#### **My Lions Experience**

Lions in Sight Eyeglass Mission Clinic to Rio Verdo Lion Dorene Jackson, Jefferson City Host Lions

I had the honor of traveling to Rio Verdo, Mexico with Lions in Sight for an Eyeglass Mission Clinic. There were ten of us traveling from different locations in Missouri, Iowa and California (four doctors and six technicians). I've previously been on four other mission trips, but this one by far was the most impacting.

During the two-day clinic we saw over 600 adults and children in need of eye care/eye glasses. It was both sad and humbling to see so many who have never had an eye exam or have never had the opportunity to experience the joy of sight. Having the opportunity to watch the expression on their faces when they were given a pair of glasses and are able to see clearly (many for the first time) was priceless. So many had lost their vision years ago, and were not in the position to purchase glasses.



Lions in Sight provided those glasses and gave them the blessing of clear vision again. Listening as they were given a book to read a paragraph, but had difficulty doing this, not because of their inability to read, but for the tears that flowed. For many, it was the first time in a long time, that they were able to see the words on the page. As I watched a few of the children receive their glasses and they were able to see the beauty of color, the joy on their face is an image that I'll never forget.

The days were long and many to see, but it was worth it when I was able to watch them as they left with the biggest smiles and a new pair of glasses. While there, I was also privileged to take part in the local Lions Club event for special needs children. A few of us were able to work out with the children as they did some basic exercise routines. It was wonderful getting out and doing the work of a Lion. I'm looking forward to serving on the next trip, wherever it may be.

#### **Lions Learning Center**

One of the most overlooked resources for our Lions is the free Lions Learning Center (LLC). The LLC offers online courses to its members. In the LLC, you can learn and practice key leadership skills for your role as a Lions leader and to be successful in all your projects. Courses are categorized by four key skills: Leadership, Managing Others, Achieving Results and Communication. These courses typically take 30 to 60 minutes to complete.

- Leadership: Courses focused on a broad range of leadership skills to succeed as a Lion leader.
- Managing Others: Courses geared toward gaining the skills to effectively create and maintain successful and productive relationships with people.
- Achieving Results: Courses designed to assist in setting and achieving goals, both personal and professional.
- Communication: Courses that increase interpersonal skills and success in public speaking.

By now, you are asking yourself, "Just how do I take advantage of these free courses?"

All you need to create a free account is your Lions member ID. The LLC is located on the Lions Clubs International web site: http://members.lionsclubs.org/EN/resources/leadership-resource-center/lions-learning-center/index.php

- Adobe Flash player is needed to run LLC courses.
- LLC courses cannot be accessed by iPad or iPhone at this time. Other tablets and smart phones with Flash player can be used.


