Lions Clubs who wish to participate in this program contact local school officials requesting permission to visit schools or visit with classroom teachers to present a Canadian flag (15.5cm χ 25.5cm; 6" χ 10") and a Project Pride certificate to Grade 1 students. The certificate, in English or French, describes the diversity of our country and the pride we have in being Canadian.

Lions Clubs from British Columbia to Newfoundland are participating in this project and are sharing their community and national pride with over 40,000 students each year.

- Grades 11&12
- participants must be attending a Manitoba Department of Education
- sanctioned school
- speeches of 4-6 minutes;
- 5 point deduction for each half minute or portion thereof to be assessed
- contestants may use notes (excessive reading to be penalized)
