

# October Report 2022

Project KidSight attended five events in late August and in September. Our first event on August 28th was at the Vicksburg Faith & Family Event in Buchanan. It was a very hot day and attendance was down for this event this year, but PKS was still pleased to offer our free vision screening. We screened 14 kids with 1 referral so it was worth the time to be there. Two Buchanan-Galien Lion Members worked with us to learn how to take pictures, record referrals and to speak with parents about Project KidSight. Dianne Ross and Mark Skene were great help and caught on quickly to help us out!

Our next event on August 29th was at the Edwardsburg Eagle Lake Elementary School for their Open House. At this event we screened 69 kids, with 66 passing and 3 kids received a referral packet to go to an Eye Doctor for further checking. Two Edwardsburg Lion Members assisted us at this event, Roy Smothermon and Bill Welsch. Both enjoyed it so much that they said to call them whenever we need help!

Then the very next day, August 30th the team was at the Edwardsburg Intermediate School Open House. There we screened 70 kids with 64 passing, 4 referrals. We had a baby just over 1 year old

that we tried but couldn't get a good picture and then we also had one child that had glasses on but even with glasses on, the SPOT camera showed the child had Myopia. We asked the parents to take their child to their eye doctor as the glasses were a few years old and were not doing a good job for the child to see. Our extra help at this event was again Roy Smothermon and his wife Sue Smothermon, both Edwardsburg Lion Members. Next event was August 31st at the Edwardsburg Primary School Open House. We screened 72 kids



with 64 passing and 8 referrals. Our help at this event was again Dianne Ross from the Buchanan Club who did ALL the screening. She is a natural! We also had Jerry Tavernier from the Edwardsburg Club who helped parents with consent forms. At the end of the evening, both Lion members told me to call them whenever we need help. I told them I have their number!






