed 1 delegate for every 20 members (who are in good standing and have been a member of the club for at least a year and a day) or major fraction thereof, however every club (in good standing) is entitled to at least one delegate.

### Registration:

Register online at <a href="www.lionsclubs.org">www.lionsclubs.org</a>. Click on "LCICON" in the top menu line then "FOR ATTENDEES" in the yellow menu line. You can also download a registration form from the same site. Please note that the registration fee will increase by \$25 on April 1. Get your registration in now!

### Registration Fee:

- Through March 31, 2018: \$200
- April 1, 2018 through onsite registration: \$225
- Leo Registration is \$20 (for age 17 and under)

### Hotel:

Our delegation hotel is the Luxor. A "Standard Pyramid" room is \$100 for Friday & Saturday, and \$56 other days. "Tower" rooms are \$118 and \$63. There is also a "Resort Fee" of \$18 per day. You can register for a hotel at the same time you do your convention reservation. A \$200 deposit is required to reserve your hotel room.



As Kidsight approaches the end of year one, clubs have been busy doing screenings and wanting more information on

getting started. As with any new activity, there are bumps along the road and changes in procedures and forms. However, throughout the last year, many positive comments have been received. The screenings are already proving to be impactful on children's lives. At one screening event in Prior Lake, a child was referred. The child had a vision procedure earlier in the year. When the family took the child for an exam, the eye doctor was so glad the screening had occurred. There were continued issues and if follow-up did not happen, loss of vision was very possible for this child. The family was so appreciative of what the Lions are doing and encouraging other families to come to future screenings.

As forms are updated, the most recent copies are available on the web. The most recent forms will be found on the MD5M Kidsight page (http://www.lionsmd5m.org/lions-kid-sight.html). Please go there to assure you are using the most recent forms for con-

ducting screenings. Other information on the page provides guidance on pulling data and directions on how to pre-enter child information.

- Only Lions who have gone through training can operate the cameras. These certified screeners are NOT able to train new screeners.
- Follow-up with children who are referred must be completed.
- After a screening, a site report and referral follow-up form needs to be sent to Lion Rick Wagner or Lion Lori Klein.
- If your club is having first screening, coordinate with Lion Rick or Lion Lori on assuring a camera is available and asking for assistance at that screening.
- If you were trained and need a refresher on the camera, please contact Lion Rick or Lion Lori

Future trainings for screeners are being planned and information about those will be put in the 5M2 Newsletter and sent to club secretaries in the area. As requested, Lion Rick or Lion Lori are available to complete club visits to share more information about Kidsight.

Well, Minnesota Lions have vision! Through the last several months, we have talked about the many visions completed since 1960 when Lions were instrumental in forming the Minnesota Lions Eye Bank.

And this is where we continue to meet the challenge to be Knights of the Blind. We are marching forward. Repeating the message: LIONS EYE INSTITUTE. Twenty one million dollars over twenty years. We are developing a deeper appreciation of the critical service we, as Minnesota Lions, provide to sight saving measures. Actually, the \$4 million pledge to Surgery Center is partially complete; this dollar amount is part of the LEI (Lions Eye Institute) pledge. Clinics, procedures, research, eye banking all in one location – a dream becoming reality!

It is now 2018 and the new campaign has begun. We are Lions, we can do! The MN Lions Vision Foundation is the largest contributor the Department of Ophthalmology. Over the years, we

have contributed \$17 million. Of this, \$9 million has been contributed since 2010 (averaging \$1.3 million per year). However, these monies maintain the needs already in place. Now we step forward to place all existing facilities under one roof in the medical corridor at the University. Over twenty years, the campaign will travel through three phases. Core funding will be dependent on individual Lions known as sustaining partners. This will be better explained in our April column. And, better yet, it is time to invite your directors to visit all your clubs.

Press Release from service animals.

We would like to update you on Delta Airlines' new rules on traveling with a service or support animal. These rules go into effect March 1, 2018.

We have discussed the requirements with our Delta contacts at Detroit Metropolitan Airport (DTW) and how they affect our clients returning home after training with their Leader Dogs. Subsequently, we have put an internal process in place so clients returning home from Leader Dog will not have any issues getting their dogs through security and onto their flights.

We are working with Assistance Dogs International and the Council of US Dog Guide Schools regarding how to address the new rules as an industry. We feel that responding to Delta as a united, organized industry will have the most impact on making Delta understand how the new rules do not follow ADA regulations. A uniform response from all guide dog organizations is especially important as we expect other airlines to follow suit. We will keep you updated on the steps taken in the future.

In the interim, we would like to clarify a few of the requirements Delta has put in place.

- 1. There are two forms you must complete prior to your flight.
  - A Service Request Form available at delta. com/mytrips. You must attach a Veterinary Health Form (see b. below) to the service request.
  - You must submit a completed Veterinary Health Form at least 48 hours prior to your flight. Your dog's Veterinary Health Form is good for one year from the date your veterinarian signs the form.
- 2. Upon arrival at the airport you must have your request verified by a Delta Representative at the Delta check-in counter.
- 3. You must keep the completed paperwork with you while traveling at all times.
- 4. You can review the entire guidelines at <a href="https://">https://</a> www.delta.com/content/www/en\_US/traveling-with-us/special-travel-needs/service-animals.html.

We understand that the requirements constitute a major inconvenience and create discriminatory issues. We will continue to work towards a resolution that is equitable for all involved.

"Would you like to join my Lions Club?" "No, not right now."


How many of you have used this sentence in acquiring new members and it just doesn't get you the new members that you hoped for? What are you doing wrong?

In 5M3 we have used LCIF a number of times: for the flooding in Truman, tornadoes in Clarkfield, Granite Falls and Chandler – just to name a few so this international project does hit close to home in our communities.

I have found with the younger generations you need to "wine & dine" them, not just invite them to your meeting. For many, meetings are a waste of time and not productive. They will show up to work an event but will spend little time discussing it. So hosting a special event where you can sit down, visit and let them ask questions about Lions and enjoy each other's company. Of course, beverage and snack is always on the table. Now just don't put an ad in the paper and expect everyone to show up or you will be having a social gathering all by yourself.
