As, HOCKEY, is a very important part of the community, the Lions, called the project, Morden Lions Shoot Out Measles Challenge. 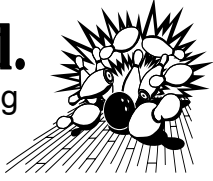



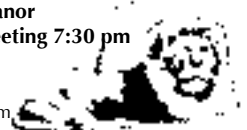
