Dear Lions of District 2-T3,

District 2-T3 has been active during the past month, as you can see in the *MyLion* app. Also, GMA Champion PDG Orlando Rodriguez informed me that we had reached 725 members by September 4, for a net gain of 17 Lions for the year. That's tremendous. Coming soon from the Global Membership Approach (GMA): we will be sending out a postcard to welcome each new member. This year, GMA is working to reach out to members at the club level.

It has been a joy to continue my official club visits. Several more are scheduled for September and October, thanks to Linda, my super-organized wife. Since the last newsletter, I have made official visits to El Paso Centennial and Fort Stockton Lions Clubs. What an honor it was to also induct new members at both of those meetings. El Paso Centennial held a virtual meeting. Immediately after induction, Lion Ruth Rivas conducted a quick and impressive new member orientation. She focused on what makes Centennial Lions Club unique – their projects, history, schedule of meetings, dues structure, etc. Just the sort of things new members wonder about.

#### LCI President Douglas X. Alexander Visits Texas Lions

Lions Clubs International President, Douglas X Alexander of Brooklyn, N.Y., Visited Texas Lions during the first Council of Governor's meetings August 5-7, 2021 in Kerrville, Texas. It was one of the first official visits of his term.



He shared his story of joining Lions in 1984 and realized that his service had changed the

lives of others. His theme for the Lions year is "Service from the Heart," Something Alexander exemplifies. During the Fellowship Banquet, he emphasized service. "Service is who we are, what we do and why we exist." he said. He encouraged clubs to report their service to LCI.

Many of President Alexander's comments focused on membership "This is the year to change that number. We want quality members. Happy Lions don't leave," he added. He said that when someone says they are "too busy," the club needs to "sign them up," because "busy people get things done." He also urged Lions to "keep young people involved in your club and involved with LCI."

Another area of vital importance to Alexander is communication. "We've got to get better at communication with each other. We need to share what we learn at Zone meeting, and inform clubs about LCIF and grants." He continues, "We have to do a better job telling our story, and we have a beautiful story." Lions have continued to serve despite COVID. "We don't always see the impact of our service on people's lives immediately, but we do change lives".

LCI President Alexander took the opportunity to take a guided tour of the Texas Lions Camp. "I enjoyed seeing the camp in 2013 and today seeing the improvements and learning about the construction underway," Alexander said.

#### Odessa Downtown Lions Club "BIG DONATION"

Medical Center Health System in Odessa, Texas were the recipients of a donation of approximately 70,000 insulin syringes. The Odessa Downtown Lions Club has made the very generous donation to assist people with diabetes who otherwise cannot access them. The syringes will help uninsured or underinsured dealing with the disease.

#### El Paso Centennial Lions Club "Living Diaper to Diaper"

The El Paso Centennial Lions Club in conjunction with the Reynolds Home held a night-time diaper dispensary. The event focused on assisting parents with diaper insecurities which have caused more anxiety than food or housing during the COVID-19 crisis. Currently diapers are not subsidized by government anti-poverty programs.



#### El Paso Downtown Lions Club "Why are eye screeners so smart? Because they were good pupils."

Vision in the pediatric population is essential for learning in the classroom setting. On August 24, 2021 members of the El Paso Downtown Lions Club performed an amazing 349 Spot Vision screenings at North Loop Elementary School in one school day. As if that was not enough, they continued their services the following day and within four hours' time, they tested an additional 125 students.

#### El Paso Del Norte Lions Club "Catch Every Word"

"Every time you hear a sound, please raise you hand," is what you may hear during a Hearing Screening. The El Paso Del Norte Lions Club was pleased to have hosted the certification of nine District 2-T3 Lions in the El Paso area to become certified hearing screeners. An instructor from the Texas Health and Human Services was the facilitator in a five hour course. Hearing screening is a quick and cost effective way to determine who may have hearing loss and need a more detailed evaluation. Among children, early intervention is crucial. Having more Lions certified to perform these screenings, will open the world of communication to children with hearing loss.

#### Hearing and Speech: "Moving Forward"

The announcement of the formation of a Board of Directors for the new Hearing and Speech Program is the first step taken by the steering committee to move the program forward. Currently four names have been suggested. The new Board of Directors will officially file documents with the appropriate entities as part of its reorganization. Currently, the Board will continue with the hearing testing as-is but will reevaluate providing free hearing aids at a later time. The new program will include all District 2-T3 Lions Clubs. Thank you to all for spearheading this new endeavor.
