



Sight for Students

The Missouri Lions recently joined with VSP Vision Care network to serve as a community partner in its Sight for Students program. Participating VSP optometrists and ophthalmologists will provide free vision examinations and eyeglasses, if prescribed.

Missouri Lions clubs can request Sight for Students gift certificates from their district governor. The gift certificate can be redeemed with participating doctors (http://www.sightforstudents.org/).

To be eligible for a gift certificate, children must meet five criteria:

- •Family income is no more than 200% of federal poverty level.
- •Child is not enrolled in Medicaid or other vision insurance.
- •Child is 18 years old or younger and has not graduated from high school.
- •Child or parent is a U.S. citizen or legal immigrant with a social security number.
- •Child has not used the Sight for Students program during the past 12 months.

Clubs interested in participating in the Sight for Students program will complete a request for each child and submit the request to the district governor. The district governor will verify the eligibility and provide the Sight for Students gift certificate. State Constitution & By-Laws Committee Report Lion Bob Van Ark, Chairperson

Your State Constitution & By-Laws Committee has authority to propose amendments to the State Constitution, but rarely does so, except for making corrections or placing our state document into agreement with changes made at the International level. Rather, the committee places into proper wording the changes that are proposed by the Council of Governors. The latest that the Council can propose changes is at it's January Council meeting, due to requirements of providing notice to all clubs before the vote at the state convention in April.

To date, two issues have been placed before the committee.

One is to address a restriction presently in the constitution that no Lion may serve on the same state committee for more than four years in a six-year period. The committee will address whether (1) to eliminate the restriction completely, (2) Modify it in some way, such as restricting the service to 6 of 8 years, or (3) Make exceptions for specific committees.

The second issue is to revisit the proposal, defeated last year, to provide an alternate way to add the required second signature to checks issued by the state office. We presently spend \$50 a month in special postage, sending the checks to the council member who co-signs them, and returning them to the state office. We also have seen delays and mis-sent postal packages. The intent of the proposed change is to still require advance approval by a council officer (likely via e-mail), but then permit a local Lion to provide the actual signature.

A new service project adopted by the Jefferson City Breakfast Lions is preparing and delivering gift baskets to elderly citizens who are not able to leave their homes on a regular basis. Lions reached out to the seniors as they delivered the baskets.

LCIF Providing Typhoon Relief for the Philippines

Lions Clubs International Foundation has awarded US \$35,000 to support Lions in District 301-E, Philippines, in their relief efforts following Typhoon Washi. As reported by Reuters, the national disaster agency said 957 were killed and 49 were missing, with most of the casualties in the cities of Cagayan de Oro and Iligan in the Mindanao region. The disaster agency said more than 338,000 people in 13 provinces were affected by the disaster, with nearly 43,000 still in evacuation centers.

Lions in the affected area are already distributing relief supplies and organizing assistance programs.

The Award is named after a Past District Governor who headed the state sight program for 20 years, and was a major factor in establishment of our eye bank. It is awarded to a Club member whenever a club donations to the Foundation reach \$10,000. Recipients are chosen by previous recipients of the award.
