BE CLEVER LIKE THE FOX- WE SERVE WITHOUT FEAR

During the last several years, the incidents of attempted fraud through an activity called phishing has increased significantly. In a nut shell, you receive an email from someone you do not know who is pretending to be someone you do know - like a friend, your bank or a Lion. As Lions we are "out there". Our websites list our officers and show our contact information including our email addresses. These unscrupulous idiots then send an email to similar emails that are somehow related. So, masquerading as your Club President, the Club Secretary and Club Treasurer get an email asking them to "purchase gas cards" or "send emergency money to a charity" (really an off shore account). Plain and simple- it is fraud.

We should all be aware of these types of scams by now. Whether it is a Nigerian Millions email or a Notice to Send Money from the IRS email or a Click on this Link email that results in your computer being frozen and a ransom being requested to unlock it, we must be diligent and smart. Recently several clubs have contacted various District Officers about "attempted fraud". There is really nothing we can do. I am a former Prosecuting Attorney and I can tell you this is now the world in which we live. It is a crime, but practically impossible to prosecute.

I would recommend you discuss this issue at your next Lions Club Board Meeting. Perhaps you could agree to use a word or number identifier that your "Lions" can be assured the email sent is from you. Install firewalls and protective software. Change your word or number identifier verbally from time to time just in case a tracking software is running. Use malware scans to detect these nefarious activities. In the end- we can get the job done and serve as good stewards with the assets we raise for our service. When we are clever like the fox, we serve boldly without fear as knowledge is power!


WHY WAS THIS STATEMENT CREATED?

District 11-B-2 Constitution and By-Laws Proposals 2020

I. A PROPOSAL TO AMEND DISTRICT 11-B-2 BY-LAWS, ARTICLE VII, CONVENTION FUND. SECTION 1. CONVENTION FUND TAX AND SECTION 2. REMAINING FUNDS:

Be it resolved, that the District shall amend the District By-Laws, ARTICLE VII, CONVENTION FUND, SECTION 1. CONVENTION FUND TAX., and SECTION 2 REMAINING FUNDS to read as follows (**proposed changes in BOLD**):

ARTICLE VII CONVENTION FUND

Section 1. **CONVENTION FUND TAX.** In lieu of or in addition to a district convention registration fee, an annual district convention fund tax of \$1 may be levied upon each member of each club in the district and shall be collected and paid in advance by each club, except newly chartered and reorganized clubs, in two (2) semiannual payments as follows: \$0.50 per club member on September tenth of each year to cover the semi-annual period July 1 to December 31; and \$0.50 per club member on March tenth of each year to cover the semi-annual period January 1 to June 30, with billings of said tax to be based upon the roster of each club as of the first days of September and March, respectively. Any club which is chartered or reorganized in a current fiscal year shall collect and pay said convention tax for said fiscal year on a pro-rata basis from the first day of the second month following the date of its organization, as the case may be.

This tax shall be collected from the clubs by, and be remitted to, the cabinet secretary or cabinet-treasurer (or secretary-treasurer), who shall deposit the monies so collected in a special account in a bank or other depository chosen by the district governor. The fund so collected shall be used ~~exclusively~~ for defraying expenses of district conventions and shall be expended only by district checks drawn and signed by the cabinet treasurer and countersigned by the district governor.

Section 2. **REMAINING FUNDS.** In any fiscal year, any balance **up to \$9,000** remaining in the convention fund after payment of all convention administrative expenses in that year shall remain in said convention fund and become available for future convention expenses and be treated as income in any fiscal year in which expended or otherwise budgeted for payment of such expenses. **Any remaining balance above the mandatory minimum reserve of \$9,000 held exclusively for future convention expenses may be expended by the District for any District Administrative Expense or Project.**

Section 3. **FEE COLLECTION.** Such fee as the district governor shall set may be collected, under procedures set by the district governor, from each delegate, alternate, and guest attending the district convention to defray the actual cost of convention meals and entertainment.

