

Meeting safe and the safety of all our Lions members and guests is all of our responsibility. From the State Office to the District Governors all the way down to the club level. To help us all I'd like to provide you with this safety meeting outline. Where ever you might gather these guidelines could save many should the COVID virus come calling. This can be applied to indoor meetings as well as outside meetings. This outline was designed by PID Jenny Ware and I feel it is very well done.

- Outside have simple entry area set up. All Lions are asked to use the front door for a single point of entry.
- Masks are to be worn upon entry where they will sign in and provide a contact number.
- Masks are to be worn upon entry and at all times during the meeting if able. Masks will be provided if needed.
 - a. For those that are not able to wear masks due to medical conditions, you will not be asked about your health. We honor your privacy.
- COVID screenings will be completed at the door. Please fill out the screening with either your own pen or a sanitized pen will be available.
 - a. These forms will be placed into an envelope and sealed for protection of confidentiality. The envelope will be given to the Cabinet Secretary.
- Your temperature will be taken with a Touchless Thermometer. If your temperature is 100.4 or greater, you will be asked to leave the building and contact your doctor's office for further direction.
- 6. Physical distancing of 6 feet will be expected. Seating will be arranged to reflect this standard.
- If food and beverages are being served, contact your local Health Department for guidelines to be followed.

Our State of Michigan Governor has established Regions within our state. The guidelines may differ depending on where you are located. Be sure to research the criteria for your Region, especially right before the event as guidelines can change quickly. For instance here in southwest Michigan, Region 3, we are limited to an indoor meeting of 10 people or less and outdoors of 100 people, with all meetings practicing the things we have outlined and the need to follow social distancing.



2020 Peace Poster Contest Rules and Conditions

Entries not meeting the rules and conditions listed below will be disqualified.

- Only a Lions club can sponsor the contest in a local school(s) or organized, sponsored youth group(s), such as YMCA programs, Boys & Girls Clubs, Scouts, etc.
- 2. Contest is open to students who will be 11, 12, or 13 years of age on November 15, 2020. Eligible birth dates are November 15, 2007 through November 15, 2009.
- 3. The Contest theme this year is "Peace Through Service."
- Artwork must be no smaller than 13 inches by 20 inches and no larger than 20 inches by 24 inches. Do not mat or frame artwork.
- Only one entry per student and each entry must be the work of only one student.
- All artwork must be the individual student's original creation. Duplications are not accepted.
- All media are accepted. Note: Chalk, charcoal and pastel entries should be sealed with a fixative spray to prevent smearing. Do not laminate entries.
- Three-dimensional entries will not be accepted. Nothing may be glued, stapled or attached to the artwork in any way.
- The use of lettering or numbering on the front of the poster, in any language, is not allowed. All artist signatures or initials should be written on the back of the poster.
- Artwork should be done on a flexible material, so it can be rolled for shipping in a mailing tube. Do not fold poster.

Participants accept all responsibility for late, lost, misdirected or illegible entries. Entries sent with insufficient postage will be disqualified. Lions Clubs International is not responsible for entries damaged, destroyed or lost during the judging process. Entries cannot be acknowledged or returned: they become property of Lions Club International upon receipt. Peace Poster Contest images cannot be used without written permission form Lions Clubs International.

In consideration for the opportunity to enter the Peace Poster Contest, participants agree to allow Lions Clubs International to use their names and photographs for promotional and publicity purposes. In addition, the international grand prize winner, two family members (one being a parent or legal guardian) and the club president or club member (as designated by the president) are required to attend the award ceremony at Lions Day with the United Nations in New York, USA. An international grand-prize winner is not eligible to receive subsequent prizes in future Peace Poster contest sponsored by Lions Clubs International. My fellow Lions and Leos,


I want to take this opportunity to talk you all about the subject of Stress. Below is a definition of Stress.

How do we do this?


First, we have to look at ourselves. Are you getting irritable because your normal routine has been upended? Are you frustrated because there are suddenly people in your life 24/7 that were not before?






