A special girl gets a new best friend

Not long ago, a very special girl got to meet a very special new friend, an autism assistance dog named Oatmeal. This specially trained standard poodle has been adopted by the Simonson family to serve as an extra set of eyes, a nighttime companion and a best friend to ten-year-old Jordyn.

Jordyn was born with a condition called Hypoxic Ischemic Encephalopathy. She is considered a level three disability, which means that she is dependent on someone to change her clothes and diapers, bath her, feed her, and give her medication. She is also cortically blind, which means her brain has to train itself to see (the more stimulation there is, the more likely her ability to see will develop). What this means is that parents Trisha and Lindsay must provide constant care for their daughter.

Jordyn, who attends Souris school, is on meds for seizures, meds for anxiety and meds for sleep. She has a lot of trouble with her sleep. The Simonsons have consulted with





psychiatrists and sleep analysts who have all concurred that while Jordyn can be medicated for sleep, because of her age, she can't yet be given the dose her body needs to sleep properly. As a result, Trisha and her husband take turns every night sleeping with her. "We haven't slept

through the night for a while," laughs Trisha, who despite the lack of sleep is in a great mood. She explains that while the family does have help during the day from their nanny, Gloria, "it just isn't enough. Jordyn is up every night."\

Then, a while ago, Trisha heard about a family in Wawanesa who received a guide dog through the Lion's foundation. With help from Souris School resource teacher Karen Butterfield and the Souris Lions Foundation, the Simonsons looked into whether a guide dog might be an option for young Jordyn. After inhome assessments and lengthy interviews, the Simonsons request for a guide dog was approved last year.





The couple flew to Ontario in early October to train with their new dog. Oatmeal was specially selected by trainers as a suitable dog for both home and school. Trisha relates that once

Oatmeal has adjusted to life with Jordyn and is ready, the school will also receive training so that Jordyn can bring Oatmeal with her to class.

"This dog will stop Jordyn from running into things and hurting herself - and lay with her at night," says Trisha who is happy that with the help of the Lix2on's Foundation, the family have been able to welcome Oatmeal into their home.

Of course the Simonsons other children Zaiden (8) and Rihanna (6) have had to learn that Oatmeal is Jordyn's dog only and that they can't play or interact with their new pet like other kids do but the difference for Jordyn is worth the sacrifice. Their sister now has a companion that can guide her through life, keep her safe at night and help her continue to thrive in Souris.

"Jordyn has been through many obstacles in her life and continues to be," says Trisha, "but she is one stubborn and bright child. The Souris school EAs, teachers and her peers are what makes her try so hard to learn new things!! Hopefully Oatmeal will give her the comfort to continue to be herself and keep striving for better. Jordyn is a miracle girl!"



Lions Literacy Loft opened in Wawanesa School

What kind of gift could you give that would make a life-long impact? The Lions Club of Wawanesa knows the answer! It's the gift of literacy.

The Lions were looking for a local service project to get involved with when Lions Margaret Martin and Beth Smale decided they'd like to pursue the Reading Action Program, a call to action worldwide for Lions Club members to get involved in increasing literacy rates and reading skills and address specific literacy needs within their communities.

Lion Margaret and Lion Beth called the school to offer Lions to read with students. Mrs. Kaastra quickly accepted the offer and, since December 2012, members of the Lions Club of Wawanesa have volunteered to read with children in the Grade One classroom, sharing favourite stories from their past, and enjoying new books which are quickly becoming new favourites!

This growing relationship between the Grade Ones and Lions is an eagerly anticipated weekly event. So, when the Grade One teacher, Mrs. Kaastra, who is tenacious in seeking resources for her students,

especially reading resources, and knowing how committed the Lions were to encouraging literacy skills, posed the idea of creating a raised platform structure in the Grade One classroom that would be a tool to support literacy growth, our Lions encouraged a submission to help make this idea a reality.

In May 2013, the Wawanesa Lions Club supported the idea and provided the funding for the Lions Literacy Loft project to move forward.

Next on the scene was Carlos Vanwynsberghe, from Norbert's Manufacturing, who made design improvements and product recommendations which resulted in a rocksolid-structure. The design had to be approved for fire code, but that was really the only challenge. After some carpet, furniture, a wall mural, and of course, books, it was ready to welcome children, and support their journey into literacy. The Lions Literacy Loft is more than a cozy spot to curl up in to read a good book, it's a literacy tool that supports the implementation of the Daily 5 which is a literacy framework that fosters children's skills of independence and builds stamina for reading and writing. The more time that children can

spend engaged in reading and writing, the more successful their academic lives will become. All the better to do this in an environment that is pleasing and comfortable.

The Lions Literacy Loft Grand Opening was held on December 5th with 23 Grade One students, many members of the Wawanesa Lions Club, special guests Lions District Governor Lion Lloyd McCabe and Lion Bev, Southwest Horizon School Division representatives Jan McDonald (Trustee) and Carolyn Cory (Superintendent), Principals Brent Hauser and Stephanie

Emberly, builder Carlos Vanwynsberghe, and many parents. District Governor Lion Lloyd McCabe summed it up when he said, "This is really an amazing accomplishment not only for your school, but for our District. It's a unique project. We will be the only District which can say that we have a Literacy Loft, and that's fantastic!"

This project came to fruition as the result of the efforts of so many, with special thanks to every single Grade One student who continue to make all the hard work worthwhile. See what good things can happen when we work together?


