

# **GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE**

Dear Lions of District 2-T3,

This district tied for third in the United States among mid-year membership growth leaders (percentage of members sponsoring new members). Keep up the good work!

Many thanks to El Paso Five Points LC for hosting our recent Mid-Winter Conference. It was a productive meeting that started and ended on time, accomplished much, and included plenty of fun. PID Mike and Sheryl Butler were our perfect guests -entertaining, informative, encouraging, and motivational. In addition to the district meeting, Linda and I met with two Fabens Cotton Valley Lions, made our official visit to El Paso Downtown LC, toured the El Pasoans Fighting Hunger Food Bank, and then made a stop in Clint, where PDG Orlando and I met with Mayor Dora Aguirre and others to discuss plans for starting a new club in Clint.

The icy weather in Kerrville curtailed many activities, although the Council of Governors meeting itself was held as scheduled on Friday morning. Texas Lions Camp invited all attendees to an informative brunch meeting on Saturday morning. Together We Build continues in spite of supply price fluctuations. We're invited to participate in work days this year on March 5, April 2, and April 30. Family camping was tremendously successful in 2021; it will continue in 2022, as the camp adapts to challenges and thrives. The club with the highest percent net gain in membership for the year ending June 30 will receive a special district award. In fact, there will be two awards -- one for a small club and the other for a large club. The average club size in District 2-T3 is 20 members. So far this year El Paso Downtown LC has a net membership gain of 15.9%, which leads the district among clubs with more than 20 members. Meanwhile Ysleta LC has a whopping net gain of 26.7% for the lead among clubs that started the year with 20 or fewer members. There is still plenty of time for all clubs to join this competition. Eleven clubs show net gains so far this year. Keep up the good work.

Each club that reports service on MyLion before the end of this Lions year will receive special banner patch. Clubs that report service in all 5 global cause areas (Sight, Childhood Cancer, Environment, Diabetes, and Hunger) will get a global causes emblem on their banner patch.

Congratulations to West Texas Lions Hearing Inc. for receiving their charitable organization 501(c)(3) designation from the IRS.

A great start! District 2-T3 excelled during the recent statewide "Striding for Healthy Living" event. Professionals of Odessa Lion Allan Espina completed the most total walk, run, swim and bike miles. He placed first in swim, second run and second in bike categories, while PDG Javier Morales of Odessa Downtown LC placed first in run and El Paso Executive Women's Lion Rachel Scott earned honorable mention in walk. El Paso Centennial LC was recognized for recruiting 8 new members during the event. I'll take that as a sign of good things to come because only 7 new members are shown on MyLCI so far this year!





### Congratulations to All recipients!



At the meeting of 02/14/22 of the Texas Lions Foundation, it approved a \$2,900 humanitarian matching grant to replace Tee boxes maintained by a Lions club at a local golf course. A \$30,000 grant was approved to partially fund a backup generator for a Lions clubhouse that is also used as a disaster relief shelter. A third request, was approved for \$2,500. Work is currently in progress on these projects.
