- •**Elections** Executive officer and international director elections will be conducted electronically, and voting procedures will be forthcoming.

Dear Lion Leader,

The coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic is continuing to impact the work of Lions around the world. As you know, it has also created financial hardships for our Lions and the people for whom we care.

To support the incredible men and women serving with us, the International Board of Directors unanimously passed another resolution to help our clubs.

Here is an overview of the new resolution approved by the Board of Directors:

- •Charter and entrance fees waiver We have waived all charter and entrance fees from January 1 through June 30, 2021.
- •Flexible payments No clubs in good standing on December 31, 2020 will be suspended or canceled through June 30, 2021 for late payment of dues. Full payment is required to be received before June 30, 2021 to avoid suspension or cancellation.
 - Please note that clubs placed on financial suspension on December 31, 2020 will remain on suspension until the full balance is paid. Those clubs will still need to address their outstanding dues or make arrangements for repayment with the Accounts Receivable Department at Lions Clubs International to avoid cancellation scheduled for March 1, 2021.

These additional measures will help Lions facing financial hardships and give our clubs the support and encouragement they need during these challenging times. For more than a century, Lions have taken on the greatest challenges facing humanity, and together, we will overcome this.

The world needs Lions now more than ever, so thank you for your outstanding service and commitment to our communities and the world.

We are passionate about each one of our over 1.4 million members and understand that each one of those members touches on average the lives of 50 individuals each year.

Defense Against Diabetes

Here's an update on where we stand with our monies from our D.A.D grant. As we started with the grant, we had a total of \$22726 made up from \$5681 donated from 11B2 then LCIF granted us \$17045 for a total of \$22726.

We invested 25% and received the remaining 75% from LCIF. We were able to get a grant approved for Bronson's Pediatric Diabetes program for \$10521.40.

At this point in the program, we have \$11917.65 remaining to be used. We have submitted a proposal for a grant of \$12,000 for Type II diabetes training. We are awaiting a response from LCIF on the request. We know we are asking for a little more than we have left in the grant program. Our hope would be we could figure out how to make up the difference.

Tax time is coming.....

Dear Michigan Lion:

On June 28, 2018, Governor Rick Snyder signed Public Act 255, creating a Lions of Michigan Foundation Fund within the Michigan Department of Treasury to assist our foundation in collecting donations to help improve the quality of life of people in our state with unmet needs. Public Act 255 of 2018 added our Lions of Michigan Foundation to the list of only nine Michigan charities eligible to receive donations directly from Michigan tax payers when they file their annual state income tax return.

As each qualified charity is required to collect \$50,000 in donations annually through this special program to guarantee eligibility for the future, we are asking for any help that you can provide to ensure that we remain eligible. Just a donation of \$5 to \$10 to our foundation from each Michigan Lions member or a family member or friend on the Michigan Voluntary Contribution Schedule (MI Form 4642) would ensure that we cannot be removed from the list of qualified charities.

Since 1984, our Lions of Michigan Foundation has operated programs that address serious human needs in our state. By working in partnership with our Michigan Lions Clubs and other community service organizations and charities, we provide disadvantaged Michigan families with access to affordable eye care, hearing aids and services aimed at helping people succeed academically and socially, gain and retain employment, maintain independence and prosper in life. We support our member Lions Clubs and their communities to help make them stronger and more viable.

American Red Cross Michigan Fund

The American Red Cross is always there for you and your community, helping to alleviate suffering caused by disasters big and small. The Red Cross shelters, and provides emotional support to Michigan residents and beyond; supplies about 40 percent of the nation's blood; teaches skills that save lives; provides international humanitarian aid; and supports military members and their families. By mobilizing the power of volunteers and the generosity of donors, the Red Cross responds to more than 60,000 disasters annually. In Michigan, last year more than 6,000 volunteers logged more than 200,000 hours assisting others. On average 91 cents of every dollar the Red Cross spends is invested in humanitarian services.

