Unfortunately, PDG Charlie passed away several weeks before getting to see how well his vision worked out.







The convention was preceded by the final Council of Governors meeting of the 2013-2014 Lions year. Following the meeting, the District Governors-Elect met to select their Council Chairperson for the 2014-2015 Lions year. I am proud to report that your very own District Governor, Lion Jeff Hilke, has been selected to serve as Council Chairperson with a very fine group of incoming District Governors.









The first day of the convention featured training for our incoming district leaders and was highlighted by an evening of fun and fellowship at the annual hospitality night. The second day included an LCIF luncheon, voting on several constitutional issues and was topped off with an evening banquet featuring our guest speaker, PID Scott Rennells of Arkansas.







Of the five constitutional amendments, all passed except for the proposal to authorize the state athletic committee to expand its activities beyond the Missouri Lions All-Star Football Game to include other sports that would allow for more youth, both male and female, to participate in Lion-sponsored sporting activities. Hopefully those that voted against this proposal can come up with their own methods to introduce the world's greatest service organization to the next generation of potential Lions Club members.

Missouri Lions William C Chandler Youth Camp has started receiving applications and requests for youths from 13 different countries to attend.


