

The competition, under the direction of Lions Beth Smale & Margaret Martin from the Wawanesa Lions Club, took place on Saturday morning with a break for lunch before the results were announced. A speaker at the luncheon was the 2012 win-



Speakoff winner looks forward to youth exchange experience

Aidan Heaman, a Grade 11 student from Virden, was the winner of the Lions 5M13 Speakoff this year. Aidan's speech was entitled "Education can happen outside the classroom". He told listeners about life experiences that have been part of his education. One very valuable learning area is music. Learning patterns in music helps with reading, spelling and math. He has moved into musical theatre and public speaking. With this in mind, it was no surprise that as soon as his name was announced as winner, he said, "I want to take (the credit towards) the trip."

This was Aidan's second time to compete in Speakoff. He got involved at the suggestion of his parents. He participated in public speaking competitions with Cadets and when he learned about Lions Speakoff, felt it would be interesting to enter a contest with different rules. etc. For example, Cadets speak on assigned topics whereas in Lions Speakoff, the participants choose their own topic. The length of speeches is slightly different and Cadets ask for an impromptu speech whereas Lions ask two questions of the speaker.

Aidan said that once the idea is in his mind, the research and writing is fun. Then, however, it needs to be edited to fit the time and this part can be quite difficult. His local Lions Club was very helpful and about a month before the competition, he spoke to them for a practise run. They critiqued his speech and made some suggestions. He really enjoys that the Speakoff competition itself is held at Convention with a large and attentive audience.

Since Speakoff, Aidan has researched the Youth Exchange possibilities for the summer of 2016. He found one entitled "The Sound of Music" in Austria which includes solo singing, choral singing and playing an instrument. Just up his alley! Aidan wants to tell other youth (and the clubs that are approaching them to participate) that this is a very rewarding experience. You not only learn from researching for your own speech, but then you learn from listening to the other speakers. "Learning the skill of speaking in public is valuable forever more."






