

# Please donate to LCIF Give aid to refugees in host countries

LCIF helps Lions improve peoples' lives around the world, from funding medical treatment and research to responding to major catastrophes, to providing valuable life skills to youth.

No matter where you live, you have probably heard about the refugee situation in Europe. Hundreds of thousands of people have been forced to leave their homes and make their way into Europe. They are leaving Syria,

Kosovo, Afghanistan and several other countries, usually on foot and carrying what few possessions they still have. They are searching for a place to call home, where they can safely raise their families. Many of them are crowded into camps, lacking adequate food, water and medical supplies.

This is where Lions Clubs
International Foundation (LCIF) and
Lions can help. LCIF has approved
US\$200,000 to help Lions address the
needs of refugees in host countries.
The Lions of Sweden and Turkey
are already hard at work providing
relief materials to refugees near the
Greece/Turkey border. The Lions
in the Istanbul, Turkey region have
received a grant for refugee assistance,



which they plan to establish a school for refugee children and support the nutrition and hygiene needs of 100 families for two months.

# **Should 5M13 reconsider Redistricting**

(LCI) recommends that a district requires a minimum of 1,250 members to adequately function. Based on the number of members within a district, redistricting has taken place on several occasions.

There have been several changes which included our present District 5M-13.

In 1953, 5M-3 was formed; in 1973, 5M-7 was formed to include clubs in Manitoba and Minnesota; in 1975, 5M-7 changed to include only Canadian clubs in Manitoba

Lions Clubs International and Northwest Ontario; in 1978, 5M-12 was formed being solely clubs in Manitoba; in 1985, the province was reorganized due to the increased number of clubs into two districts - 5M-12 and 5M-13; and then in 2003, due to a reduction in the number of Lions in both districts, redistricting again took place with 5M-12 dissolving and a new boundary drawn in which part of its members went to 5M-13 and the remainder to 5M-11 in Minnesota.

In 2003, 5M-13 had 1,660

members but by 2012 it had dropped to 1211 and now fewer than 1200.

Attempts to attract new clubs and members, especially in rural areas with declining populations, has become increasingly more difficult.

With fewer than the recommended minimum of 1,250 members, 5M-13 has continued to operate on a limited budget and with difficulty in filling cabinet positions. This has resulted in the past district governors (PDG) filling several cabinet positions. This year we do not have a 2nd or 3rd vice district governor and PDGs hold the following positions (some more than one): secretary, treasurer, finance committee, long range planning, constitution and by-laws, diabetes (district and national). LFC-Dog Guides (district and national), Lions Centennial, Eye Bank/MAP (one of three), newspaper editor/advertising, public relations, Lions-Quest (national), and two zone

chairpersons. We are thankful for all those serving on cabinet; however, volunteers, in addition to PDGs whose assistance as mentors and advisers to new cabinet members would be more helpful, are required.

Without a full slate of officers and members not willing to serve on cabinet, and with a membership lower than recommended, should we not be considering redistricting?

# District 5M-13 Nominations

Nominations are being sought for the positions of District Governor, First, Second and Third Vice District Governors and for the Area II Director for The Eye Bank/ Medical Assistance Programs. Following are the qualifications for each.

## **District Governor**

The candidate for District Governor shall:

- a) Be an active member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in his/her district;
- b) Secure the endorsement of his/her club or a majority of the clubs in his/her district;
- c) Currently serving as the First Vice District Governor within the district from which he/she is elected:
- d) Only in the event that the current First Vice District Governor does dot stand for election as district Governor, or if a vacancy in the position of VDG exists at the time of the district convention, any club member who fulfills the qualifications for the office of 2nd VDG and who has served an additional year on cabinet shall fulfill the requirements.

# First Vice District Governor

The candidate for First Vice District Governor shall:

- a) Be an active member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in his/her district;
- b) Secure the endorsement of his/her club or a majority of the clubs in his/her district;
- c) Currently be serving as the Second Vice District Governor within the district in which to be elected;
- d) Only in the event that a vacancy exists in the position of 2nd VDG, any club member who fulfills the qualifications for the office of 2nd VDG may qualify as a candidate.

# Second Vice District Governor

The candidate for Second Vice District Governor shall:

- a) Be an active member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in his/her district;
- b) Secure the endorsement of his/her club or a majority of the clubs in his/her district;
  - c) Have served or will have

served at the time he/she takes office as 2nd VDG:

- i) As president of a Lions club for a full term or major portion thereof, and a member of the Board of Directors of a Lions club for no less than two additional years; and
- ii) As Zone Chairperson or Region \ Chairperson or Cabinet Secretary and / or Treasurer for a full term or major portion thereof;
- iii) With none of the above being accomplished concurrently.

# Third Vice District Governor

The candidate for Third Vice District Governor shall note the first two qualifications of the second vice district governor and work towards completing the other qualifications during the coming year.

c) Delete all and ADD The first family member (head of household) pays full international dues (US\$43), and up to four additional family members pay only half the international dues (US\$21.50). All family members pay the onetime entrance (US\$25) or charter (US\$30) fee. The Family Membership Program applies to family members who are (1) eligible for Lions membership, (2) currently in or joining the same club, and (3) living in the same household and related by birth, marriage or other legal relationship. Common household family members include parents, children, spouses, aunts and uncles, cousins, grandparents, in-laws and legal dependents.
