
We had a small group of people, but we were able to get 109 Valentine's kit for the kids at Bronson Children's Hospital.





### Dear Lion Leader,

The coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic continues to impact the work of Lions and communities around the world, creating challenges for our clubs and the people we care for. Throughout this global crisis, Lions have continued to safely serve because the needs have been so great.

To help ensure that clubs are able to meet the growing needs in our communities, the International Board of Directors passed another resolution to make it easier to invite new members to serve with us.

Here is an overview of the new resolution approved by the Board of Directors:

 Charter and entrance fees waiver – We have waived all charter and entrance fees from January 1 through June 30, 2022.
 Charter and entrance fees are also currently waived through December 31, 2021.

Please note that clubs should pay any outstanding balances right away to stay in good standing and avoid being placed on financial suspension on November 15.

This does not include international and club dues



### Dues Adjustment Resolution Will Be Voted on at 2022 International Convention

### Dear Lion Leader,

Lions Clubs International supports clubs and members around the world so we can advance our global mission of service together. Our international support and the work of Lions Clubs International is fueled by the international dues of our incredible members.

In recent years, it has become increasingly clear that the services Lions Clubs International has been able to provide to members with the available budget is no longer in line with what Lions need and expect.

The International Board of Directors voted in October 2019 to approve an international dues adjustment resolution that would be voted on at the 2020 International Convention, but it was postponed due to the cancellation of our 2020 convention and the move to a virtual convention in 2021 as we adapted to the pandemic. The new dues adjustment model will be voted on at the 2022 International Convention.

The Board of Directors undertook an extensive review of Lions Clubs International's financials, including the implementation of substantial budget reductions. After much consideration, the board proposed to adjust dues \$7 over a three-year period.

Under the proposal, international dues would be adjusted according to the following schedule:

- \$3 increase on July 1, 2023
- \$2 increase on July 1, 2024
- \$2 increase on July 1, 2025

### Why an international dues adjustment is needed

We realize the association has been reluctant to adjust dues over the years, and we have not adjusted international dues since 2011. The proposed adjustment will help cover our costs and allow us to suitably serve our members' needs. With that said, the Board of Directors did not take this issue lightly, nor are we minimizing the value of each dollar that our members contribute.

As we consider this dues adjustment, it is essential that we keep in mind that our global efforts and initiatives support more than 1.4 million members in 50,000 clubs around the world. Through the support of staff, we are able to serve globally on the level that we do, keeping members and clubs fully supported with service resources, training events and software, club operational support, hybrid convention, international meetings, language services, technology, Foundation support, leadership support, and everything else we have come to expect as Lions.

A dues adjustment will allow Lions Clubs International to provide improved support to Lions and to continue to invest in improving programs and digital products such as our website and MyLion. It will also allow us to invest in new programs such as the Learning Management System (LMS), development of new curriculum such as digital literacy, training videos, global advertising, marketing automation, digital and video storytelling and other tools and initiatives that will enhance our impact, our brand, and our membership.

### Why your help is needed

Essentially, we have to decide whether or not we want Lions Clubs International to continue to grow and thrive. Lions is more than a way of life. It's also an investment of money, time, energy and passion. As with any good investment, the more we put in, the more returns we see.

We need you to help our members and leaders understand why this adjustment is needed. We have developed an <u>international dues</u> <u>adjustment FAQ and PPT</u> to help you present it to your Lions. If you have any questions on the dues adjustment resolution, please contact LCI Executive Administrator Sanjeev Ahuja.

I hope that you will see this adjustment as we do: as an investment in the future of Lions. Through your support, we can ensure that Lions are positioned for success in the future.



People will be more inclined to monitor the mint displays for you, and it is a great way to recruit new members for your Lons Club.

After that time, I don't know when I will be back at the State Office or if our inventory will hold out very long.

As many of us know we as Lions have many important projects we step up and volunteer for. They are all important every single one of them, however his project is so important and affects so many children and families on our community we must have your help.

In 1925 as many of you know, Helen Keller challenged us as Lions to become "Knights of the Blind". Prior to that time our organization was searching for a meaningful purpose. Upon receiving that challenge, Lions Clubs International became known for helping and assisting those with visual needs.

Here in 11B2 we introduced a very special program that involved screening young children for visionary issues. The program was started by our very own Lion Bill Kowalski and soon Lion Pat McFarland joined Bill. Back then these two began working with schools, churches, and community events doing anything they could to screen the younger children of our district. As we stand today, Lion Bill Kowalski has now since passed and Lion Pat McFarland has been troubled with many health issues and has been forced to mainly just be a consultant. This program itself has grown larger than ever expected. It was turned over to the Lions of Michigan Service Foundation and now provides screenings to the entire State of Michigan.

For many years we have been blessed to have Lions Dave and Tanda Stiffler dedicate themselves to the KidSight program. They store the KidSight trailer, maintain the equipment, run the appointment calendar, and attend a majority of the events. But as with everything, we all age and it comes to a time our priorities have to be evaluated. That being said, Dave and Tanda have put in their notice asking to step back. I know this was not an easy decision for them at all. As the KidSight Chairman for the State of Michigan, and it just so happens I am from District 11B2, I am asking this district for help. We need volunteers most desperately. We need a Project Coordinator as well. What I propose we do is to get a list of all those people interested in becoming screeners and helping with this project. Once we have that list, we will coordinate a meeting of everyone on the list. We will invite Dave and Tanda to help facilitate this meeting and answer all your questions, train those that are willing to step up and hopefully make the transition for a new program Coordinator as well. Please, think about this program, our communities, and our kids as this is not a program we can afford to lose.

Tina is working on identifying items to be collected for the Bags of Love designated for Bethany. Please contact the Portage Lions if interested in making donations.


