Take this uninterrupted time to update your club contact list. Make the phone call to see if the numbers are still accurate, send a quick email to check on your club member. Dear Friend of FMSC,

Feed My Starving Children continues to closely monitor the ongoing COVID-19 outbreak and respond in step with the recommendations of federal and state authorities. As announced previously, we have taken the unprecedented step of pausing our normal meal packing activities at our permanent sites.

As of today, March 16, we are closing all packing sites through Sunday, April 12. This extends the previously announced 3-day closure. All MobilePackT events scheduled for March 16 through April 12 remain postponed. This will give us additional time to evaluate our options and to monitor and adapt to the ever-evolving situation.

We recognize gravity of this situation for those who rely on FMSC meals and we lift up those children and their families in prayer. We ask for God's help and wisdom in this global health crisis.

Pray. We ask you to join us in prayer for the health of FMSC's volunteers, supporters, staff, partners and most importantly those who rely on FMSC meals.

MN Lions Childhood Cancer Foundation Report

Since our matching funds fundraising campaign started, District 5M2 has raised over \$21,000 toward our \$100,000 goal! With the match, that means our District has ac-

counted for over \$63,000 to be donated to the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital for research and services for survivors of childhood cancer and the continuing health issues they face as they become adults.

Our goal of \$100,000 has ALMOST been reached. We do not expect any problem in reaching our goal by June 30!

Lion Sandy Schneider has resigned as a director of the MN Lions Childhood Cancer Foundation. I want to express my appreciation for her dedication to this important project – especially in selling out our lapel pins at the Midwinter Convention! DGE Anna has found two wonderful people to represent 5M2 for next year! (I also will step down at the end of June.)

Speaking of lapel pins, they have been reordered, but are manufactured in China! The factory was shut down for at least a couple of weeks due to the Coronavirus outbreak. We understand that the factory is now running again, and

the latest we have heard is delivery of the pins in early April.