Cabinet Recommendation: Yes

I. A PROPOSAL TO AMEND DISTRICT 11-B-2 BY-LAWS, ARTICLE VIII, DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION FUND, SECTION 1. DISTRICT REVENUE, SECTION 3. DISTRICT GOVERNOR'S SPECIAL FUND, AND SECTION 7. REMAINING FUNDS:

Be it resolved, that the District shall amend the District By-Laws, ARTICLE VIII, DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION FUND, SECTIONS 1., 3., and 7. to read as follows
(proposed changes in BOLD):

**ARTICLE VIII
District Administration Fund**

Section 1. **DISTRICT REVENUE.** To provide revenue for approved district projects and to defray the administrative expenses of the district, an annual district administrative fund tax of \$7.50 is hereby levied upon each member of each club in the district and shall be collected and paid in advance by each club in two (2) semi-annual payments as follows: \$3.75 per club member on September tenth of each year to cover the semi-annual period July 1 to December 31; and \$3.75 per club member on March tenth of each year, to cover the semi-annual period January 1 to June 30, with billings of the same to be based upon the roster of each club as of the first days of July and January, respectively. Said tax shall be paid to the cabinet secretary or cabinet treasurer (or secretary-treasurer) by each club in the district, except newly chartered and reorganized clubs, which shall collect and pay said tax on a pro-rata basis from the first day of the second month following the date of their organization or reorganization, as the case may be. Said tax shall be disbursed only for **approved district projects and** administrative expenses of the district and only upon approval by the district governor's cabinet. Disbursement therefrom shall be by checks drawn and signed by the cabinet treasurer and countersigned by the district governor.

Section. 1a ***

Section 3. **DISTRICT GOVERNOR'S SPECIAL FUND.** Reasonable expenses of the District Governor attending the International Convention shall be a District Administrative expense and shall be limited to the amount provided by Lions International to the District Governors Elect for

their attendance at the International Convention as stipulated in the Rules of Audit of Lions International. Receipts shall be required for verification. One Dollar and Fifty Cents (\$1.50) or more per member from each club in the District shall be set aside each year from the per Capita Dues. ~~Funds so designated shall not be used for any other purpose.~~

In any fiscal year, if there is any remaining balance above the mandatory minimum reserve of \$6,000 held exclusively for future District Governor International Convention expenses may be expended by the District for any District Administrative Expense or Project.

Section 7. **REMAINING FUNDS.** In any fiscal year, any balance remaining in the district administrative fund after payment of all district administrative expenses in that year shall remain in said district administrative fund and become available for future **approved district projects and** district administrative expenses and be treated as income in any fiscal year in which expended or otherwise budgeted for payment of such expenses.

Dear Michigan Lion:

On June 28, 2018, Governor Rick Snyder signed Public Act 255, creating a Lions of Michigan Foundation Fund within the Michigan Department of Treasury to assist our foundation in collecting donations to help improve the quality of life of people in our state with unmet needs. Public Act 255 of 2018 added our Lions of Michigan Foundation to the list of only nine Michigan charities eligible to receive donations directly from Michigan tax payers when they file their annual state income tax return.

We would appreciate any help you can provide to ensure that we cannot be removed from the list of eligible charities, as each charity is required to collect \$50,000 in donations annually through this program to guarantee eligibility for the following year. A donation of \$5 or \$10 to our foundation from each Michigan Lions member or a family member or friend on their Michigan Voluntary Contribution Schedule (MI Form 4642) would ensure that we cannot be removed from the list.

Since 1984, our Lions of Michigan Foundation has operated programs that address serious human needs in our state by working in partnership with our Michigan Lions, Lioness and Leo Clubs and other community service organizations and charities to provide disadvantaged Michigan families with access to affordable medical care and services aimed at helping people achieve academic and social success, gain and retain employment and maintain independence. We support our member clubs and their communities to help make them stronger.

We provide funding for equipment, supplies and program expenses for Project KidSight and the resources necessary for our Michigan Lions, Lioness and Leos to help children suffering from vision loss. Through our Emergency Individual Assistance Program, we help military families and veterans who have emergency needs, and we help people who suffer from severe vision and hearing disorders that can only be corrected through surgical intervention or costly medical procedures. Through our Lions Affordable Hearing Aid Program, we help low-income people with hearing loss maintain self-sufficiency through the provision of affordable hearing aids and audiology services. And, we help people and families affected by natural disasters, including severe storms, flooding, fires and tomados through our Emergency Disaster Relief Program.

