Lions calendar celebrates special birthday

This year, the Boissevain Lions Club calendar will be celebrating a milestone birthday for one of the community's largest and bestknown citizens.

Tommy Turtle is the focus of the annual fund-raiser this year, and for Lion Bill Dougall, there is no question he deserves the honour.

"It is his 40th birthday," Dougall exclaimed, "and this is a great way to recognize that."

In the past, different Lions projects have adorned the calendar. There has been an artwork by Karen Nell. There has been a salute to Boissevain beautification. Although there were other good ideas, choosing Boissevain's towering terrapin for the honour was not a difficult.

"There were a couple of good ideas we narrowed it down to, but this was very acceptable to the Lions Club. They felt this really depicted something important in the community."

Tommy's actual birthdate is difficult to pin down, but he was officially adopted by the community on July 18, 1974, when he made his first official appearance standing on his hind legs, welcoming visitors to Boissevain with a smile on his face. He had actually arrived in town a couple of days earlier accompanied by a convoy of cars and a fire truck. This was when the famous Canadian Turtle Derby was beginning to gather steam, eventually becoming one of the biggest draws on the continent, all under Tommy's watchful eye. The derby went, but Tommy remained. Dougall said there may be some in Boissevain who take our mascot for granted, but do not every think he is shirking his duty as ambassador.

"I think it comes up everywhere you go," he said. "People ask where you are from. When you say Boissevain, they say 'that is where they have Tommy Turtle.' I myself have gone to many different places and they say 'that is where the turtle is.' He is still prominent outside of the community. He is still recognized wherever you go."


Dougall said there is even a Lions connection, as members of the club, Wayne Pringle, Harry George and Jack Houston, along with George Dyck and Robert Warnez cosigned a loan to guarantee. In fact, Dougall said, legend has it Tommy still holds the old banknote personally.

The calendar has been a good fund-raiser for the Lions Club. Dougall said he is not sure exactly how many have been sold, but feels the renewal rate is about 100%. All of the advertising has also been sold. Money raised from it is used for different community projects, and Dougall said the club is

looking at different ways to use the money from the 2014 edition.

The club is also not done with Tommy when the calendar is released. Dougall said they are planning a birthday bash. Lion Lorraine Houston, who co-chaired the 2006 Homegrown Reunion, will be taking the reigns for Tommy's big day. Details are not yet settled, but there are plans for the return of the old Lions burger buggy from the Turtle Derby days, and the golf club is planning a tournament for the next day. According to Houston. Tommy's birthday is a key for the community and is something we should all look forward to.

"There will be plenty of opportunity for family and friends to gather for good times and reminiscing," she stated.



Funding Request Guidelines

Cost Share with Lions Eye Bank & Lions Foundation

By ELLY PRENDERGAST, Executive Director Lions Eye Bank

With the increased demand for funding assistance throughout all communities, we believe it is important to share pertinent guidelines to assist all clubs with their decision making.

As a registered charitable organization we are required to establish and follow policies and procedures to maintain our legal charitable status with the Government and Revenue Canada.

The Lions Eye Bank and Lions Foundation act upon the direction of the Club. We believe the Club has done due diligence regarding the status of an applicant and its worthiness. In the event the Club declines the request, we are unable to honor the request on our own.

We strive to ease the burden experienced by clubs assisting families in need and we accomplish that by cost sharing.

The procedure for working with the Lions Eye Bank and Lions Foundation is to submit the completed application along with the club's contribution. Our guidelines indicate a Revenue Canada Statement of Assessment is necessary. This is certainly true in larger centres, however, we understand that in smaller communities, that requirement is not necessarily applicable. That is why we depend on the club for their input and assessment of the situation. In turn, we create a file and then administer the paying of expenses based on submitted receipts. The individual and the club receive a record of each transaction for their records.

It is not a wise choice to advance the family funds and then request assistance from the Lions Eye Bank and Lions Foundation because that does not allow for the clear paper trail that is so necessary.

We need to follow this format because we are audited and as a charity we must be able to prove how those funds have been utilized.

Should the contributing funds not

be totally spent, it is the club's choice to request the funds be held in trust for the next applicant and or left in general revenue. As always, we act on the request of the club. There is always extenuating circumstance and it is in those cases that the request for a refund will be directed to the Executive Committee for clarification.

Should the request for assistance require substantial funds, very often the club will solicit community help. We are only

able to match funds donated by the initiating club (reasonably we could not afford to match all funding).

We have the ability to issue tax receipts, however, those donations must be sent to either the Lions Eye Bank or Lions Foundation. Our additional obligation is to administer those funds, issue tax receipts and all necessary correspondence.

Always feel free to contact us at anytime. We look forward to working together.

13 on November 15, are eligible.

Each year's contest consists of an original theme incorporating "peace". Participants may use a variety of mediums, including charcoal, crayon, pencil and paint, to express the theme. The works created are unique and express the young artists' life experiences

and culture.

Twenty-four international finalists are selected each year, representing the work of more than 400,000 young participants worldwide. Posters are shared globally via the Internet, the media and exhibits around the world.

Posters advance through

several judging levels: local, district, multiple district and international. At the international level, judges from the art, peace, youth, education and media communities select one grand prize winner and 23 merit award winners. One international grand prize winner will receive a trip to a special award ceremony with the sponsoring club president and two family members at Lions Day with the United Nations. During the ceremony, the winning artist will receive an engraved plaque and a cash prize of US \$5,000.00. Each of the 23 merit award winners will receive a cash award of US \$500.00 and a certificate of achievement.

The awards were given out on Friday, November 1, 2013 at Reston School.




