District Challenge!

Our district took it a step further and made a 5-year pledged to sponsor the \$12,000 purchase of Artificial Skylights for the Bronson Pediatric Hematology & Oncology office. Our pledge allowed them to place the order NOW instead of waiting for the full amount in advance.

A little background, Artificial Sky is an advanced lighting system that mimics sunlight to increased productivity & attentiveness, reduce stress & anxiety, improve patient outcomes, lower blood pressure, decrease eye strain, boost mood/energy, and has lower energy costs. Bronson pediatric hematology oncology clinic is located in the ground level of the hospital, and they only have one room with windows and actual sunlight. Many patients and families are under a large amount of stress and anxiety. These lights could help build a healing environment that matches the reassuring and calming attitude of our staff while enhancing the experience of the patients.

We have 31 clubs in our District. If just 24 clubs raise \$500 towards the Artificial lighting this year we could blow that 5-year deadline out of the water!

WE DID IT!



Our Project KidSight Team made it happen! Our goal was to screen 20,000 kids this Lion year and TODAY we did it! While at the Coloma Public Schools today we surpassed our goal with an amazing number of 20,177 students screened and 2,133 students with referrals, meaning the high-tech camera spotted one or more abnormalities in the students vision. It was an amazing morning for the 17 man/woman team today!

We are not down yet either. We have a meeting with the Superintendent at the Bridgman Schools, a date set for May 2nd at the Gobles Schools, dates set for Dowagiac Schools, May 3rd, 6th, 7th & 31st. We will be meeting with the Superintendent of the Three Rivers School District possibly next week. She was on spring break this week so we will be nailing down a date to meet with Nikki Nash the Superintendent in hopes to get their school students screened.

We have dates already set for early fall for Benton Harbor School, Paw Paw School and Mattawan School. Every school that we have been to has asked us to come back next year. In fact, Mr. David Ehlers of the Coloma Schools said to us, "Schedule our school the last week of March for the next seven years!" Mr. Ehlers was very pleased with our process and the time that we were able to come in, screen the students and be done in an outstanding little amount of time and be done before their lunch hours started.

Our Project KidSight Team was honored at the 11B2 District Convention by District Governor Amy Thackston as she LOVES what Project KidSight is doing far beyond the rest of the State of Michigan. The members received an appreciation certificate and Amy's appreciation pin. Dave and Tanda received the 4th highest honor from the International President along with her pin for our dedication to PKS.







Dave and Tanda have been to two PKS meetings in Lansing to share what we have found that works to get into the schools. At the second meeting, PKS Coordinators from other Districts wanted us to present them with handouts to help them accomplish getting into the schools like we are. The District Coordinators from around Michigan find it hard to believe we are getting into this many schools and screening this many students. Persistence is the name of the game; contact the Administration Office at the schools and ask for a meeting with the Superintendent to show and tell them what we do and how the Lions of Michigan is being proactive in finding abnormalities especially in our children who are our future.

We have been able to provide a FULL TEAM when going into the schools. So many of our team members are really enjoying being part of the team. We

have moved up our member numbers from 14 to 17-18 showing up at a school and to help the screening process and feel the excitement of helping find the children that need help to see better. Then afterwards the high point for the members is to go out for breakfast or lunch! We deserve to get out and enjoy each other's company! This is super great because membership in the PKS Project brings Lion Members from MANY LIONS CLUBS!





At the District Convention a PKS table was available to show our PRIDE by listing all the volunteers that have helped with PKS this year. It was also a great time to recruit and talk with other Lion members





from other clubs about joining our force against blindness and helping find children that need help. Our motto (goal) is to help children through the early detection and treatment of vision disorders that hinder their ability to succeed in school and develop normally. We feel we are making this goal successful in finding 2,133 kids that could go on for many years not knowing they could see better if only the abnormality was corrected for them. This is the REALLY important number that our team is proud of.





From July through November of this year, our Michigan Lions Foundation has provided services and financial support to District 10 and Multiple District 11 Lions Clubs amounting to:

PROJECT KIDSIGHT – 15,840 screened and 1,732 children referred for follow-up eye care.

HEARING SCREENING – 170 children and 80 adults have been screened and 19 referred for follow-up care.

DIABETIC RETINOPATHY SCREENING – 112 screened and 13 referred for follow-up care.



A \$100 Youth Exchange Supplies fee is required with all applications. Fee includes shirts, backpack, MD11 Youth Exchange pins and banners and orientation booklet. There may be an additional charges for camps within your chosen country that are not included in the price of our program. You will be required to purchase your own airfare and international travel insurance. The travel insurance must be accepted in the country you are visiting.

Age requirements are typically 15 - 22

Our students usually depart the U.S. the last weekend of June or beginning of July for a 3 to 5 week stay depending on the Youth Exchange program in those countries. Please note that all counties are on a first come basis and fill up fast so the sooner you apply the sooner we can confirm your acceptance.

Time Line

September/October/November: District Chairs and committee members promote the program, focusing on and making personal contact with LEO Clubs and/or high schools in their District. Upon a young adult's commitment, the District Chairperson sends the initial application to the State Chairperson, Lion Elvie Marfil. A formal recognition of the young adult's acceptance into the Lions Club Youth Exchange Program will be sent from the state chairperson to both the District Chairperson and the young adult.

December 15 or before: The signed Application, Indemnity Form, and Compulsory Items must be received by State Chairperson Lion Elvie Marfil, epmarfil5@gmail.com. Some exceptions may apply with permission however, it must go through the District Chair to the State Chair. Signatures are needed at each level.

Upon Commitment until March 30 the LYE (Lions Youth Exchange) young adult's responsibilities include:

- Contact clubs via a phone call, letter or email correspondence to obtain donations for travel
 expenses. Make arrangements to meet with the club personally. A list of clubs and pertinent
 information is furnished by the District Chairperson. Many clubs will not donate unless there is
 face-to-face contact. The clubs want to know why this experience is important to the LYE young
 adult.
- Contact family and friends to solicit funds for travel expenses.
- Create, schedule, and execute fundraisers to raise money for the LYE experience.
- Attend the Fall District/Regional Lions Conference (usually in October) to make the LYE visible to the clubs. The clubs want to know why this experience is important to the LYE young adult.
- Obtain a passport and/or visa.

March 30: All funds should be gathered for travel expenses and submitted to State Chairperson Lion Elvie Marfil. February 28 is the deadline for all trip donations from the clubs.

March/April/May/June: Host families are found and flight tickets are purchased. Contact between the host country and the state LYE chairperson is not always immediate. Flight tickets cannot be purchased until a host family is found. Please stick closely to this timeline.

May: Youth and family must attend a mandatory meeting in Lansing for LYE parents/guardians, district LYE chairperson, and/or committee member. The LYE young adult will receive a backpack, shirts, pins, banners, flight tickets, insurance information, and general information about airports, security, filling out immigration forms, etc.

IMPORTANT: Any young adult not making the timeline as listed above will be dropped from that year's program, unless cleared by the District Chair and State Chair. This is a very time-consuming process for all involved, and it requires all involved to closely follow the deadlines.



How to Approach Merchants

- Request Counter space for Lions Mints
- Ask if merchant is familiar with Lions mission
- Be sure to say it will only take a small space (If they put it somewhere you don't like, try to talk them into a better place, but be tactful)
- Look around—find a desirable spot–visibility, accessibility
- Assume a humble attitude, don't be pushy or demanding, but try to convey importance of placing the mints in that business.