We greatly appreciate any support that you and your family members and friends can provide to assist us in raising the \$50,000 required to remain as one of the charities eligible to receive donations through state income tax return filings. With your help, we can continue to play a significant role in solving the social, economic and health care issues facing our state.

Instructions for Form 4642, Voluntary Contributions Schedule

Michigan taxpayers can contribute \$5, \$10, or more to any of the following funds on the *Voluntary Contributions Schedule* (Form 4642). Contributions to these funds will increase your tax liability or reduce your refund.

American Red Cross Michigan Fund

The American Red Cross is always there for you and your community, helping to alleviate suffering caused by disasters big and small. The Red Cross shelters, and provides emotional support to Michigan residents and beyond; supplies about 40 percent of the nation's blood; teaches skills that save lives; provides international humanitarian aid; and supports military members and their families. By mobilizing the power of volunteers and the generosity of donors, the Red Cross responds to more than 60,000 disasters annually. In Michigan, last year more than 6,000 volunteers logged more than 200,000 hours assisting others. On average 91 cents of every dollar the Red Cross spends is invested in humanitarian services.

Animal Welfare Fund

The outside world can be a harsh, scary place for homeless pets. And throughout Michigan, small towns and big cities alike struggle to find the resources they need to provide medical care to the animals they rescue. Through the Animal Welfare Fund, the Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (MDARD) offers grants to Michigan's registered animal shelters to help support spaying and neutering programs for shelter dogs and cats up for adoption. Grants also help support many anti-cruelty and proper care programs around the state. Shelters also use grant monies from your generous donations to help care for animals that are seized as part of animal cruelty cases.

Children's Trust Fund - Prevent Child Abuse Michigan

The Children's Trust Fund (CTF) supports services throughout Michigan to prevent child abuse and neglect. CTF funds home visitation services; respite care; services for families with incarcerated family members; and parenting education and support. CTF supports a statewide network of local Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention Councils. Examples of local Council work are teaching professionals about mandated reporting; teaching parents and caregivers about infant head trauma prevention and infant safe sleep practices; and establishing baby pantries to provide diapers, formula, and clothing. In the coming year, CTF and its local Councils will lead statewide efforts to build local responses to the opioid crisis.

Fostering Futures Scholarship Trust Fund

Fostering Futures Scholarship provides scholarships to young adults who have experienced foster care to help them achieve a college education. Approximately 13,500 students are in the Michigan foster care system and many students do not have family support after they age out of the system. Nationally, about 75 percent of students express a desire to attend college, less than 10 percent enroll in college and less than three percent graduate college. Scholarships are awarded via an application process and paid directly to the students' college or university to assist with tuition, fees, room, board, books and supplies. Dr. Robert Mathog dedicated much of his life to treating hearing loss and identifying affordable treatment options for Michigan residents. Until his death in 2014, he served as Professor and Chair of the Department of Otolaryngology at Wayne State University and as President and Chair of our Lions Hearing Centers. Dr. Mathog was a staunch supporter and a champion of our cause, and he recognized that fund development and the building of strong partnerships was necessary for long-term success.

Hearing loss is an extremely common, yet complex debilitation. Studies show that people with untreated hearing loss are much more likely to suffer from depression, anxiety and unemployment, and they are less likely to participate in social activities. Most Americans will experience problems with hearing at some point in their life, and for many financially stressed Michigan residents, our Lions Hearing Centers will be their only option for treatment.

Lions of Michigan Foundation Dr. Robert Mathog Lions Hearing Centers 2021 Hearing Care Calendar



Lions Clubs are well known throughout the world for the services we provide to help people with hearing and vision loss. Nearly a century ago, Helen Keller challenged Lions Clubs to be "Knights of the Blind," and she declared that "the problems of deafness are deeper and more complex, if not more important, than those of blindness. Deafness is a much worse misfortune, for it means the loss of the most vital stimulus — the sound of the voice that brings language, sets thoughts astir and keeps us in the intellectual company of man."

