### ► Governor's Message

With the constant emphasis on obtaining new Lions, we frequently forget to turn our attention to retaining our current Lions within our clubs. Retention is a key to membership growth. Loosing members that are not satisfied or happy with their participation to their club. How can your club work to reverse this trend.

**1.** Soon after joining the club, have a new member orientation explaining the fees and dues expected from the new member. Also inform the new members the traditions and past and current projects of the club and what is the current direction of new projects the club plans to undertake. Get input form the new members as to what part of the projects they could volunteer and how they could assist in planning new projects. In gaining their participation you also create a sense of pride of membership.

2. Introduce the officers to new and existing members. Have each officer explain their position and the responsibilities of their position.

3. Survey your membership to determine if they have any suggestions for changes or new directions they would like to be considered for the club. What club items are they happy with / what club items would they like to see Changed with. (Examples of surveys are available on the Lions website. You can modify the surveys for your club's needs.)

4. Examine your club to determine what can be done to improve your membership's satisfaction within the club. Ask what the members are happy with /what are they not happy with.

5. Determine if your members feel they are getting a value in their membership.

6. Recognize each new and existing member for their participation. There are many awards available on website. You can make your own certificate of appreciation to recognize and Lion and what he has accomplished.

7. Stay in tune with your membership. Don't be afraid to approach your board to consider changes and asking for their support.

8. When a member terminates his membership, have a current lion member contact the member to find out what was the reason(s) he dropped out. Report the reasons to your board to consider if there is a problem happening that may affect other members with the club. Give the former member a few months off and then call them to see if you can entice them to returning to the club.

Maintain your vigilance and keep an open mind. Clubs don't just happen. They are carefully organized and need maintenance to continue.


