Project KidSight has taken Vision Screening to a whole new level!

I am very happy to report that our Project KidSight Team is TOP NOTCH! The Team has passed the word to other Lion Members how much fun we have while doing vision screening in the schools and we have several new members because of it. Bonus....going out to eat breakfast or lunch afterwards is great to get to know each other even more!

My last report was awhile back and at that time we only reported that we had screened 1,795 with 221 referrals (in September) but since then we have screened 19,443 students and have found 2,159 referrals! The Team wants to reach 30,000 this year! High expectations I'd say!

The Project KidSight Team is looking forward to what we can do in 2025. PIP Brian Sheehan's goal was to make a huge nationwide impact by performing Project KidSight Vision Screening in as many of our communities as possible during the week of January 12th through the 19th to celebrate the birthday of our founder Melvin Jones. Right away we thought about the Edwardsburg Schools as



there are over 2,500 students in their six schools. The Superintendent Courtney Szucs had already given her blessing as she loves what Project KidSight has done for their students especially those that we found needing to get into an optometrist as soon as they can. The next step was to find volunteers that could help during the five-day challenge. The most outstanding reward was that volunteers from TEN Lion Clubs stepped up to the challenge! We had volunteers from Mattawan, Paw Paw, South Haven, Niles, Centreville, Buchanan-Galien, Bloomingdale/Kal-Haven, Portage, Vicksburg and Edwardsburg. We ended up screening 2,127 students and found 175 referrals. The staff, teachers and students thanked our PKS Team for coming into the Edwardsburg Schools and screening so quickly. The screeners thought it was so nice to hear from students thanking them for screening their eyes. We all loved to hear that as it touches our hearts to know we are doing a good thing, making a difference in a child's life.

In the last two months we have been very fortunate to get into 4 Portage Elementary Schools, which we had never been to before. There are a total of 8 elementary schools, and we have

screened 4 of them so far and have another one set for January 22nd and another one for January 28th. Then we have two other elementary schools that I have contacted to see if they will let our PKS Team come to their school. I'm hoping to hear from them soon. After we complete screening at the elementary schools, we hope to get the opportunity to get into the 3 middle schools and 3 high schools. Superintendent Mark Bielang came to the first school that we screened at, which was Haverhill Elementary School, and was very impressed with our procedures, our team and how quickly we screened the students. He then came to Angling Road Elementary School to see the team in action again as he was pleased with our dedication to taking care of his students.








Become a Host Family

Is Hosting Right for Me?

Are you interested in learning about other cultures and ways of life while sharing your own customs and experiences? Are open-mindedness, tolerance and cultural competence of high importance to you? Do you have a desire to contribute towards peace, international understanding and the creation of global citizenship in youth? If you answered yes to any of these questions, you may enjoy being a host family for the Lions Youth Camps and Exchange (YCE) Program!

Benefits of Hosting

Hosting an exchange youth is guaranteed to be a rewarding experience because:

- You experience the joy of sharing your culture and daily customs
- You learn about the exchange youth's customs and culture
- You open a new world of possibilities and thinking to the exchange youth
- You make a new friend maybe a friend for life

Expectations of a Host Family

Room and Board

You are expected to provide room and board for the youth. It is recommended that youth be roomed with youth of similar ages and similar genders. Meals should be balanced and healthy.

Transportation

Typically, you are responsible for all of the youth's transportation during the exchange. Travel may include but is not limited to, transfers to and from the airport or train station, transfers to other Host Families or International Camp, transportation to and from any planned activities by you and/or the Host Club.

Financial responsibilities

Payment for cultural activities is dependent on the agreement made between you, the youth and the Host Club. Some programs offer stipends or scholarships for participating Host Families.



YOUTH CAMPS & EXCHANGE

Selecting an Exchange Youth

The criteria for selecting youth differs from YCE program to YCE program. Hosting a youth is dependent upon desired age, gender, interests and nationality and upon the availability of the youth meeting those requirements. Your local YCE Chairperson will advise you of available youth or if arranged early enough, may seek a youth meeting your request.

You can learn more about the roles and expectations of a YCE Host Family by checking out the YCE Host Family Handbook!

Host Family Eligibility

Potential Host Families must be screened by the Host Lions Club and YCE Chairperson. The Host Lions Club and local YCE Chairperson must approve all host families. Screening items include, but are not limited to:

Age: Having experience with youth of similar age as the incoming youth.

Character: Your family should be understanding, interested in other cultures, open-minded, tolerant and have ability to communicate and/or deal wisely with youth.

Language ability: It would be helpful if one or more members of your family speaks the youth's language and/or English (most YCE programs require English as the preferred language), and could be necessary in some cases.

Knowledge of the YCE program and policy: Your family should have some familiarity with the YCE program and/or hosting youth. If you are a non-Lion Host Family, you should be well informed on the scope and objectives of Lionism, and on the YCE program and policy by the local YCE Chairperson.

Living conditions: Your family should be able to accommodate an additional person in the home without discomfort or financial burden.

Family preferences: Your family are permitted preference regarding the youth's nationality, language, religion, gender or age.

Availability: It is important that you make sure your family's schedule allows accommodation to spend enough quality time with the youth.




