March 17 Deadline for Cullen Akins Award Nominations

It's time for clubs to nominate their candidates for the 2023 Cullen Akins Award, otherwise known as District 2-0T3's Lion of the Year Award. Lion Betty Spencer of El Paso Sun City LC was the 2022 Cullen Akins honoree. At the time, I remember hearing that all of the new members she has sponsored, all were still Lions. What an accomplishment!

A specially engraved watch will be presented to the winner at the annual District Convention banquet. Our 2023 honoree is encouraged to attend the banquet. However, this is no longer a requirement. Eligibility for the Cullen Akins Leadership Award is based on the following:

- 1. Outstanding service in Lionism based on the current Lion year shall be the primary consideration.
- 2. Nominee must be a member in good standing of a Lions Club in District 2-T3 during the current vear.
- 3. Nominee should have an above average attendance record and be involved in Lions activities in his/her club first, and the District, State, and International levels thereafter.
- 4. Those not eligible for nomination are previous winners, Past District Governors, current cabinet members such as Zone and Region chairpersons, Cabinet Secretary or Treasurer, or Vice District Governor (other district committee chairpersons are eligible for consideration).

An outline or biography of the nominee must be sent to the Immediate Past District Governor at fheslin1@nwol.net or Frank Heslin, 1404 S Gary Ave, Monahans, Texas 79756. This nomination must be no longer than one double spaced typewritten page and must be submitted no later than Mary 17, 2023. Selection of the winner will be made by a secret vote by the Past District Governors who will defray all of the expenses of this award.

Legacy Lion Award

The Legacy Lion Award provides each Lions Club in the District the opportunity to recognize an individual member for outstanding performance and community service during the year and/or throughout their membership. As the name implies, this individual has instilled a "Legacy" in their club. The nominee is voted on by the club or by the Board of Directors. Legacy Lions will be honored during the luncheon at the District Convention in Odessa on April 29, 2023.

Each club may nominate one Legacy Lion, who will receive a certificate and a patch for their vest. Please submit: (1) the *name* of your club's Legacy Lion for 2022-2023; (2) a *summary* of what that Lion has contributed; and (3) *\$12* to defray the cost of the patch.



EMERGING LIONS LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE

Kerrville Texas USA March 25-27, 2023

Emerging Lions Leadership Institutes focus on building the skills of Lions members for leadership opportunities at the club level, including the position of club president.

PARTICIPANT QUALIFICATIONS

- Candidates for this institute must be from Constitutional Area I & II - United States of America, Its Affiliates, Bermuda & The Bahamas & Canada. This institute will be conducted in English. Candidates must be capable of understanding and participating in the language of instruction at this institute.
- Candidates must be Lions in good standing who have successfully served on a club committee and who have not yet attained the level of club president. Current charter club presidents are also eligible for this institute.
- Candidates must be willing to commit to all days of the institute, including group mealtimes, and understand that personal time is extremely limited. <u>Attendance at all</u> classroom sessions and scheduled meals is mandatory.

COST OF THE INSTITUTE

Lions Clubs International will provide meals and lodging according to the schedule of the institute. Please note that according to board policy, a non-refundable participation fee of US\$150.00 will be required to offset a portion of these costs for all institutes. This fee will be due no less than four weeks prior to the institute start date. Please do not send fees until you receive a letter of acceptance to the institute.

Participants are also responsible for their own transportation and related travel expenses to and from the institute site. You will be assigned a roommate of the same gender to share lodging with for the Institute.

SELECTION PROCESS

Because of the high number of applications received by the association, acceptance into the institute is not guaranteed. In the selection process the MD2 Leadership Division strives to achieve maximum geographical representation of districts throughout the Multiple District. All candidates will be notified of selection status no more than three weeks after the application deadline via the email address provided on the application form.

The Leadership Development Division of MD-2 reserves the right to cancel any institute or due to insufficient applications submitted by the stated application submission deadline date.

The division maintains the quality of all aspects of the institute, including program, faculty and the selection process of participants.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

All candidates must complete the following items and submit them as indicated below. All completed documents must be submitted by the stated application submission deadline date in order to be considered.

- A. Candidate's Information Form
- B. Nomination Form must be signed by the applicant's:
 - 1. Club president
 - 2. *District Governor
 - 3. *GLT District Coordinator

*Applicants from a provisional zone or provision region must have the signature of the Zone Chairperson or Region Chairperson and Global Leadership Team Area Leader, respectively, in lieu of the District Governor.

Expectations of ELLI graduates:

- Pursue additional leadership roles and responsibilities in their respective clubs.
- Serve as a leadership resource in their respective clubs.
- Share their institute experiences with members of their club and encourage other qualified Lions to apply to the institutes.
