Due to the pending health crisis, 11 B2 will be holding a "Limited Virtual District Convention" this year. The procedure set forth herein is in compliance with Legal Memorandum of the Lions Club International Senior Corporate Legal Counsel for conducting an Alternate District Convention. Here is what we will be doing:

1. Voting will be conducted electronically;

2. On or before **Thursday, April 30, 2020 at 5:00 p.m. EST**, the Club President or Secretary shall send to the District Governor a list names and email addresses for those Lions from their Club that will serve as Delegates so they can be registered to cast an electronic vote.

3. Any outstanding dues must be paid on or before **Thursday, April 30, 2020 at 5:00 p.m. EST**;

4. Voting will begin on **Sunday, May 17, 2020 at 8:00 a.m. EST** and will continue until **Sunday, May 24, 2020 at 12:00 p.m. EST**. All ballots must be cast by electronic vote by each qualified delegate by the deadline in order to be valid;

5. Voting will be done through the internet electronic voting service "electionrunner.com".

An instruction sheet for Voting will be provided to the Delegates;

6. This Notice when sent to the Clubs will include copies of the proposed Minutes of the March 22-23, 2019 District Convention, the Treasurer's Fund Balance – Expense/Income Reports, the Proposed Bylaw Amendments, and a copy of the Ballot for approving the reports, amendments and for the election of the District Governor and First Vice District Governor for 2020-2021. All Bylaw Amendments on the Ballot were properly noticed. Copies of this Notice and the supporting documents are being served by email mail to all Club Presidents or Secretaries at the last known email address listed with the District. The District Governor will serve the Clubs with the Notice and prepare a Proof of Service evidencing service. This Notice with Supporting Documents as well as the election results shall be maintained by the Cabinet Secretary as the Minutes of the 2020 District Convention and shall be reported to Lions Clubs International as required. 7. The Nominating/Election Committee which was established in compliance with the District's Bylaws consists of Past District Treasurer Lion Dale Kreitner, the Chairman from the Coloma Lions Club, Past District Governor Barb Penny from the Three Rivers Lions Club and Past District Zone Chair Lion Kenneth Mais from the Edwardsburg Lions Club;

8. The Nominating/Election Committee have verified and certified the following individual Lions as qualified to stand for election to the listed offices: First Vice District Governor Lion Julie Mayuiers of the Three Rivers Lions Club for the Office of District Governor and Second Vice District Governor Karol Chopp of the Mattawan Lions Club for the Office of First Vice District Governor. No Lion submitted a nomination for the Office of Second Vice District Governor. Any qualified Lion desiring to serve as Second Vice District Governor may communicate their interest in serving to First Vice District Governor Lion Julie Mayuiers at jumayuiers@gmail.com;

9. A Credentials Committee is hereby established. The Credentials Committee is made up of Past District Governor Lion Al Vredberg of the Benton Harbor Fairplain Lions Club, Past Council Chair Lion Don Brown from the Paw Paw Lions Club and Council Chair Elect Lion Jeff Mayuiers from the Three Rivers Lions Club. The Credentials Committee has approved the form and content of the ballot. The Credentials Committee shall resolve all questions concerning the form and content of the Official Ballot. The Club Delegate Eligibility List as certified by Lions clubs International will be sent to the Clubs. All Clubs must have any outstanding dues paid by the April 30, 2020 deadline in order to have their delegates vote. The Credentials Committee shall ensure that only those Lions eligible to serve as delegates are certified as Delegates.

10. The votes cast by the Delegates at "electionrunner.com" by the deadline set herein shall be certified by the Nomination/Elections Committee and the results announced to the Clubs as soon as reasonably possible following certification of the election results. 

Dear Lion,

The Board of Directors has voted to cancel the 2020 Lions International Convention due to concerns about the coronavirus (COVID-19). This means that the next International Convention will be held in 2021 in Montreal, Canada.

