•Pay the toll for the car behind you, or the fare for the person behind you on public transit

•Put coins in someone's parking meter

•Write a coworker a recommendation on their LinkedIn account

•Offer to child-sit or dog-walk for a busy friend or neighbor

•Observe a family or couple taking selfies at an event? Offer to take the pic for them.

•Leave unused grocery coupons at the checkout for someone else to use

•Leave a finished book on an airport or waiting room chair for the next person to read

•Received great customer service from someone? Pass on positive feedback to their supervisor

•Direct someone to your vacating parking space as you are leaving

•See someone struggling with groceries? Offer to help load them in their car.

•Purposely leave change in the laundromat or snack machines

•Offer to clear snow from your neighbor's walkway or rake their leaves

•Take your neighbor's newspaper from their driveway and leave it at their door

•Let someone get in front of you in line

•Entertain the rambunctious toddler in the seat next to you on a flight

•If your flight is overbooked, agree to take the next one to help someone out (plus you may get your own flight free!)

•Let someone in line in front of you; on public transit, give your seat to someone standing

•Pick up the tab for the next car in line at a coffee or restaurant drive-through

•Offer to walk your neighbor's dog or rake their leaves

•Give someone a sincere compliment—including a store clerk, server, delivery person, service agent – and consider sending a note complimenting them to their supervisor

•Send a note to your fire department or nurses at your local hospital thanking them for their service

•Offer to take a project off an overloaded coworker's hands

•If applicable, ask your grocery store if they can donate your free turkey to a local charitable organization or family in need

•Donate blood to the Red Cross, canned goods to a food pantry, blankets to an animal shelter, etc.

•Volunteer to read to children or help with schoolwork virtually (check with your local library or school district)

## Notice of Rescheduled 2021 District Convention

Dear Lions of 11B2:

Due to the pending health crisis, 11 B2 will be holding a "Limited Virtual District Convention" this year. The procedure set forth herein is in compliance with Legal Memorandum of the Lions Club International Senior Corporate Legal Counsel for conducting an Alternate District Convention. Here is what we will be doing:

1. Voting will be conducted electronically;

2. On or before Thursday, **April 10, 2021** at 5:00 p.m. EST, the Club President or Secretary shall send to the District Governor a list names and email addresses for those Lions from their Club that will serve as Delegates so they can be registered to cast an electronic vote. *Delegates must be a member for a year and a day (366 days) from the first day of elections (April 24) in order to vote.;* 

3. Any **outstanding dues** must be paid on or before Thursday, **April 15, 2021** at 5:00 p.m. EST in order to participate in elections;

4. Voting will begin on Saturday, **April 24 at 8:00 a.m. EST and will continue until Sunday, April 25, 2021 at 5:00 p.m. EST**. All ballots must be cast by electronic vote by each qualified delegate by the deadline in order to be valid;

5. Voting will be done through the internet electronic voting service "electionrunner.com". An instruction sheet for voting will be provided to the Delegates before April 22nd;

6. This Notice when sent to the Clubs after **April 10th**, will include copies of the Minutes of the Treasurer's Fund Balance – Expense/Income Reports from 2020 - 2021, and a copy of the Ballot for approving the reports, elections of the District Governor, First Vice District Governor, and Second Vice District Governor for 2021-2022, and LMSF Trustee for 2021-2023. Copies of this Notice and the supporting documents will be served by email to all Club Presidents and/or Secretaries at the last known email address listed with the District. The District Governor will serve the Clubs with the Notice and prepare a Proof of Service evidencing service. This Notice with Supporting Documents as well as the election results shall be maintained by the Cabinet Secretary as the Minutes of the 2021 District Convention and shall be reported to Lions Clubs International as required.

7. The Nominating/Election Committee which was established in compliance with the District's Bylaws consists of President Lion Jenny Koski from the Centreville Lions Club, Past District Governor Lion Al Vredberg from the Benton Harbor Fairplain Lions Club, and District Zone Chair Lion Kenneth Mais from the Edwardsburg Lions Club;

8. A Credentials Committee is hereby established. The Credentials Committee is made up of Past District Governor Lion Barb Penny from the Three Rivers Lions Club, Past District Governor Nancy Dings from the Covert Lions Club, and Past District Governor Donna Romanak from the Bangor Lions Club. The Credentials Committee shall resolve all questions concerning the form and content of the Official Ballot. The Club Delegate Eligibility List as certified by Lions clubs International will be sent to the Clubs. All Clubs must have any outstanding dues paid by the April 15, 2021 deadline in order to have their delegates vote. The Credentials Committee shall ensure that only those Lions eligible to serve as delegates are certified as Delegates.