Our new Hearing Care Calendar Raffle was developed to create awareness for the treatment of hearing loss and to provide funding for our Michigan Lions Affordable Hearing Aid and Hearing Screening Programs, which offer affordable hearing care options for Michigan residents. The calendars will cost \$20 each, and calendar purchasers will be entered into a bi-weekly raffle drawing with cash prizes totaling \$6,150.

WE ARE LIONS

LIONS FIGHT VISION LOSS

The Lions Clubs of Michigan began providing free vision screenings for children in 2003. With the help of our KidSight partners and sponsors, we are improving the lives of children, and we are preventing vision loss one child at a time.

Through Project KidSight, we identify preventable and treatable causes of vision loss in children. If diagnosed early, 95% of vision disorders can be corrected with eyeglasses, contact lenses or patching.

The hi-tech Spot VS-100 and PlusOptix S12 mobile vision screeners that we use for our Michigan KidSight Program identify causes of vision loss such as nearsightedness, farsightedness, anisometropia (unequal refraction power), astigmatism, anisocoria (unequal pupil size) and strabismus (gaze deviations) through non-invasive testing. The mobile vision screener performs a binocular test of both eyes within 1 second, and it accurately (98% accuracy rating) identifies potential vision problems. When problems are detected, the vision screener creates a detailed measurement report for the child's parent or guardian so that they can obtain follow-up care from an optometrist or ophthalmologist.



LIONS FIGHT DIABETES

Diabetes is a primary focus of Lions Clubs around the world. We educate communities about diabetes and diabetic risk factors, and we establish initiatives and operate programs to improve the lives of those living with diabetes and to help reduce the prevalence of the disease.

In partnership with the International Diabetes Federation (IDF), we are on a mission to annually screen, at least, 1 million people for type 2 diabetes. By serving in diverse communities all over the world, we can see and feel the societal effects of diabetes, and we care enough to do something about it.



Diabetes is currently the seventh leading cause of death in the United States, and 1 in 3 U.S. adults have prediabetes, which means their blood sugar is higher than normal, but not high enough to be considered type 2 diabetes. Without intervention, many people with prediabetes will develop type 2 diabetes within 5 years, which puts them at risk of serious health problems, including:

- Heart attack
- Stroke
- Blindness
- Kidney failure
- Loss of toes, feet or legs

Since July 1st, 2019 the KidSight Team has been busy out there promoting the SPOT camera, what it does to detect abnormalities, it's free, quick, and gives instant results and it has paid off. More and more schools are inviting us in to offer our "free" vision screening to their students.

Since July 1st we have screened 4,658 kids with 4,295 passing and 413 as referrals. We still have one more school here in January to do but because of timing of the Beacon the total screened for this month is not in this total. We are so very proud to announce that Project KidSight for District 11B2 is now 32,421 kids screened since 2006. We are making a difference to children. We are being pro-active in making sure every child can see well. What surprises us is going into a school and seeing now, more and more kids are wearing glasses. Many are because we have been in their community or their school before and our SPOT camera detected a problem with their eyes. It's our passion to continue supporting communities with this project and to screen children at Health Fairs, community events, Lion events, and schools. We are always looking for new members to join our team and help make a difference in a child's life. Contact us if you wish to be a part of a great team! We are flexible with dates you can help!

We appreciate the help from Fellow Lions Bill Gingas, John Stassek, Gerj Frobe & Robert Fergeson (not pictured). They came to help at the Bloomingdale Elementary School and the Gobles Elementary School. Thank goodness they came as we screened well over 300 kids at each of these schools!



We are still working on getting more members to volunteer and to complete the Lions of Michigan Foundation Volunteer Application and Background Check Authorization Form. Once this is done the member will receive a lanyard with a badge that lets the schools know that the Lions of MI have provided the school with a background check for each Lion Member.

It's a simple process and the schools will appreciate that our Lions are providing this for the school's safety.








Portage Lions Club