After evaluating a variety of different options including moving the convention to a different venue or postponing the convention to a later date, the Board of Directors voted to cancel the 2020 convention. This decision was made with the health and safety of our Lions, staff and vendors in mind.

Canceling the International Convention for 2020 impacts international officer continuity and candidate elections. After review of the International Constitution and By-Laws, this impact is outlined below:

- Executive officers and international directors will continue in their respective positions until the 2021 convention in Montreal. All candidate elections for these positions shall comply with the provisions of the International Constitution and By-Laws for election at the convention in Montreal.
- An international director from the areas of Africa and Australia, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Indonesia and the Islands of the South Pacific is permitted only in even-numbered years. As a result, no director from Africa or Australia, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Indonesia and the Islands of the South Pacific would be eligible for election until the 2022 convention.
- Barring any district election complaints, district governors, first vice district governors and second vice district governors elected during a convention of their respective districts will be accepted by Lions International. The International Board of Directors intends to authorize commencement of the DG terms beginning July 1, 2020.

We are disappointed that we will not be able to move forward with this international event, but we are optimistic that with each new day there is hope, and as Lions we will continue to find new ways to put our kindness in action while safely serving our communities.

I want to start-off by wishing you all good health as we all face this challenging time in our lives that we have never faced before. Next, thank you for all that you do every day as Lions. I know your hearts are as big as mine when we speak about Lions and all the great things we do. You are all amazing and I am so happy to be a part of District 11-B2!

I am saddened to learn that our International Convention has been cancelled but I completely understand and agree with LCI. I look forward to what ideas LCI may have or offer to each Constitutional Area as to how to hold the official ribbon pulling for the incoming District Governors.

I know there has been a lot of talk about elections with our District Convention being cancelled but there is one area that I want to address that we cannot cover well enough and that is club elections. These still need to take place in the same timely manner as it has in past years.

Clubs should still be announcing their slate of officers 3 times to the entire club and then voting at the 3rd time announced. I encourage clubs when looking at filling officers to consider members that have not previously held the same office. If you have held an office for more than a couple of years you should be looking at other members in your club and **encouraging** them to run for an office and offer to **mentor** them. This is the only way we will give new Lions the chance to step up.

Elections need to take place before the deadline of May 15th which is when clubs need to report the information to LCI. Even if your officers have remained the same they still need to be reported to LCI. I've included the form for each club to return to me for the Roster Book for 2020 -2021. I also need this information as soon as possible. Every year the District Governor receives calls and emails after the books are printed and distributed that someone's information is incorrect. If the information is not reported then we have no idea that it is incorrect. If I don't receive the information for the Roster Book by May 30th, I have no choice but to list your club without any officers or contact information. If you have any questions on any of this please don't hesitate to contact me.

Here are some guidelines provided by LCI on elections. There is also a software available on electionrunner.com that is fairly simple to use and is either free or very reasonable depending on the number of voters (members) you have.

Club Elections

1.If our club cannot meet, how can we conduct our annual election of club officers?

Unless prohibited under a club's constitution and by-laws, the Standard Club By-Laws permits all Lions clubs to conduct meetings via alternative meeting formats. This allows each Lions club to choose a method of conducting elections that is suitable for those members. This can be via phone, email, a combination of the two, or any other method that is acceptable to all of the Lions club members.

If holding meetings by phone you need to ensure that every member can hear and be heard by other members. All votes during an electronic meetings should be taken by roll call. All members participating electronically will be considered present and in attendance at the meeting.



There are still a few District Offices and Committee Chairs that need filled for next year. We are especially in need for someone to step up for All State Band and Paws With A Cause Chairs.

I have emailed all current chairs/co-chairs and have not heard back from several. If you are a current Committee Chair and would like to continue next year please contact me. Keep in mind that any committee can have just a chair or co-chairs.

Unfortunately, cancellations came in from the Marcellus Schools, the YMCA, and Lions events that we were scheduled to attend.

It takes at least 7 people to go into a school to get the screening down in a timely manner. Thank you, Lions! 


The Edwardsburg Lions Club
