Camp Leo the Lion

Camp Leo the Lion is a one-week residential summer camp experience for youngsters with disabilities of Southwestern Michigan. It provides a camping experience that would be hoped any child would get out of a camping experience. The camp began approximately twenty years ago by the Berrien County Intermediate School District (BCISD) and was funded by the State of Michigan. It essentially served the purpose of providing orientation and mobility experiences for the visually impaired.

In the early 1980's, state funding of the camp was halted due to the poor financial climate in Michigan and Camp Leo was in danger of closing. The Lion's and Lioness' Clubs of Southwestern Michigan stepped in, and along with donations from other sources, raised the necessary funds to keep the camp in operation. The BCISD continues to staff and set the structure of Camp Leo with funding provided through the Lion's Clubs.



Over the years, the camp has expanded to serve children with different disabilities such as physical or mental impairments.

The goal of Camp Leo

the Lion is to provide youngsters with disabilities a camping experience that facilitates; self-discovery, an understanding and appreciation of nature, and the opportunity to learn and socialize with their peers.



It is the basic tenant of Camp Leo that regardless of one's personal limitations, everyone is valuable, having unique skills and qualities which contribute to society as

a whole. The focus is more on the child's

abilities rather than disabilities.

It is the desire of Camp Leo to see each camper:

 establish and foster friendships in the context of a supportive/enjoyable environment;

 grow to a deeper understanding and appreciation of self through the experience of camping;

foster independence in self-help skills;

 increase self-confidence in relation to personal limitations;

 have an opportunity for physical, emotional and personal expression in the unique backdrop of camping; and

 demonstrate appropriate and supportive relationship skills through various camp activities.

The week begins late Sunday afternoon when the campers are greeted by an enthusiastic



staff. After a quick supper, there is a swim assessment in the lake followed by an activity such as a hay ride and then bedtime.

Wake up call comes at 8:00 with breakfast in the dinning room. Each day opens with the fiag raising ceremony. Activities for the day vary and may include: hiking, swimming, fishing, arts and crafts, ropes course, campfire events, softball, soccer, kick ball, earth ball, volleyball, boating, etc. Lights out at 10:45.

The highlight of the week is when the Lions and Lioness' have a carnival at the camp. The club members arrive about 5:30/6:00 for



a cookout that is followed by games, prizes, and good fun for all. The camp if for children with disabilities ages 7 to 17. It is usually held the third week in June of each year. It is housed at Camp



t is housed at Camp Rosenthal on Black Lake Road on M-140 between Eau Claire and Watervliet.

The camp is approved for a maximum of 45

campers with a camper to staff ratio of 3 to 1. A one time the average cost per camper was \$150.00 per camper, but in the last few years the average cost has grown to \$365.00 per camper which is off-set by a \$50.00 registration fee.

Camp Lee is unique in the relationships that are built between the Club members and the



campers. It is rare that the benefactors take such an active role in the camping experience. Just as many of our campers and staff return year

after year, so do the club members. Eternal youth is demonstrated by the smile and pure joy of the interaction between Club members and individual campere.

Special gratitude is expressed to the Lion's Clubs of Southwest Michigan for their sustaining vision to this unique camping experience.




