TEACHING AN OLD DOGS LIONS NEW TRICKS



Remember the old days when you had to go to school to learn and improve your skills?

Well, Lions are busy working to learn new skills and refresh their old skills by using the Lions Learning Center.

You, too, can take advantage of these learning opportunities from the comfort of your home. All you have to do is register at the Lions Learning Center and select a course that interests you. A course typically takes 30 to 60 minutes to complete.

How do you find the Lions Learning Center? Just log on to the Lions Clubs International web site (www.lionsclubs.org). From there, you select the **Member Center** and then select **Leadership Development**. You are now at the **Leadership Resource Center**. The Lions Learning Center is one of the options you may select in the center. Of, course, you can also conduct a search for the Lions Leadership Center at the home page. A short video available at the center's home page gives an overview of the registration capabilities; for example, the center will keep a record of courses that you are taking and completed.

Courses are categorized by four key skills: Leadership, Managing Others, Achieving Results and Communication.

Leadership -- Courses focused on a broad range of leadership skills to succeed as a Lion leader (e.g., Introduction to Lions Leadership, Writing your Personal Mission Statement, Creativity, Mentoring)

Managing Others -- Courses geared toward gaining the skills to effectively create and maintain successful and productive relationships with people (e.g., Effective Teams, Team Motivation, Member Motivation, Coaching, Valuing Member Diversity)

Achieving Results -- Courses designed to assist in setting and achieving goals, both personal and professional (e.g., Setting Goals, Decision Making, Managing Meetings, Providing Community Service)

Communication -- Courses that increase interpersonal skills and success in public speaking.

Remember, these skills don't just help you in your Lions work, they are useful in your professional careers and personal life, as well.

Additionally, LCI will make appropriate hotel reservations for each participant on a twin-share basis. Please note that a non-refundable participation fee of \$95.00 is required to offset these costs for all institutes. This fee is due no less than six weeks prior to the institute start date. Participants are responsible for all travel expenses to and from the designated venue, including all relevant ground transportation charges.

The purpose of the Advanced Lions Leadership Institute is to provide Lions leaders with an opportunity to enhance skills in preparation for leadership responsibilities at the zone, region and district levels.

PARTICIPANT QUALIFICATIONS

- Candidates for this institute must be from Constitutional Area I & II - United States of America, its Affiliates, Bermuda & The Bahamas & Canada. This institute will be conducted in English and French. Candidates must be capable of understanding and participating in the language of instruction at this institute.
- Candidates must be Lions that have completed a successful term as club president, but have not yet attained the position of first vice district governor. Lions members who are currently serving as club presidents will be considered on a space-available basis.
- Candidates must be willing to commit to attending all days
 of the institute, including group mealtimes, and understand
 personal time is extremely limited. <u>Attendance at all</u>
 classroom sessions and scheduled meals is mandatory.

COST OF THE INSTITUTE

Lions Clubs International will provide meals and lodging according to the schedule of the institute. Please note that according to board policy, a non-refundable participation fee of US\$95.00 will be required to offset these costs for all institutes. This fee will be due no less than six weeks prior to the institute start date. Please do not send fees until you receive a letter of acceptance to the institute. Participants are also responsible for their own transportation and related travel expenses to and from the institute site.

SELECTION PROCESS

Because of the high number of applications received by the association, acceptance into the institute is <u>not guaranteed</u>. In the selection process the Leadership Division strives to achieve maximum geographical representation of districts throughout the constitutional area. <u>All candidates will be notified of selection status no more than two weeks after the application deadline via the email address provided on the application form.</u>

The Leadership Division of Lions Clubs International reserves the right to cancel any institute or language-specific classroom due to insufficient applications submitted by the stated application submission deadline date.

The division maintains the quality of all aspects of the institute, including program, faculty and the selection process of participants. The division works in concert with the international President and the Leadership Committee of the international Board of Directors.