Animal Welfare Fund

The outside world can be a harsh, scary place for homeless pets. And throughout Michigan, small towns and big cities alike struggle to find the resources they need to provide medical care to the animals they rescue. Through the Animal Welfare Fund, the Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (MDARD) offers grants to Michigan's registered animal shelters to help support spaying and neutering programs for shelter dogs and cats up for adoption. Grants also help support many anti-cruelty and proper care programs around the state. Shelters also use grant monies from your generous donations to help care for animals that are seized as part of animal cruelty cases.

Children's Trust Fund - Prevent Child Abuse Michigan

The Children's Trust Fund (CTF) supports services throughout Michigan to prevent child abuse and neglect. CTF funds home visitation services; respite care; services for families with incarcerated family members; and parenting education and support. CTF supports a statewide network of local Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention Councils. Examples of local Council work are teaching professionals about mandated reporting; teaching parents and caregivers about infant head trauma prevention and infant safe sleep practices; and establishing baby pantries to provide diapers, formula, and clothing. In the coming year, CTF and its local Councils will lead statewide efforts to build local responses to the opioid crisis.

Fostering Futures Scholarship Trust Fund

Fostering Futures Scholarship provides scholarships to young adults who have experienced foster care to help them achieve a college education. Approximately 13,500 students are in the Michigan foster care system and many students do not have family support after they age out of the system. Nationally, about 75 percent of students express a desire to attend college, less than 10 percent enroll in college and less than three percent graduate college. Scholarships are awarded via an application process and paid directly to the students' college or university to assist with tuition, fees, room, board, books and supplies. Large-scale project earns Michael Hartman Eagle Scout status

Hartman achieves Eagle Scout status

PAW PAW - A Paw Paw Boy Scout has earned his Eagle Scout status and helped the Paw Paw Lions Club at the same time.

Michael Hartman, a member of Boy Scouts Troop 169, came up with the idea for an electronic monument sign for the Lions Club in June 2019.

"I felt that the Paw Paw Lions Club needed a better way to advertise the charitable works it sponsors," said Hartman, who envisioned a 10-by-12-foot brick and electronic sign display.

He planned to raise funds for the project through a spaghetti benefit, a tiered donor package and by sell-

When his Eagle project paperwork was signed in December 2019, the

businesses, individuals, Lions Club members, friends, community leaders and other service organizations.

"I soon found out what a charitable community I have been blessed to live in," Hartman said.

However, when the COVID-19 pandemic hit, he was forced to cancel the benefit dinner and find other funding.

Ground was broken on the project in June, with a footing poured in July. Next, trenches for the electrical wiring needed to be dug.

"I had four Scouts helping in 98 degree weather. My brother, Matthew, a Life rank Scout, was working two days after his wisdom teeth were removed. We worked for eight hours digging in an old road bed. ...

project was underway. He met with Next, the blocks were laid. Then, it spent more than a week on the sign. was time for the brick," Hartman

> But then, he learned his bricklayer could no longer donate the labor. So he and his mother drove to homes of people they were told were bricklayers. They were eventually led to James Brylowski, a representative for Bricklayers & Allied Craftworkers Local 2 Michigan, who said the union does several service projects

"I was stunned," Hartman said. "That one act of kindness saved me thousands of dollars and kept my project moving forward."

In October, Howard Hipes, bricklayer instructor, and Zack Overton, a bricklayer's apprentice, completed the brickwork. They gram.

The electronic portion of the sign was installed at the end of October. Ground was leveled, top soil brought in, and grass seed and straw laid after Thanksgiving.

Hartman said at one point in the project, he had eight Scouts from Troop 169 working. One Scout, Tommy Coles, and Hartman's brother, Matthew, were there every time he needed help.

Hartman's project included 1,500 service hours. He said, by comparison, most Eagle projects average 150 service hours. Hartman was told the electronic sign accounted for half of the donations received by the Paw Paw Lions Club for its Community Christmas Baskets pro-


