

to get your clubs together and get more Lions certified as technicians and just helpers for screenings.

Speaking of new officers, I want to remind clubs that the new PU101 Form will be due to LCI once your new officers have been decided on and at the same time send DGE Amy a copy to update the Roster Book.

Also looking to the new Lions year I'd like to remind clubs to review the Club Treasurer E-book Year-end Check List where the following items are stated, and should be prepared by the current Treasurer. This is especially true regarding the auditing of the books. Over the years I've heard from many Club Treasurer's that their books are never audited. This is addressed in the "Bank Signatories" section below. The auditing of the books is not meant to say anyone is doing anything illegal, just for transparency, and no one should take offense to having the books audited. You don't need to hire a CPA to do this, you can ask a CPA you know that may do it for no fee or for a reduced fee since we are a non-profit. You can also ask another Club Treasurer from another club to do it.

Prepare Documents and Orient the Incoming Treasurer - A full set of all revenue and expense receipts, bank statements, tax filings, financial reports provided to the board of directors and general ledgers of all transactions should be prepared for file retention with the club secretary and a set available as a reference for the incoming club treasurer.

Bank signatories - It is important for the board of directors to approve a resolution authorizing new signatories for club accounts. This may be completed at a board meeting after the club completes its officer elections and prior to the new fiscal year. The resolution should contain the names of officers that

are being added as signatories as well as those that are being removed at the end of the fiscal year. This resolution should be recorded in the club minutes and then provided to the club's banking institution upon request. (Just something that I learned a long time ago also is that if a husband and wife are both on the club's bank account that they should not both sign the same checks. There should also be a third signature authorized to sign checks and that individual should sign with either the husband or wife. This is just another way to show transparency). Club financial records must be audited annually, and findings reported to the board of directors and all club members.

Prepare and retain all financial records for permanent records. Turn over all accounting ledgers, checkbooks and banking institution statements containing current account balances to the incoming treasurer.

Just a look ahead to early June.... The final Cabinet meeting for this Cabinet will be held June 3rd with the location being changed to the Three Rivers Lions Club, 420 6th Avenue, Three Rivers (across from the HS track field on M-60). Breakfast will be at 8:30 and the meeting at 9:00. Everyone is invited to attend, but please RSVP to CS Tammie Grabowski by June 1st if you plan to attend so we can have enough food.

Then later in the day is the Growler's Game in Kalamazoo if you purchased tickets previously from CS Tammie. There are still a few tickets left for the Three Rivers Lions Club Bruce C. Snook Citizen of the Year Banquet to be held on June 8th honoring my own...I mean our own, PCC Jeff Mayuiers for all his accomplishments in our community of Three Rivers and elsewhere. Contact me if you'd like to purchase a ticket before June 2nd.

We are now in the final countdown of the 2022 - 2023 Lions year and we need to get all updates in the LCI website by June 15th in order for LCI to have time to make corrections they may need to final year end numbers and dues statements for July 1. Remember if you drop a member and they are on your dues statement you still need to pay for everyone on your statement and then LCI will adjust accordingly. Do not deduct for members that have been dropped and still appearing on your statement as this gets too confusing for LCI to track.

Thanks again for ALL you do and continue to do as a member of the GREATEST and largest service organization in the world!!

Lions of Michigan Foundation PROJECT KIDSIGHT



The 11B2 Project KidSight Team has been working to the finish line at offering our free vision screening in the schools before they are finished here in early June. We surpassed our goal of screening 10,000 kids when we were screening at the Paw Paw Schools. It was an exciting moment for us all. Then much to our surprise we surpassed our goal of 10,000 kids by ending up on May 18th with a total number of kids screened at 12,417 kids! The best part is we have found 979 kids with some type of abnormality. We are hoping parents will get their child to an eye doctor right away. We are making a difference in these children's lives, according to Chad McCann, Director at the Lions of Michigan Foundation. He said what we are doing is working as doctors are sending back their report after the parents are bringing their child in for an exam. Our referral picture in almost every case is right on with what the doctors are finding. This is exciting for our team as we will know the child is getting the help they need.

The month of May was an exceptional month for our Project KidSight Team. The schools were more than anxious to get our team in before the end of May hoping that parents could have their children into an eye doctor to start fresh next fall with possibly glasses that could improve their learning experience. Our team was getting up very early each morning and sometimes for three or four mornings in a row to get to the school early enough to start our screening and have all the students screened before their lunch hour started. Initially we planned on only scheduling 2 screenings a week but then realized we needed to com-



plete the three schools before the end of the year that we signed up to do. We were screening at Paw Paw Schools, South Haven Schools and Gobles Schools. Plus, we took on two small church schools, Saint Mary's School and Trinity Lutheran School, who requested our team to screen all their students as well.

