Look around your club, what is the average age, 67 ? 75 ?

Years ago we did a great job of recruiting members and developing clubs that we all enjoyed. We have been very successful at doing what Lions do best, SERVING OTHERS! But we are growing old and it is harder to continue with this service work. Last year we finished with 1269 members from a low of 1186 but our numbers this year are sky rocketing downward.

Over 30% of our Clubs have 20 members or less.

Membership crisis: 5M13 down to 57 clubs

As there were only two Zone Chairs present at the Zone Chair training, the group present spent the time discussing the issues of the district, one being a Membership Crisis.

Our membership is at 1225, and we need to be at 1250 by the end of June 2015.

We have dropped several members, to be exact, and we have dropped two Lions Clubs, Pierson and The Pas Northern Lites, both of these clubs have been struggling for many years with low membership. There are some other clubs having their membership problems as well. We need more women in the clubs and more members under 35 years of age. Many of our members are aging.

Brandon Lions, Brandon Keystone Lions and Brandon Crocus Lions joined together under the name of Brandon Lions and now have 39 members which is awesome, as two of these clubs were initially thinking of disbanding. Great idea to join together. Good work Lions.

We had 61 clubs on July 1, 2014, now we have 57 Clubs.

This is serious and we need your help to try and overcome this issue. If this continues we will not have our Lions district in the near future.

"Life may have lumps, but together, hand in hand, we can get through it," the 12-yearold from Reston, Manitoba said. The poster was selected by members of the Pipestone Lions Club for its originality, artistic merit and portrayal of the contest theme, "**Peace, Love and Understanding**."

Pipestone Lions Club

Co-ordinator, Lion Brenda Bohne, said she was impressed by the expressions and creativity of the students at the Reston School. "It is obvious that these young people have strong ideas about what peace means to them. I'm so proud that we were able to provide them with the opportunity to share their visions."

"Hiebert's poster will advance to face stiff competitions through the district, multiple district and international rounds of competition if he is to be declared the international grand prize winner," Lion Bohne said.

One grand prize winner and 23 merit award winners will be selected. The grand prize includes a cash award of US\$5,000, plus a trip for the winner and two family members to an award ceremony. The 23 merit award winners will each receive a certificate and a cash award of US\$500.

"Our club is cheering for Hunter as his poster advances in the competition, and we hope that his vision will ultimately be shared with others around the world," Lion Bohne said.

Locally, Hunter was presented with an Achievement Award and a \$50 prize; second place winner, Camryn Raimbault, received a Certificate of Appreciation and a \$25 prize and 15 other participants were acknowledged for their participation by the Pipestone Lions Club.
