GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE

I continue to pledge to devote the rest of my year to struggling clubs in this district. I'm happy to say that some clubs have already asked for help. GMA Champion PDG Orlando Rodriguez, GMT Amit Rangra, myself, and others are ready to help when the time is right.

Lion Laurel Santiago is one of the newest Monahans Lions. Through her position at our local radio station, she has produced a four and a half minute public service announcement promoting Lions Club. She invited our Lions to answer the question, "Why am I a Lion?", and then turned our answers into the spot. 