In every school that we have screened, we have been asked to come back again but, in the fall, rather than later in the year. It will be a very busy fall for us as some of these schools have a lot of students and it will mean visiting a lot of their schools at different locations. We have a LOT of

DEDICATED Lion members and friends of the Lions coming to help with Project KidSight. A volunteer does not need to be a Lion member to be part of the team. We try whenever possible to go into a school with four SPOT cameras, which means we need approximately 12 to 14 volunteers to either screen, be an assistant to the screener or help complete the referral forms to be turned into the school by the end of our screening.



Our own Lion Kevin Guzzo was our program for May 4th. It was an enjoyable and fast-paced forty-five minutes. Lion Guzzo has been at St. Joseph High School for twenty-eight years. He was initially a math teacher. He coached basketball, football, and track at different levels during his teaching years. Currently, there are 968 students at SJHS. One in every two students participates in at least one sport. In the school year '21 - '22, fifty-seven per cent of all freshmen students participated in athletics. 45% of sophomores participated.

*Process over outcome. Participation is number one, not winning.

*A three-sport athlete in the same year at SJHS is called an Iron Bear. SJHS had 42 Iron Bears last school year.

*Academic records show that athletes at SJHS maintain a higher GPA than non-athletes.

*Pre-game and practice music must be approved by Lion Guzzo.

*Lion Guzzo's MVP process encourages and enhances students to reach success in both athletics and academics.

*Lion Guzzo's MVP program gives a clear definition of expected behaviors in the classroom and on the athletic field. All SJHS athletes have clear performance pathways.

For May 18th's program, Lion Lundgren introduced the already famous, our own Lion Chriss Lyon. She presented "In search of the perfect storm", or Chasing Clouds. While working at Berrien County 911 Center, she was present on July 16, 1980, when Berrien County experienced a "Derecho". Called "The Green Storm" with 98 MPH winds. There were many trees down and much damage. This event spurred her on to do more study of clouds and storms. At the ripe young age of 40 she enrolled at College of Du page IL in a class to study storms. In the years 2008, 2009 and 2010, she traveled for 10 days to several states with the college group to study and chase the clouds and storms. The group traveled in vans equipped with computers, internet and equipment. They traveled on many back roads and witnessed many cloud formations. In 2009 they saw hail, super cells, shelf clouds, wall cloud, funnel cloud-but no tornadoes. In 2010, they saw hail, dust devil, rotating wall cloud, funnel cloud, along with seeing 6 tornadoes up to EF-4 velocity. There are many storm chaser vehicles that chase storms wherever they appear. Professional Meteorologists are also studying the

storms and how clouds develop into more serious storms. She showed photos of many different types of cloud formations. One photo showed an overpass where a woman died while hiding under it. It is not advised to ever hide under an overpass. The winds can become more violent with those structures. If anyone is interested in this experience, see College of DuPage Storm Chasing Program. Thanks to Lion Chriss for informing us about this very interesting program.

Lion Kring introduced Geneva Tabor from Buchanan High School. Geneva is a member of the Lions Michigan All-State Band and the LEO Club. They will be traveling to the Lions International Convention in Boston and then to New York City. While in New York, the group will perform on the steps of Rockefeller Center. Following the New York trip the group will go to Cedar Point in Ohio and enjoy the rides and also perform. Geneva is currently dual-enrolled at LMC and hopes to transfer to Grand Valley to study in the medical surgery field. She is also active in the Buchanan Leo Club, which has about 30 members. She will also volunteer at Camp Leo in August.

Hello fellow Lions...

Some thoughts on submissions to the Beacon...

 I've had some issues lately with images that have been submitted in documents created in Microsoft Word, because, unfortunately, Word has a feature built into the

app that automatically knocks the resolution down on all embedded images, presumeably to keep the overall size of the document down. The result is that I've had some photos that end up being in the 70-90ppi (pixels per inch) range, which is extremely sub-par for publication electronically and does not reproduce well.

I would prefer that full size images simply be attached to the emails that are being submitted for publication as I'm able to better able to control the resolution that will go into the Beacon. If you would like to continue working in Word, that's fine, but I would suggest you look into how to *turn off* the resolution compression feature so that the images I receive will be much better. Here's where you can go to learn about this feature.

- It's okay to expand on the descriptive text of your submission (don't give me *War & Peace*) but some articles I've been receiving are of the one sentence variety. Remember the 4 W's of information: Who, What, When, & Where when writing up your copy. It's better for me to have to cut back than add.
- I've noticed a number of submissions to our District's Facebook page about Lion club events that I was not

aware of. So, for those that are posting on Facebook, could you do me a favor and simply throw the same text and images into an email and send them my way. Not everyone has access to the Facebook page and the Beacon can still fill that gap. Thanks in advance!

One other thing to note....I was very proud to be a part of our district's Project KidSight effort in screening 12,417 kids with 979 referrals for further exams by eye professionals, surpassing our goal of 10,000. The PKS Team hopes to go even farther next year.
