Community Eye Screening For Children

The 11B2 Project KidSight Team has BEAT the 2023-2024 numbers of Screening!

Last year the PKS Team managed to finish the year with 22,308 screened and found 2,415 referrals. With two screenings that happened on Wednesday 2/26/25 and Thursday 2/27/25 we peaked last year screening by adding 860 students screened and finding 108 students with referrals. Our new total is now 23,116 students screened and 2,534 students that were referrals. Our hope is parents will get their child into see an eve care professional such as an Optometrist or Ophthalmologist as soon as possible. Lions goals have always been to help children through the early detection and treatment of vision disorders that hinder their ability to develop normally and achieve success in school and life. Our goal has been on our trifold for many years and every

referral packet that we hand out has the trifold inside the packet. Our volunteers also put a check mark by what their child has as an abnormality in case the parent wishes to look online to see what our camera has found as an eye disorder to get a better understanding as parents might not know what Anisometropia is or are not sure what Astigmatism is. Our high-tech camera looks for 7 disorders that cause vision loss. Our goal is to offer our free service to as many schools as we can in District 11B2.

On March 20th the PKS Team will take part in participating in a Young 5s & Kindergarten Registration Night for 8 Elementary Schools in Portage. We have screened in 7 of these elementary schools so far and will tie it up by screening the 8th elementary school on March 6th. A PKS Team has been set in motion to participate, which new this year is a one-stop shop for families! The registration will be at the Northern High School Commons from 5:30 to 7:30. We plan on taking 3 cameras plus 1 more in case we need that evening. (We don't want parents to wait in long lines so we will do our very best to show off how quickly we can screen their child!)



Referrals are an Important part of our screening process.

Our amazing team is dedicated to giving up a morning to go into a school and screen all the students that are in the school. These volunteers in my book are AMAZING, AWESOME, FABULOUS, MAGNIFICENT, FANTASTIC & EXTRAORDINARY!!! The screening process is simple, get into the school, set up the cameras and printers. The entire team works to make this happen quickly so we can start screening as soon as possible. The Superintendent, Principals, Teachers and Staff are "AMAZED" at what our team can do in little time, and in time before the lunch hours start. I This is the BEST JOB that I have EVER HAD and don't even get paid!

Become a Host Family

Is Hosting Right for Me?

Are you interested in learning about other cultures and ways of life while sharing your own customs and experiences? Are open-mindedness, tolerance and cultural competence of high importance to you? Do you have a desire to contribute towards peace, international understanding and the creation of global citizenship in youth? If you answered yes to any of these questions, you may enjoy being a host family for the Lions Youth Camps and Exchange (YCE) Program!

Benefits of Hosting

Hosting an exchange youth is guaranteed to be a rewarding experience because:

- You experience the joy of sharing your culture and daily customs
- You learn about the exchange youth's customs and culture
- You open a new world of possibilities and thinking to the exchange youth
- You make a new friend maybe a friend for life

Expectations of a Host Family

Room and Board

You are expected to provide room and board for the youth. It is recommended that youth be roomed with youth of similar ages and similar genders. Meals should be balanced and healthy.

Transportation

Typically, you are responsible for all of the youth's transportation during the exchange. Travel may include but is not limited to, transfers to and from the airport or train station, transfers to other Host Families or International Camp, transportation to and from any planned activities by you and/or the Host Club.

Financial responsibilities

Payment for cultural activities is dependent on the agreement made between you, the youth and the Host Club. Some programs offer stipends or scholarships for participating Host Families.

Selecting an Exchange Youth

The criteria for selecting youth differs from YCE program to YCE program.

Hosting a youth is dependent upon desired age, gender, interests and nationality and upon the availability of the youth meeting those requirements. Your local YCE Chairperson will advise you of available youth or if arranged early enough, may seek a youth meeting your request.

You can learn more about the roles and expectations of a YCE Host Family by checking out the YCE Host Family Handbook!

Host Family Eligibility

Potential Host Families must be screened by the Host Lions Club and YCE Chairperson. The Host Lions Club and local YCE Chairperson must approve all host families. Screening items include, but are not limited to:

Age: Having experience with youth of similar age as the incoming youth.

Character: Your family should be understanding, interested in other cultures, open-minded, tolerant and have ability to communicate and/or deal wisely with youth.

Language ability: It would be helpful if one or more members of your family speaks the youth's language and/or English (most YCE programs require English as the preferred language), and could be necessary in some cases.

Knowledge of the YCE program and policy: Your family should have some familiarity with the YCE program and/or hosting youth. If you are a non-Lion Host Family, you should be well informed on the scope and objectives of Lionism, and on the YCE program and policy by the local YCE Chairperson.

Living conditions: Your family should be able to accommodate an additional person in the home without discomfort or financial burden.

Family preferences: Your family are permitted preference regarding the youth's nationality, language, religion, gender or age.

Availability: It is important that you make sure your family's schedule allows accommodation to spend enough quality time with the youth.




