

LIONS OF MICHIGAN SERVICE FOUNDATION



The Lions of Michigan Service Foundation held its first meeting of the year on June 30th in conjunction with the Hall of Fame Banquet.

Through our Lions Affordable Hearing Aid Program we are able to offer assistance to low-income people with hearing loss maintain self-sufficiency through the provision of affordable hearing aids and audiology services. Individual Through our Emergency Assistance Program we are able to help uninsured and underinsured people who suffer from severe vision and hearing disorders that can only be corrected through surgical intervention or costly medical procedures. Our **Emergency Military Family and Veterans** Relief Program assists current and former military members and their families with financial emergencies. The Emergency Disaster Relief Program allows us to assist people and families affected by natural disasters, including severe storms, flooding, fires and tornados. Through our Donor Advised Funds we partner with individuals, families, businesses and other non-profit organizations to provide charitable services that are important to the funds' primary donor or donors. KidSight assists us to identify and help resort normal vision to children suffering

from undiagnosed vision disorders that affect their ability to perform in school and develop on pace with their classmates. **The Hearing Screening Program** assists us to identify and treat hearing problems before they impede a child's learning and development and negatively impact a child or adult's quality of life.

The Lions of Michigan and our programs are funded with revenue derived from our Lions Mints business, our Sight Hearing & Sweepstakes, donations, grants from other foundations, special events and investment income generated by a small endowment fund. The 36th Annual Sight & Hearing Sweepstakes was а fantastic vear in ticket sales. Approximately \$124,000 in sales for a record year. 11-B2 had 22 clubs that participated and sold 1, 011 tickets versus in 2021 when only 16 clubs participated and sold 979 tickets.

The 100 Ticket Club this year included Colon Lions selling 156 tickets, St. Joseph Lions selling 105 tickets, Kalamazoo Westside selling 100 tickets, and Portage selling 100 tickets. I am sad to say that clubs or individuals were recipients of any of the drawings this year....but keep selling those tickets in the future so we can continue to offer assistance for eyeglasses and hearing aids to people.

The cookbook sales have been going very well with sales of over \$6,000 and sponsor totals of over \$4,300. There are only about 1,100 left to sell so contact LMSF office or Trustees Jeff & Julie Mayuiers. Remember for every 20 your club sells they will get \$5 back per book.

- 1. Ask someone. Ask One!
- 2. Bring a guest to meetings
- 3. Advertise in newspapers & cable TV
- 4. Have a clear club goal & a strategic plan
- 5. Letters or personal contact with local businesses
- 6. Contact with Chamber of Commerce
- 7. Place customized bookmarks in library books
- 8. Have public meetings at malls, outdoors, etc.
- 9. Have a booth at malls, fairs, festivals etc.
- 10. Place pamphlets in doctors' offices, hospitals, cafeterias, libraries, etc.
- 11. Create videos of your events and promote your Club on YouTube
- 12. Host an Open House
- 13. Hold a club assembly only on membership
- 14. Ask former Leos, Effective Speaking Contestants, Lions Quest grads, Vision Screening school contact, etc.
- 15. Make the membership chair an active Club Officer that reports at each meeting