9. The votes cast by the Delegates at "electionrunner.com" by the deadline set herein shall be certified by the Nomination/Elections Committee and the results announced to the Clubs as soon as reasonably possible following certification of the election results. The candidates standing for office have waived the requirement to have a candidate appointed observer.

Due to the continuing concerns about the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, the board of directors voted to transition the 2021 Montreal Lions Clubs International Convention to a virtual event that will be delivered totally online. This decision was made with the health and safety of our Lions, staff and vendors in mind as limiting international travel and large gatherings is key to global containment strategies.

Although we are disappointed that we won't be able to host this event in person, we are excited about hosting our first virtual international convention that can safely connect Lions from around the world. We are still finalizing the details of your new convention experience, and will share those with you as soon as they are ready.

Here are some important details about the 2021 virtual convention we'd like to share with you:

•Everyone's invited – Our 2021 convention will be a virtual event that's open to all Lions and Leos around the world.

•**Registration fees** – The registration fee will be US\$50 until March 31, then US\$75 beginning April 1. The registration fee for Leos will be US\$30 regardless of date. Convention is currently scheduled for June 25-29. Additional event and registration details will be provided soon.

•Current registrants – Lions who are currently registered for convention will receive an email soon with more information about their registration options.

•Elections – Executive officer and international director elections will be conducted electronically, and voting procedures will be forthcoming.

•Convention updates – Check our convention website LCICon for convention updates and details as they become available.

This global health pandemic has forced us all to make decisions and changes that place health and safety first. However, we are optimistic that with each new day there is hope, and as Lions, we continue to find new ways to stay connected, safely serve our communities and continue our global mission of service.

#### Dear Lion Leader,

The coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic is continuing to impact the work of Lions around the world. As you know, it has also created financial hardships for our Lions and the people for whom we care.

#### Here is an overview of the new resolution approved by the Board of Directors:

• **Please note** that clubs placed on financial suspension on December 31, 2020 will remain on suspension until the full balance is paid. Those clubs will still need to address their outstanding dues or make arrangements for repayment with the Accounts Receivable Department at Lions Clubs International to avoid cancellation scheduled for March 1, 2021.

These additional measures will help Lions facing financial hardships and give our clubs the support and encouragement they need during these challenging times. For more than a century, Lions have taken on the greatest challenges facing humanity, and together, we will overcome this.

The world needs Lions now more than ever, so thank you for your outstanding service and commitment to our communities and the world.

**Today's program** was brought to us by Lion Dave Schaffer. Lion Dave introduced Megan Yore from Spectrum Health Lakeland. Megan is the Chief Marketing and Communications Officer at Spectrum Health Lakeland (Lakeland). Lakeland has over 56 locations in SW Michigan including 3 hospitals, 4400 associates, 600 physicians, 600 volunteers and 63 resident physicians. The hospital has earned a top 100 Hospital award from IBM Watson. You can get a lot of additional information at spectrumhealthlakeland.org. Megan updated us the current COVID-19 cases at Lakeland and the trend is going down. Lakeland has a dashboard on their website showing much more detail the pandemic. You can also get additional information the Berrien County Health Department. The current positivity rate is 6% and the goal is to be less than 5% positive. Lakeland has been able to keep surgery and outpatient services open during the pandemic. Currently focused on getting the vaccine out to the citizens in the county. They focused first on their staff and they are now accepting Community members age 65 or greater. Next focus group will be teachers. Last March Lakeland opened the new pavilion. This gave them a new ICU unit, Surgery Unit and the new Hanson Heart Unit. During this period the hospital had 2 ICU units which was a benefit during the pandemic. They are now working on Phase II of the project by connecting the new pavilion to the front of the hospital. Lakeland continues to upgrade the hospital in Niles and have added MRI capabilities at Niles. Thanks, Megan, for such a great update. Hopefully after Phase II is complete, we get a tour of the changes.

Lion President Carrie called the meeting to order and Lion Dennis played a music video of America by Bebe Winans. Lion Prez led us is the Pledge and Lion Dave O. led us in prayer.

Lion Carrie had Lions Dennis and David O present to us their Lions pride. Lion Dennis was up first and gave us some great information on his life.
